Hayle Male Voice Choir entertained the crowd with their fine singing, they were magic, as always.

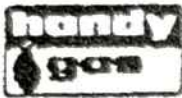

HAYLE FLORIST RECEIVES COVETED INDUSTRY AWARD

Mark Nicholas of Flowertime Florist in Hayle was recently inducted into the floral industry's prestigious American Institute of Floral Designers (AIFD) during ceremonies at AIFD's internationally acclaimed Symposium held during the first week of July in Boston, MA.

With only 1180 members worldwide, AIFD recognises those who have excelled in their floral design skills. Candidates become members of AIFD by successfully completing a vigorous two-part process in which they must demonstrate their abilities.

Mark, for instance, began the process by submitting a portfolio of original designs with his chosen theme "A Party". A panel of AIFD's membership Committee then evaluated the submitted designs and agreed that they were suitable for the first part of the exam process. Mark was then invited to Atlanta in January of this year to come before a similar panel and create four additional designs for further review and evaluation.

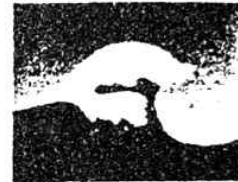

by Denise Bryant was given by the Holman Climax Choir. All of these and other events were well worthwhile as the Chapel has been transformed; it now boasts beautiful walls which provide lots of light to show off new fitted carpets, deep red velvet curtains and cushions and kneelers around the Sanctuary, and the newly restored boarded ceiling with hidden strip lighting incorporated in it.

Hubert Prosser, the Property and Finance Committee Secretary showed the Town's Mayor, Mrs. Shirley Oliver, and Ray Wyse of

Bigglestons' and Julie Cook of the Hayle Pump Team all the improvements recently completed. He explained that one thing had led to another. The extra light brought in by the new windows showed up the fact that the floor needed re-covering, and then new curtains and cushions were tastefully chosen to match the carpet. Nothing was wasted in re-covering the floor, as the carpet which had previously been laid down the central aisle was given to the Ventonleague Methodist Chapel to carpet their stairs, and the carpet which originally covered the Sanctuary floor is now laid in the Sunday School rooms.

What was particularly gratifying to the Mayor was the fact that all local people had been used to re-fit the Chapel, as follows:

The glazing, using some coloured squares and strengthened glass, was installed by Causeway Trading Group of Marsh Lane Industrial Estate;

the electrical circuit was checked and new lighting was installed by Webb and Philp;

the wood ceiling and general re-decoration in the Chapel and vestibule, was carried out by David Hickingbottom of Dracaena Avenue;

the lino and old carpets were

stripped out and replaced by Tony Jose at Cornubia; and the kneelers, cushions, and pulpit cloth were made and hung by Manchester House.

Shirley Oliver was very impressed when hearing the numbers of the congregation on Sunday mornings and evenings, and pleased to hear that the rooms surrounding the Chapel were very well used by such groups as Cubs and Brownies, the Hayle Male Voice Choir, Weightwatchers, not forgetting the Sunday School classes, and said that it was wonderful to hear of a Church having good news to tell.

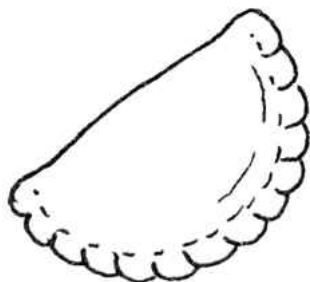
THANK YOU! WE HOPE YOU HAD A "FUN" DAY!

FUTURE LOOKING UP.

Future Looking Up- future looking up – and yet again future looking up.

This has been the theme song of Hayle for well over 20 years; the structure of the town started to show cracks at the beginning of the sixties, hardly noticeable at first but gradually this went and that went, there was no obvious absence of boats coming into the harbour, the two famous horses did not pull the wagons along the grass verge of Penpol Terrace anymore.

Stones began to fall out of the harbour walls, and one high tide, followed by a severe gale, washed away a large section of the quay. Men were not needed any more at the L.C.I works and this stood a gaunt derelict giant against the skyline until it was finally demolished. Because this industry ceased the large store of sulphur on the quay opposite vanished overnight leaving just yellow marks

in the cracks of the walls and buildings still remaining.

Regular sluicing gradually slowed down and then finally stopped and the estuary became more and more silted up leaving only a very narrow channel to the sea, and at high tides the incoming ocean would spread out and gradually eat away at the then high sand banks and grab huge chunks from the protecting dunes as it receded, until several small chalets were washed away and others were in danger.

The Esso Petroleum works closed and kids spent their leisure time throwing bricks at the vacant windows and all the ugly gaps looked down dismally at the mounds of broken glass and weeds. The climax came when the power station was closed and down came the tall chimneys that had for so many years been a big visual feature over the town, seen for miles away and even used as a guide at certain times for boats about to enter over the treacherous

bar. Crowds stood that day watching and many walked tearfully away. The coal on the quay remained for a very short while and like all the other land marks this too went leaving yet another gap.

The day dawned – a certain company had bought the whole harbour area, something, in spite of many negotiations, the local authority had been refused. There then followed meetings, plans, photographs and promises, hope rose like a rosy dawn, but it turned out to be a false dawn nothing happened, and eventually they went their sweet way leaving things the same as when they entered the town.

Soon after that came another buyer with even more great ideas for the town, bigger and glossier brochures, not quite so many meetings, but a lot of talk and many promises. They met all local authorities, were featured in the local press and Hayle thought 'ah this is going to be better' and hopes were raised.

Suddenly the discussions dried up, no more newspapers articles, but there were obvious signs in and around the harbour area, lots of activity (quite a lot of this activity taking place around 4 or 5a.m.) and people were waking up to find

sluices permanently blocked up, several buildings missing their masonry thrown carelessly into the dock. Eventually, in spite of frantic calls to environmental people and lots of pedestrian protesters like Jericho our historic walls came tumbling down.

No one knew what was going to happen, progress was going quickly backwards and all we could do was to look upon the scars and acres of barren ugliness and watch the high tides wash over the crumbling walls and kindly cover the devastation for a couple of hours.

They too, like their predecessors walked away into the sunset and

time dragged on.

Then came another man, internationally known for many successful schemes and backed by an eminent, also internationally known man of the environment. This man not only met the authorities but frequently met 'the people', organising big meetings discussing and listening to what the people wanted. Naturally there were some aspects that were not acceptable but there was always room for compromise on both sides. Even families who could trace their ancestors in Hayle back to the sixteen hundreds began to have faith in this man and agree with much of what he said.

Yes, this was it, with care and thoughtfulness on all sides the Future was Looking Up.


Alas came strong opposition from elements in power who did not know the town's history (did not even know the town) and all of them lived miles away, BUT they 'HAD IT ALL ON PAPER'. Whilst the bitterness of this opposition gradually crept in and time was moving on, the tidal wave of world recession swept all hopes away - AGAIN.

Somewhere in the future of all this a complete stranger bought an area of Hayle, which yet again had been refused to the local council, this

was at the other end of the town at the extreme end of the tidal reaches, opposite to the children's playground. This again had good prospects an area close to what the people wanted, and had done so for some time.

All was going well and progress was on the way to realising a satisfactory conclusion, until one minor alteration was suggested and the 'complete stranger' walked away never to be heard of again, but the pool was given his name and will be for the foreseeable future.

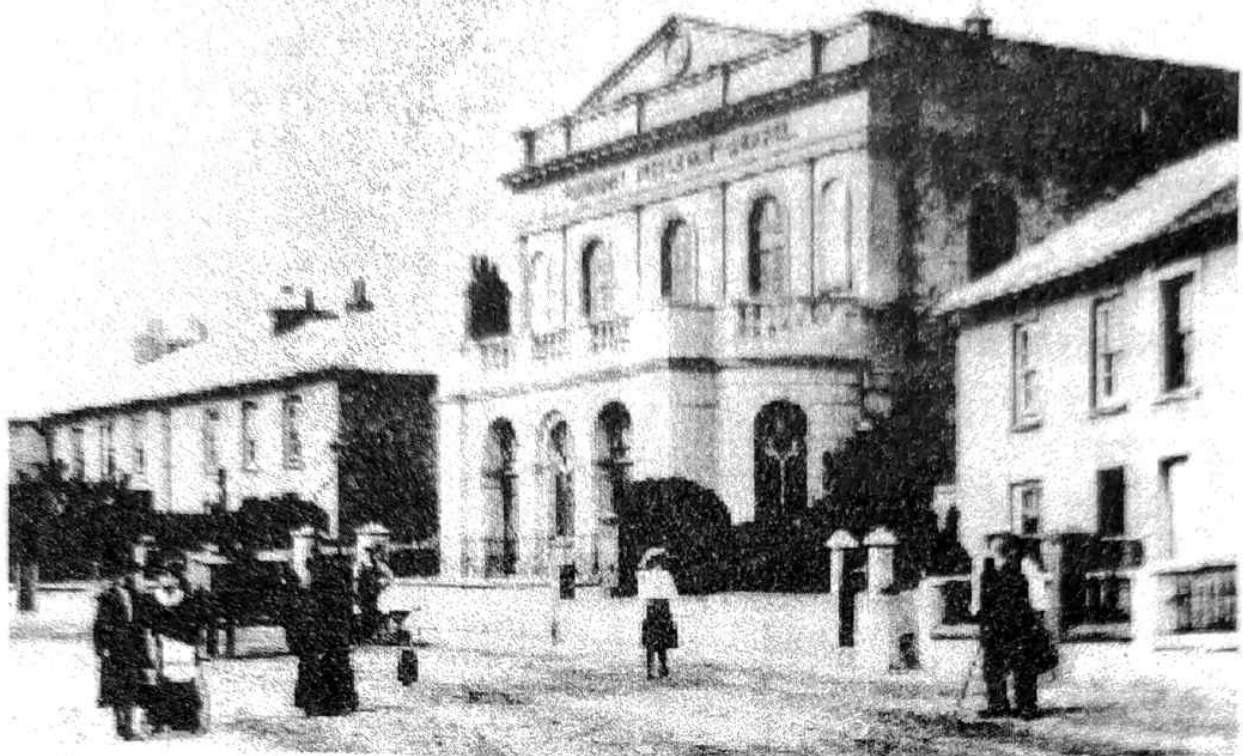

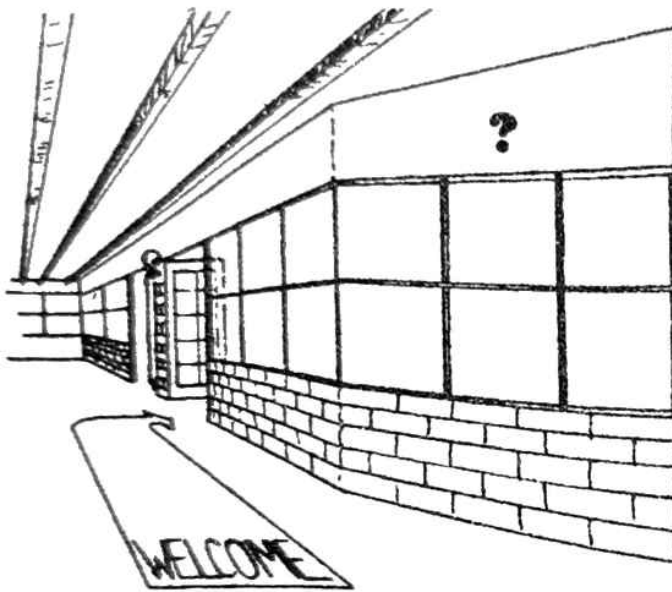

SEEDS.

Hayle gardeners are being asked to ensure that seeds they have inherited are saved for the use of future generations.

Some of them may be growing seeds passed down to them as family 'heirlooms', by gardeners who used to save seed of vegetables for themselves rather than buying each year from commercial seed companies.

In this way old varieties were kept in cultivation, local strains developed and passed down from generation to generation.

This tradition has all but died out, but some gardeners in Hayle may still have old home saved varieties, which may well be in danger of extinction.

The Henry Doubleday Research Associations Heritage Seed Library, who has already rescued 700 varieties, aims to save the remainder before they are lost forever.

HDRA is asking for gardeners to send in their home saved seeds, and they will also be asking for volunteer 'seed savers' to grow these varieties for more seed, and to research local seed saving stories.

DEVELOPMENT.

A major opportunity to re-vitalise Hayle for the coming millennium is waiting comments from local people.

An exhibition of the redevelopment plans for the town's derelict harbour area is being held in the Copperhouse area.

Plans, drawings of the proposed development, photographs of the present state of the site, and a video, are being shown by Hayle Harbour Company Limited, which has submitted an outline planning application.

The plans include a 60 bedroom hotel with conference facilities, incorporating a theme public house and restaurant, at east Quay; 417 residential units at Harbour Village South Quay and reclaimed land in the Eastern region of Carnsew Reservoir; a retail development to be sited at the entrance to South Quay; and a provision at the North end of South Quay at the Middle Weir for a new sailing club for marina and harbour users.

The marina in the existing harbour area will have berths for 300 craft, and there will be provision of improved facilities for the fishing fleet and all existing harbour users, and the creation of new serviced industrial sites as required, at North Quay.

The company is anxious to obtain the views of the townspeople, whether for or against the proposed development and have staged the exhibition to enable people to make up their own minds from an informed viewpoint.

The exhibition is open on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 10am - 4pm, on Wednesday from 4pm - 7pm and on Saturday 9:30 am - midday.

In addition to letting the company know what they think about the plans, Hayle people are also invited to contact their local councillors with their views.

AN AMERICAN AMOUNG US.

“To travel is to discover that everyone is wrong about other countries.” – Aldous Huxley.

I have heard much about Cornwall over the past year – from two local boys who live now in Austin, Texas. I’ve made a hobby of ceramics, and I was most excited to learn that Bernard Leach had a pottery and lived at one time in St. Ives, and that many artists find inspiration in this part of the country. As I rode the train from London toward Hayle that first day of my holiday, I thought of a beach

with black pebbles that my dashing travelling companion from Austin had mentioned to me on numerous occasions. We could collect these treasures – stones worn very smooth and shiny by the surf crashing upon the shore in Godrevy, and see if my brother in law, Christopher, could make a ring or two with them when we return to Texas in a month.

I longed to hear a Cornish folk song, which, I’d been told I might hear in a pub in or around Hayle, where my companions’ mother resides and where he and I would stay for much of our holiday.

Could an American girl actually sit in a pub with a Guinness and start a rousing chorus of “Camborne Hill” (as I’d heard my companion sing many a night in Austin)? I intended to find out. They don’t sing in pubs in Texas. For that matter, there aren’t any true pubs (or fellows with handsome voices within them) there, either.

I was utterly fascinated by the stories I’d heard about local celebrations, such as Flora Day, in which people put on their finest clothes and dance through the streets, houses and shops! Did this really happen? Did people actually open their doors so the townspeople could dance through their houses what an incredible concept? What

fun!

I asked if I could roll down a hillside and not have to worry about ploughing over an anthill and being stung by an army of red ants like in Texas. I was reassured that the ants don't sting here and that grass was safe to sit upon. Oh joy!

And now here I am, an American girl in Cornwall, discovering at every twist and turn of the road that my mind's eye was neither creative nor generous enough when it presented me with a mental image of this incredible part of the world.

And I've learned that Mr Huxley was right - everyone is wrong about other countries. Indeed, even

after being regaled with stories about this part of the country, Cornwall is different than I thought it would be. In fact, it's far better than I imagined. The colours, the smells, the food, the architecture, the countryside and the people are, to this tourist, simply divine.

I've eaten a lions share of pasties, collected shiny black pebbles (and a few seashells), I've walked a mile straight uphill to see Bernard Leach's pottery (I was greatly saddened to find that even though we arrived before 5pm, the place was closed and locked up early.

I've laid down in clover and grass without worry of bite or sting. I've

I saw the tall ships, from a distance, and the Mill and the hill upon which young Miles once played. I looked down over the trees which young boys would climb and eat apples and watch fox hunts.

There's more to do, of course. Much more. I've got days and days thank goodness
