I'm Graham Coad, a St George's Road boy born, ex Penpol School, Humphry Davy School and then in Devon and Cornwall Police, where I served twice policing Hayle, (retired since 2004) I've been on Hayle Town Council since I was elected in 2007 and thoroughly enjoyed it, becoming chairman of Amenities Committee, and involved with several projects and working groups and deputy mayor since 2012, even editor of The PUMP for a while. I have lived back in Hayle since 1996, with a grown up daughter and grandson, Jenny and Cameron also living in Hayle, a son Tom in the Royal Navy, son Jonny in his final months at Hayle Community School and daughter Lizzie still a pupil at Penpol.

We will soon be inviting Hayle people to help us create a Hayle neighbourhood Plan to have a say in influencing planning and development of Hayle forward to 2030.

the attention of predators away from his nest. Mallard and Canada geese have chicks and can be seen grazing the banks of the streams and ditches round the estuary with their young. Many of the birds that breed on the nature reserve nest on the ground and are vulnerable to disturbance by people and by dogs off lead so please be careful where you walk until the young are old enough to fly away from danger.

Associated Octel Co Ltd.

Hayle

Works
1939 – 1974



For 35 years

Hayle Works on North Quay was a manufacturing unit of the multi-national chemical company Associated Octel Co. Ltd, who manufactured and distributed lead anti-knock compounds to oil refineries world wide.

Bromine was extracted from sea-water for the production of the scavenger which was an essential component of anti – knock compounds. The scavenger, ethylene dibromide, produced by reacting bromine with ethylene, removed unwanted lead oxides from internal combustion engines after combustion.

The basic requirements were sulphuric acid, sourced from Bristol and Plymouth, soda ash and chlorine from ICI factories in Cheshire and ethylene produced from alcohol supplied by Distillers Co. The scavenger was shipped to the sister factory at Northwich in mid-Cheshire which produced the tetraethyl lead octane improver.

Hayle and Northwich were built on behalf of the Ministry of Aircraft Production by British Ethyl Corporation as wartime projects.

British Ethyl was a company formed at the

behest of H M Government and jointly owned by ICI Alkali and Associated Ethyl Co, each having 50% holdings. Associated Ethyl owned all technical details and know-how, but ICI staffed, built and operated the plant. The raison d'être for the whole project was the ultimate availability of 100 Octane gasoline for the Royal Air Force. (The octane number of motor gasoline at that time was 65)

The chosen site was never ideal, and could not be expanded. However, it was secure and had the advantage of a ready supply of warm sea water from the adjacent power Station. Bromine extraction efficiency improved at higher temperature. The main disadvantages were the dilution of sea water by partial recirculation of process effluent and fresh water dilution from the Hayle River, particularly on neap tides. Extended lines of communication and high

transport costs were always a problem. Construction began in Sept 1939 and was speedily completed by July 1940 and under the most challenging conditions. The first scavenger left the plant in August 1940. The process chosen was the Ethyl-Dow "alkali" process, a US development first used in 1934. Cost and time constraints restricted plant and equipment to a minimum which meant that some desirable facilities were only available after 1948. The wartime plant had a design capacity of 2,500 tons per year but, as with most chemical plant, this was gradually exceeded. Even so, production was still inadequate during the early war years. It was inevitable that a relatively new company, operating under wartime conditions, should undergo change. ICI had no commercial interest in staying with the project post war and, as a result, on 1st Jan 1945 British Ethyl became wholly owned by Associated Ethyl with ICI agreeing to continue to operate the plant until 1st Jan 1948. Associated Ethyl also purchased the plant from the Air Ministry at the same time. Attempts were made during 1941-42 to increase capacity, but the Air Ministry refused to sanction further capital expenditure. Significantly, when Associated assumed full control and ownership, improvements were made. During 1948-9 sea water flows were increased by the installation of a booster pump house. A sulphur store was constructed on the Quay to serve the Contact Sulphuric Acid plant that was installed. The quality of the ethylene dibromide scavenger was improved when liquid ethylene, from Petrochemicals, Manchester replaced the in-house production of ethylene from ethyl alcohol.

These refinements and additional facilities made operations more efficient, but plant capacity remained an issue. In 1954 when the Company's major expansion in Ellesmere Port and Anglesey were completed and commissioned, conversion of the Hayle plant began. In October, after producing 43,400 tons of bromine, the original "alkali" process was closed down to be replaced by the more elegant and efficient "acid" process, also developed by Dow. Over the next 18 months plant and equipment were installed to accommodate the new process and to double the production capacity to 5,000 tons per year. The "acid" process was licensed from Dow Chemicals and was a later development on the alkali process. Both the acid process and use of liquid ethylene were features of the Anglesey Bromine Plant established in 1953.

In 1961 the Company name was changed to Associated Octel Co Ltd, to avoid confusion in the market place with Ethyl Corporation of the USA.

The Anglesey plant, with lower power and transport costs, produced the scavenger at a much lower cost than Hayle. By the early 1960's its capacity had increased to 15,000 tons per year. In order to improve the economics of Hayle, surplus bromine was

sold on the open market. Investment was made in bulk and semi-bulk distribution equipment. Sales improved steadily until in 1968, when scavenger ceased to be produced at Hayle, nearly 4,500 tons of bromine was sold. Markets were in Holland, Switzerland, North West England and West Yorkshire. Some bromine was also sold to China and India
In 1973 the need for significant capital expenditure for the replacement of ageing equipment precipitated the decision to close down and rely solely on the 30,000 ton facility in Anglesey.
The plant was demolished and the site handed back to its owners, Harvey & Co, in mid 1974.

BLACK'S GUIDE TO **CORNWALL 1873**

Three miles further, and we stop at HAYLE (population 1180). (Inns: White Hart and Commercial), on the East bank of a considerable inlet, which runs up from St. Ives Bay. At high water the sea overflows an extensive tract, and assumes the proportions of a noble bay; but when the tide recedes a dreary waste of sand spreads before you, which, in places is dangerous to the foot-traveller. The port itself is kept free of sand by the waters of Phillack Creek, which are poured into it by a simple contrivance, and a sufficient depth is maintained to admit of the entrance of vessels of 200

tons. A dirtier, squalider less interesting town than Hayle is not to be found in all Cornwall. Its population is composed of fishermen and miners, of labourers in its two iron foundries or tin smelting works, and railway employees, and its only claim to consideration is its position with respect to some magnificent coastal scenery. But this may almost as easily be visited from Redruth or St Ives – the latter a beautifully situated town, the Capua of Cornwall- and therefore we recommend the tourist to imitate our own course of action – leave Hayle as quickly as he enters it! St Ives lies about 4 miles north-west of the St Ives Road and Hayle Stations.

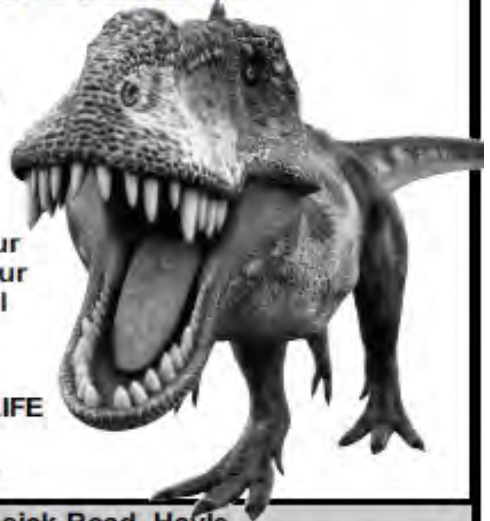

Millpond Update

Under New Management.

Following repeated requests for help to remove the rubbish from the Inner pond the 'Cornishman' published an article about our continuing problem.

This prompted a group of volunteers to offer their help to take away the unsightly mess and I wish to express our sincere thanks to Pat Humphries. Robin Phillips, Rod Baker and his boat for their sterling efforts.

In future we will try and look after ourselves and do what is needed to manage the ponds to keep them clean and in good health.

Under rules of Health and Safety, unsafe bridging material will be removed. Any bridges should go over the river not through it please!

As the season progresses around the site, the early flowers have now given way to daffodils, bluebells, three-cornered leek and willow catkins. Butterflies have started to reappear, especially the Holly Blues and Speckled Woods. The moorhens have produced two broods of chicks and we have two healthy ducklings. We think that we may have two more ducks sitting, so watch this space!

Piran, the new baby turtle has joined our growing family and he is one of the smallest babies we have seen, but he is doing alright so far. Some of our 'shelly' friends have taken up residence on the 'Old Orchard Pool.' This now disused irrigation reservoir at the back of the river has become a tranquil

nature haven for the local wildlife, including our hybrid geese, Aviv and Angel, which produced three goslings there last year. Freya is sitting on four eggs and we hope that they will hatch this year. Odin has been very protective and driven our remaining residents mad chasing them away from her nest. As yet she has not hatched out so it is another case of 'watch this space' and we will bring you the good news in the next edition.

Hayle in Bloom is taking part in the 'Bee Aware' project to make people aware of the importance of bees and the problems which they face from loss of habitat and the bee virus which has reduced the population quite drastically in some species. Millponds has ten different species of bees recorded in its Ecological Survey so we will be monitoring them during the summer and reporting our results to the Project.

Would you like to take control of your electricity bills and raise money for the community?

Residents in Trelissick and Tremorva areas of Hayle can get involved in Less is More, an innovative project aimed at saving electricity and reducing peak demand, while gaining rewards for the community. For every kilowatt hour householders are able to shave off their usage, a donation of cash is pledged to the two community funds. Each fund has now surpassed the £1,400 mark, with overall targets of £5,000 for each area in sight. The Western Power Distribution project is being delivered in Hayle by local charity and social enterprise Community Energy Plus. Project Leader Neil Farrington explained how it works: "The aim is to help small areas reduce their electricity usage in order to relieve pressure on their local substation. Some of our substations are reaching the point where they can no longer cope with maximum demand and need to be upgraded.

This is partly because we all use more electrical items than we used to.” The Less if More Project has multiple benefits. With support from Community Energy Plus, householders can take the initiative and reduce their bills, whilst also decreasing their carbon emissions. “We are offering free home energy audits, with expert advice tailored specifically to individual homes,” explained Neil. “We can show residents where heat is escaping using our thermal imaging camera and we can supply energy monitors to help people understand their electricity use.”

Meanwhile, Western Power Distribution saves on the cost of up-grading substations, passing some of the associated savings onto the community in the form of a fund for facilities and future initiatives. What this money is spent on is up to residents in each area, and suggestions for Trelissick and Tremorva are currently being taken by the

project team at Community Energy Plus. Less is More is also looking to change behaviour, shifting times of peak use and therefore easing pressure on substations during periods of maximum demand, which generally occur between 5pm – 7pm. “We recognise that some of the energy people use at this time may be essential – like cooking evening meals,” said Neil. “However residents may be able to shift other electricity usage to different times. For example turning on the dishwasher, washing machine or tumble dryer at the end of the evening or using timers.”

Several community events have already taken place in order to raise awareness and inspire change. **The team will be on the ground in the two areas throughout June, raising awareness about the project and answering questions about how it can help residents save money and electricity.**

for supporting economic growth, improving people's quality of life, and protecting the natural environment. While the planning system provides opportunities for communities to get involved in development decisions that affect them, in practice they have often found it difficult to have a meaningful say. The introduction of Neighbourhood planning puts power back in the hands of local residents, businesses, councils and civic leaders.

The Hayle Town Council will lead the work, but the community will be in the driving seat of neighbourhood planning to ensure that all those who live or work in the Hayle area are able to help determine the scope of the plan, and to contribute to its preparation through an extensive consultation process which will take place over the next nine months.

A questionnaire will be sent to every household before the summer asking your views about what people think about life in Hayle today and their hopes for the future. Then every adult will have an opportunity to vote in a referendum to ensure that the local community has the final say on whether a neighbourhood plan order comes into force in their area.

Chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan committee, Councillor John Bennett said "It is the Town Council's aim to have a Neighbourhood Plan in place by the middle

of 2015 and work is now well under way. A vital part of Hayle's Neighbourhood Plan is that it must reflect the wishes and aspirations of the community.

A strong motivation for implementing our Neighbourhood Plan is that we will have the right to receive 25% of any Community Infrastructure Levy, the charge that will be placed on most new construction and collected in the town. This could amount to as much as £200,000 a year. We will also be consulting on the priorities for spending these funds within the town and, again, your input will be important." The Neighbourhood Plan group and The Town Council would like to invite members of the community to come forward, as volunteers to be part of the Neighbourhood Plan groups.
