The new solar covers are now operational, and as a result the temperature of the water could rise by anything up to 8 degrees depending on the strength of the sun. 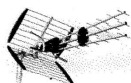

Hayle's Neighbourhood Plan Moves Towards Referendum

The consultation on the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan has just closed and we have had a good response to the survey. There was also a good turnout to the open days at Angarrack and at the Hayle Day Care Centre.

The comments received have been strongly supportive but we have made some small changes thanks to thoughtful suggestions. The next steps involve producing some supporting technical information, review by Cornwall Council and an independent examiner and then, finally, a referendum of registered

voters in Hayle.

We plan to be ready for the referendum early in 2017. If it is approved by the voters of Hayle, we will have a plan which determines where growth will take place and which areas will be protected. We will also receive 25% (£2,000) of the Community Infrastructure Levy for each new qualifying dwelling to spend on community projects.

Did you know that every summer we run a **Summer Reading Challenge** in the library for primary school children?

This is a free national event to encourage children to read six library books between July 16th and September 10th.

Depending on reading skills, some children can even have their books read to them so they don't need to miss out. Even children holidaying in Cornwall can participate. Fun stickers and gifts reward readers after every two books. Children who complete all six books will be awarded a medal and certificate at school at the end of September.

The Summer Reading Challenge will start with a big launch at Hayle Library on Saturday morning on 16th July. The fantastic Funny Faces face painter will be working her magic on the kids for free when they sign up to the Challenge on this special day. Don't worry if you miss Launch Day – you can still sign up any time afterwards.

On another note Hayle Library Staff, in partnership with Bodriggy School, ran a weekly **Chatterbooks** afterschool club during the Spring Term 2016. Eight children from year 3 regularly met to get even more enjoyment from the books they read. The Reading Agency who partly funded the scheme say that children who read for enjoyment and

Hayle Film Club reports continued growth at AGM

On 14 May Hayle Film Club, now in its fourth year, held its third AGM just before screening the excellent Cold War drama **BRIDGE OF SPIES** to a nearly full house. Chair Donna Anton reported that ticket sales over the past year had increased 36%, to 727 from 531, in part due to a consistent schedule since September of twice-monthly screenings. Paid membership is up to 78, reported secretary Candida Frith-Macdonald, and treasurer Cathy Bryon-Edmond showed expenses of £3,286 against £3,785 in revenues, leaving a healthy surplus of about £500, which the committee plans to put towards an electronic projection screen.

I was interested to read in the Hayle Pump that Blewetts Toy Shop had recently celebrated 35 years of trading in Hayle. This is a great shop, run by two very nice people, Brian and Heather, and although I don't go in very often, I do go in and buy HUMBROL TINLETS of paint, so loved by model makers. Very few shops stock these small tins, even Macsalvors don't have them!

Another great shop just a few doors away is Hayle Cycles. A lovely shop selling everything you would need for your bicycle, and the staff are very helpful, knowledgeable, and pleasant. We are so lucky to have them, here, in Hayle.

I was also fascinated by the article in the Pump by Terry Richards where he remembered HAYLE WHARVES BRANCH LINE. This was well researched and well written, and I can just remember a passenger train running along the line from the Wharves up to Hayle Station. All the traffic by the BWOC Garage stopped while the train rattled across the road, sadly all this activity ceased in 1983

Once again I was pleased to receive my copy of the 'Pump'. I was particularly interested in the article from Terry Richards- Hayle Wharves Branch 1944-82, it brought back so many lovely memories for me. As I mentioned in a letter

sometime last year, (issue 122 Aug/ Sept 2015, ed.) my grandparents, Tom and Elizabeth Drew lived at 32 Penpol Terrace and I spent holidays there in the 30s 40s and early 50s. He mentions the shire horses pulling the wagons down Penpol Terrace etc., well my grandfather Tom was their driver, he being a GWR. horse porter, during the pre-war and post-war years until his retirement at the war's end in the summer of 1945.

The horses were stabled at ground adjacent to the railway station yard, off the lane at the rear of their home. There was another GWR horse stabled there and if my memory is correct it pulled a parcel delivery wagon, which to my young eyes in the 30s resembled a "Wild West" wagon, the driver I think a Mr Polkinhorn.

Terry also mentions having rides with a GWR driver who was shunting wagons at that time, a Reggie Drew, he was my uncle, my father's young brother, elder brother Sammy worked at the Gas Works on the Quay.

All the above brought back so many happy times for me in those far off years. I remember some of the shops etc. along Penpol Terrace, Bobby Trevithick's in front of No. 32 and a little wool/sewing shop with I believe a Mrs. Roberts and daughter Zena. Blewett's Garage, the ironmongers Biggleston's – my father always bought a tool there to take back with us to Wales, I loved the smell of that shop. There was also a lovely fish and chip shop near

there, we went there quite often in the War years owing to householders on severe food rationing. Also Clarks Bakery on Foundry Square where my aunt Rachel's husband worked, a Bobby Cawse pre-war and post-war after serving with the R.A.F., so many recollections - the Post Office with a Mrs Rusden. Later visits with a friend in the early 50s, after finishing our National Service we used Crimson Tours, which left from Foundry to travel around Cornwall. At that time I stayed with my aunt at Tremeadow Terrace – I have a snap taken at their 'Victory' tea with written on the reverse in his copper-plate hand 'Elias Sercombe at the table'. He was my aunt's step-father-in-law, possibly Hayle's oldest resident.

This was a magical time for me, living in a different part of South Wales from my present address, we would leave from our local junction at 10pm, we always seemed to travel by night, and didn't arrive at Hayle until 8am. Sometimes to wake in the morning and open the curtains to see a coaster moored opposite, so different from the hills and mountains of Wales.

I so enjoy receiving my Pump as it always brings to mind special memories for me and I hope for your older readers.

Because it is very important that facts are accurately recorded, so

that the integrity of history as far as we can ensure it is kept as authentic as possible, if I may I would like to correct a statement made through the 'Hayle Pump' issue 125 by Mr P. Channon with regard to 'Octel' at Hayle.

I do not know where Mr Channon gleaned his information about Octel but what he said was not entirely correct.

The Associated Octel plant at Hayle did recover Bromine from the sea water and it also manufactured Ethylene Dibromide, However, it never processed 'Anti-Knock' compound. The high octane fuel additive, Anti-Knock compound, was manufactured at Northwich in Cheshire.

Bromine and Ethylene Dibromide were either recovered or manufactured at Hayle and these substances were then shipped by road and rail from Hayle to Northwich for use in the production there of the fuel additive.

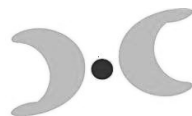

The Cornwall Beet Sugar Company Limited 1911-1932 (extracts from a book by Philip Hosken)

The Cornish beet sugar campaign of the early 20th Century captured a great deal of attention and would, had it come to pass, have altered the face of Cornwall and the fortunes of its farmers.

Hardly a newspaper edition appeared during 1911 that did not contain some reference to the possibility of a sugar producing industry in Cornwall under the title of the Beet Sugar Founders Association. This rise of Cornish agriculture from the doldrums in which it normally resided was seen as a welcome boost to the Cornish economy that had lost most of its mining and foundry industries.

The building of a factory to process the beet depended upon finance being

available and, in turn, that relied on a long-term commitment to grow a virtually unknown crop by the farmers. The latter was a stumbling block that would be expected from West Cornwall farmers. To overcome, beet seed was acquired from Liverpool and supplied to 300 farmers from Bude to Land's End free of any charge for them to evaluate the crop. The results were put on show at an exhibition held in St Elwyn's Church Hall, Hayle on Tuesday 24th October 1911 It had been thought that the Hosken owned land near Penmare in Copperhouse, now the Hayle Recreational Ground, would be a suitable location for the factory but it was soon dismissed as being too small for purpose and an area close to Loggans Mill of some 28 acres was proposed. Dr G Schack-Sommer, the company's technical advisor, described it as possessing, 'An existing natural water supply, three roads to it and from it already constructed, and a rail siding connected to Hayle Station and the wharf.' He said that, '... besides water borne coal, coke and limestone being available for the factory, the company will also be in a position to obtain quantities of beet supplied coastwise. I consider the site entirely suitable for the purpose of a beet sugar factory." . We will see that even this apparently ideal site was to be superseded . The outbreak of hostilities in the Great War brought about shortages and rationing. The country's dependence on imported sugar from Europe increased the demand for the home produced product. Rationing of sugar was severe and a request from the West Penwith Food Committee to the Ministry of Food for sugar to make

blackberry jam was refused in April 1918 but an allowance of one pound of sugar per household for the personal use of the blackberry pickers was apparently allowed in August. By November this had risen to 1½ lbs but where would the fruit be then? Christmas puddings might have benefitted.

Whatever the reasons for the government's lack of support, in 1918 there was an announcement that the proposed sugar beet factory at Hayle had fallen through in favour of a larger scheme in Nottinghamshire. It may have been the availability of coal in Nottinghamshire that was seen by decision makers as a reason why Cornish sugar was unlikely to be competitive. One wonders if they took into account the remarkable quality of beet in Cornwall and its excellent sugar yields.
