Public Consultation Findings

Back in August the Town Team commissioned Cornish consultants, Mei Loci and Situ8 to carry out a public consultation asking the community what they wanted for Hayle. The consultants were able to speak to over 300 people at various in-person events, with 149 people completing the online survey. People that took part were from across the whole community, including local business leaders and students from our local state primaries and Hayle Academy.

The key findings were organized into six themes: movement and travel; place and space; natural environment; community; leisure and recreation; economy and work. These themes were then dissected into more detailed ideas such as making it safe and easy to move through our streets, promoting clear walking and cycling routes and promoting sustainable living, energy and development.

The Town Team would like to thank everyone that took part. A copy of the final report is available on the Town Council website.

It has been great to work with clay again as I love sculpture and 3D art. I have been experimenting with slab built garden sculptures, torn-edge pots with holes burnt through them, 'Hollow Planets', tiny pots thrown 'off the hump', small highly coloured masks for wall hanging, 'Hedgerow Pots' decorated to look like, well, hedgerows, and various other clay projects, all with a degree of success. I haven't tried Raku pottery as yet, but it is a project for the not too distant future. It involves dropping red hot pots into metal bins

once a railway?

The Hayle Railway was an early railway in West Cornwall. It operated between 1837 and 1852, and was constructed to convey copper and tin ore from the Camborne and Redruth areas to the seaports at Hayle and Portreath. It also carried coal and goods into the town. The line was built to standard gauge, the first such in Cornwall. Steam traction was used, but horses were employed initially at the western end.

The line came to Hayle from Angarrack, and followed the northern side of Copperhouse Pool. The three-arch bridge spanning the stream along the footpath is the oldest standard gauge railway bridge in Cornwall. In 1952, the bridge was restored by a Troop of Boy Scouts.

The bridge bears Blue Plaque Number 45 and is a scheduled ancient monument.

The line continued along the present King George Walk to the western end of the pool. The line swung south, over the swing bridge. There may have been a station here, called Hayle Riviere. The line then followed the south side of Penpol Terrace, under the viaduct, twice, like the road

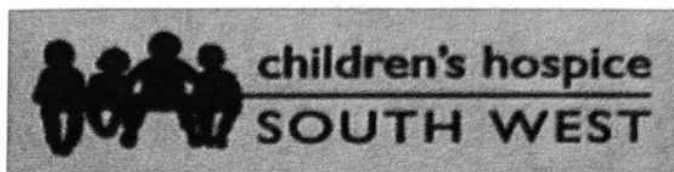
does today, and ended up on sidings on the East Quays, (near Asda).

The Railway began serving passengers in 1843, and there was a station where Isis Gardens now stand. The railway then provided opportunities for local people to have a day out, and such is mentioned in the Bradshaw's book made famous by Michael Portillo on his railway wanderings.

In 1852, part of the main line was incorporated into the West Cornwall Railway, and is part of the Main Line to this day.

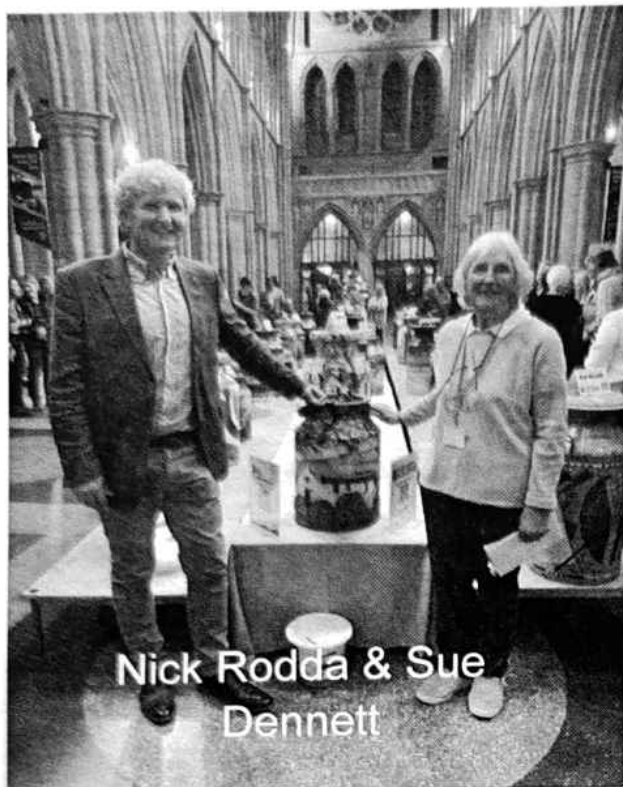

'Around Cornwall in 38 Churns' raises thousands for Cornwall Hospice Care

Organisers of an unusual art project launched in April to raise funds for Cornwall Hospice Care, are celebrating its enormous success. 'Around Cornwall in 38 Churns' has raised an incredible £48,000 for the Cornish healthcare charity.

The project was devised by Sue Dennett of Newquay who also wanted to showcase the county's talented artists and stunning locations. It was supported by Rodda's Creamery who donated the churns, Visit Cornwall, The Bowgie Inn at Crantock, Blumen Brand and Digital and David Lay Auctions and culminated in the closure of an online auction at 8pm on Wednesday 21st September. The total was announced minutes after the auction closed to a gathering of artists, sponsors and supporters who were at Truro Cathedral where

the churns were on display. "It was an incredible moment when the announcement was made", says organiser Sue Dennett. "It took my breath away when the figure was revealed. I'd hoped we might reach £30,000 but this is amazing and I can't say a big enough thank those to those who bid, for their generosity and support." Sue is the volunteer Chair of the Cornwall Hospice Care Newquay Fundraising Group and has supported Mount Edgcombe Hospice and St Julia's Hospice for the last 38 years. "This project has been extremely hard work but worth every moment. A huge thank you to all the artists who kindly agreed to paint a churn, our many sponsors and the hospice team who supported me over the last six months."

Artists involved included famous names such as Kurt Jackson, Michael Praed and Dick Twinney. Their churns were featured at venues around Cornwall throughout the summer and then gathered together at the Cathedral for the final day.

Oli Hoare is the Head of Fundraising at Cornwall Hospice Care: "It was extraordinary to be at the Cathedral on Wednesday night. In the fifteen minutes before the auction closed it went very quiet as people took to their phones to put in last minute bids along with many others elsewhere who were also bidding furiously. It's still soaking in that this extraordinary project raised £48,000 for our charity. It's a fabulous amount and everyone involved should be extremely proud of what

they've jointly achieved. It costs around £600 a day to care for a hospice patient so this project has funded 80 patient days at our two Cornish hospices. We're overwhelmed at the generosity of the artists and the auction bidders and I'd particularly like to say a very big and heartfelt thank you to Sue Dennett for realising her dream and raising such a huge amount." 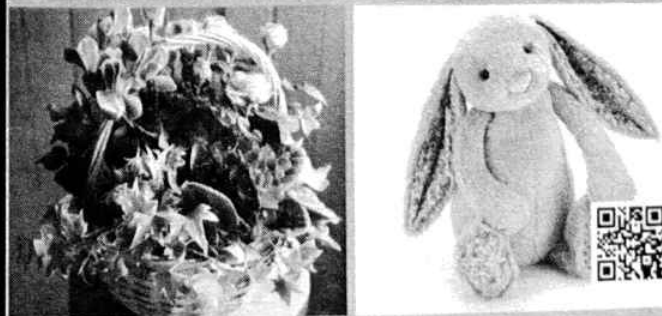

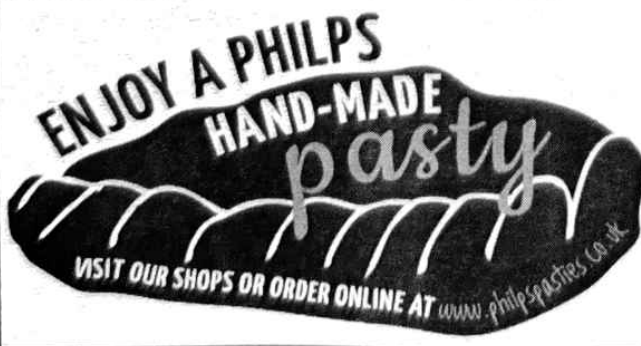

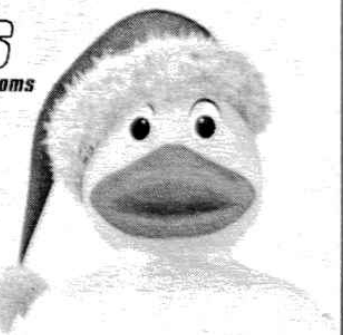

FLOWERS IN ABUNDANCE

Let's take a moment to pull ourselves out of these grey winter days to think back to the long hot days of last summer, when our Towans were carpeted with vast arrays of wild flowers - sea pink, yellow kidney vetch, blue spring squill, beautiful pink and mauve wild thyme and pyramidal orchids, gradually blending into golden ragwort with purple viper's bugloss in late summer. 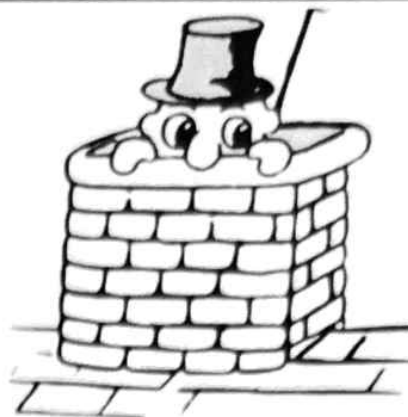

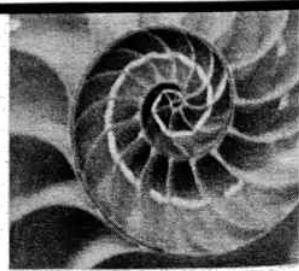

NSW. Here Samuel worked in the community alongside a very active mayor, Tony McGrane, for whom he had a great respect. Tony then became the mayor of the City of Dubbo. In February, 1992, Her Majesty and Prince Philip were to visit Dubbo, which was to include a gala luncheon at the Civic Centre. Samuel accepted Tony's invitation for him,

The next thing Samuel had a little man hopping around in great concern holding the microphone for him to say grace, which he had termed his (one and only) \$500 grace. He was the protocol officer and obviously felt that the whole weight of the banquet's success fell on his shoulders. He was terrified that something would go wrong over which he had no control, and continually repeated Samuel's instructions so that he would know exactly what to do! Samuel said grace at the given signal and we all sat down for the meal. There was then an announcement made in the following terms: "the Duke of Edinburgh has taken off his jacket and all the men can do likewise. The ladies can do what they like!" 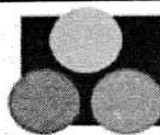

Cornish holiday letting agent Aspects Holidays has installed a defibrillator at their head office in Hayle. With increasing awareness of how vital this life-saving equipment is, they felt it was important to install one at the office, not just for their staff, but for the whole business park, and the wider community. Without CPR and the use of a defib, the chance of surviving a heart attack reduces by 10% every minute. Having access to a defibrillator really can save lives. The defib at Aspects Holidays is located on Sapphire House (the timber-clad building) at Hayle Business Park, behind West Cornwall Shopping Park, to the left-hand side of the main entrance. During office hours the code can be retrieved from

reception just inside the door. Outside of office hours, members of the public can ring the number on the cabinet and retrieve the code that way. Once the defib has been turned on, it will issue easy-to-follow instructions.

Whilst no one ever *wants* to need a defib, knowing that one is available really could make all the difference. Doug Howard, Marketing Manager for Aspects Holidays, arranged for the installation of the defib. Here's what he has to say about why the company decided to install the defib:

"Following some first aid training and knowing there wasn't a defib available 24/7 within the business park, we decided to install one. We hope it won't ever be needed but it gives us peace of mind knowing it's there."
