Hello, it's with a sad and heavy heart that I'm writing this article.

I just wanted to inform everyone about the closure of the Hayle branch of the Royal British Legion at the end of September due to circumstances totally outside of our control.

As a RBL branch that has been at the Passmore Edwards Institute in Hayle for over 100 years, we are now being unceremoniously evicted. The sad part is that it's a small group of people, all local, mainly pensioners and veterans who use the venue for playing snooker about 3/4 times a week, where we can get together have a chat, put the world to rights and enjoy each other's company.

The reasons for this eviction is mainly because the people who run the Institute (trustees) have increased the monthly fees by over 4 times the amount from £80pm to £350pm, even though we pay for all our running expenses (electricity heating etc) which is totally ridiculous, unfair and unaffordable for such a small group of people.

Also the RBL stores all of the Poppy fund raising equipment for the Hayle branch there, which raises approximately £13,000 to £15,000 a year, this will have to be removed by the end of this month and find a new home.

Cornwall Hospice Care.


Cornwall Hospice Care welcomed Camborne, Redruth and Hayle MP Perran Moon to St Julia's Hospice in Hayle on Friday 8th August, giving him the opportunity to meet with staff, volunteers, and leadership to gain a deeper understanding of the charity's vital work in providing specialist care to people in Cornwall with terminal illnesses. During the visit, Perran spoke with Frazer Hopkins, Cornwall Hospice Care's Director

of Income Generation, and Owen Crocker, Patient Services Manager at St Julia's Hospice.

He also spent time talking with dedicated staff and volunteers to hear first-hand about their roles in delivering compassionate end-oflife care and supporting patients and their families.

Reflecting on his visit, Perran Moon said: "It was an absolute pleasure to visit St Julia's Hospice to see the amazing work of staff and volunteers. I am delighted that the Labour government has been able to provide funding for upgrades, and I'd like to thank all staff, volunteers, trustees and donors who, over many years,





have created a sanctuary at difficult times for many. The work of the hospice cannot go unrecognised, and I intend to raise St Julia's Hospice with the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care Wes Streeting." Frazer Hopkins said he was pleased to have the opportunity to discuss how recent capital funding, provided to hospices across the UK, is helping Cornwall Hospice Care progress with its 'Fit for the Future' project - a major renovation of Mount Edgecumbe Hospice in St Austell.

"It was wonderful to be able to highlight the importance of the work we do and the huge role the Cornish community plays in supporting us," said Frazer. "Whether it's by donating time, goods, or financially, our local community makes an enormous difference. We also discussed the ongoing challenges we face as one of the lowest funded hospices in the UK and the need for fairer, sustainable funding for the future."

Cornwall Hospice Care runs two adult hospices – St Julia's in Hayle and Mount Edgecumbe in St Austell – providing free, specialist care to patients, as well as support to their families and carers. The charity relies heavily on fundraising, donations, and its network of retail shops to meet the majority of its running costs.

The site was granted by way of a S106 agreement, and we were successful in securing £100K CIL funding. Obtaining the necessary approvals to deal with the contamination has been a hurdle, as was securing the site in the first instance, but it will all be worth it when the garden is established! Our appointed, Hayle based, contractors Sharp Country Landscapes, have made a great start despite the recent weather!



Hoglets and Hedgehogs

Pottering in my garden recently, a movement in the pond caught my eye. I was alarmed to discover a young hedgehog, his spikes covered with bright green pond weed, struggling to climb onto a plant pot containing a large water iris. There is a ramp in the pond,



to help in just this situation, but he had not found it, and the iris pot saved the day for him. I quickly recovered him, and wrapped

him in a towel to help dry him off and warm him up. The little creature seemed reasonably OK, despite his soaking, so I put him into a box, and left him in a quiet corner to, hopefully, get over his escapade.

By chance, my sister had heard, only the day before, of a hedgehog rescue group called Hedgehogs and Herring Gulls Sept 25, Hedgepigs and Hoglets. It is a registered charity dedicated to the care and rehabilitation of hedgehogs and wild mammals in West Cornwall. I rang Jill, the group leader, seeking advice. She suggested that the hedgehog go to her rescue centre for a few days of expert care, and we

Summer wildlife & conservation sessions

Despite unpromising weather at the beginning of our Evening Glow-worm walk in mid July we were lucky enough to find 26 glowing females which is 4 more than we saw last year in better weather. Female Glow-worm beetles emit a small luminous glow (known as bioluminescence) to attract the flying males so they can mate. Unfortunately Glow-worms and other insects active at night can be affected by night-time artificial light. For Glow-worms

the artificial light can wrongly attract the males and block out the glow of the females, making it hard for males to find females and mate. Thank you to Carol and Steve Rumble, for sharing their enthusiasm and taking us around the area of the Towans they've been checking for glowworms for many years - there is something particularly magical about seeing these glowing beetles!



Hayle In Bloom News September 2025



News from Phillack Tower As the dark evenings draw in the ringing at Phillack continues.

During the summer we've been ringing for most Sunday services, weddings and our regular Tuesday practise evenings. Sunday services at Phillack usually alternate each week this is a 9:30 service so we ring from 9 o'clock. We normally have between 4 and 6 ringers, and the following week there is a 4 o'clock service so we ring from 3:30 when we have the afternoon services we get more visiting ringers so we normally have 8 ringers.

When we have weddings, if the couple wishes to have the bells rung we would normally ring for half an hour before the wedding and again after the ceremony, the length of time can vary depending on the time the bride arrives.

Tuesday evening practice starts at 7:30 and finishes at 9pm, we have an excellent turn out for practise nights, normally between 8 and 12 ringers turn up which is made up of our regular visitors from other local towers plus our own band.

We aways have a break halfway through the evening for refreshments and a natter.

The first Tuesday of each month we take our practise to Gwinear which everybody enjoys, Gwinear has 6 bells as opposed to Phillack having 8.

It will soon be time to start planning for the services over the Christmas period.



Flying Rings Seal Campaign Gains Growing Support by Retailers

Shops across the UK are stepping up to support a campaign to protect seals from the dangers of plastic flying rings.

The Works is one of hundreds of national and smaller independent shops who are joining the movement and taking positive action to protect seals from the unnecessary and avoidable threat of flying rings by simply swapping to seal-safe toys such as solid discs. The Works removed flying rings from its seaside stores in June 2024 and stopped ordering more of this stock. This major retailer of toys and gifts is

supportive of the Seal Alliance's campaign.

Flying rings are any type of throwing toy with a hole in the middle, including dog toy rings. They can cost as little as £1.50 and are often lost or discarded on our beaches or near waterways. Ultimately, they will end up floating in our seas where seals, who are naturally inquisitive, will start to investigate them. Their curiosity turns into a nightmare when the ring goes over their heads and



gets stuck fast. As the seal moves and grows, the ring will soon start to cut into their skin causing immense suffering, pain and ultimately death.

Gareth Richards, Vice Chair of Seal Alliance, explained:

'We are deeply grateful to all those shops helping to protect our precious seals and reduce their needless suffering. We do not want retailers to lose out financially, quite the opposite in fact.

Retailers are actually reporting an increase in the sale of solid disc frisbees since they stopped selling flying rings, so their profits are not affected. We are asking shops to

consider non-plastic ones as preferable for the environment.'

Wendy Hill, Sales Representative for Palgrave Ltd a major supplier of beach toys, advises her company is keen to support the campaign. She said:

'We have been distributing flyers to our customers to highlight the injury and dangers flying rings cause to our poor seals. As a result of this, our sale of these rings has slowed considerably and our customers are purchasing our alternative offering of solid flying discs. We are planning to phase the flying rings out completely in the future.'




14th April 1826 Plundered on Hayle Bar

adjacent villages crowded down with the view of plundering the stores; the greater part of these miscreants were women who carried off whatever they could lay their hands on and were very dextrous in concealing bottles of wines and spirits amongst other things so as to elude a search.
