
Also look out for us with KidsRus, as this one is in aid of OSSKA, and deserves as much local support as we can give.

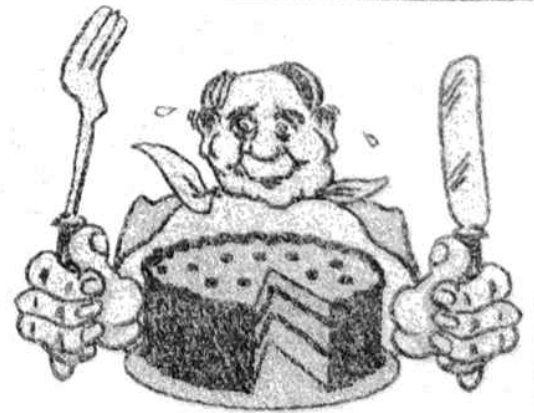

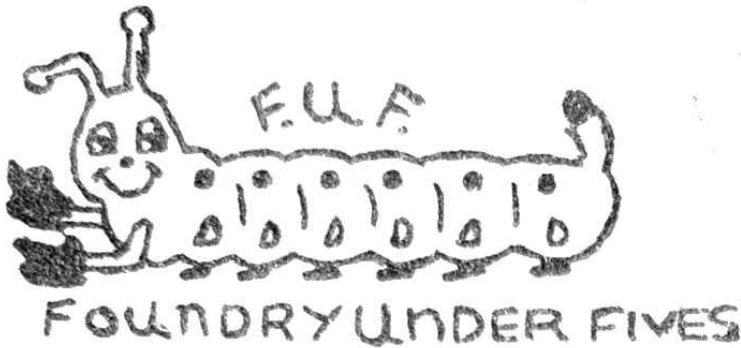

Hayle Harbour Development

The Hayle Harbour Co. people have been working hard this month. The application for Outline Planning is due in shortly and the team has been fine-tuning the project. The plans include a new fishing port with up to date facilities, a barrage with a lock-gate that will keep the water inside the harbour at a half-tide situation and allowing a period of six hours, - three hours each side of the tide to enter or leave the harbour.

New industrial units will be built on South Quay with shops and residential premises facing Penpol Terrace.

A small marina is planned for

North Quay with additional light industrial units and residential properties. The team including Project Co-ordinator Chris Brown-Bolton, Architect Matthew Borowiesci, and Media Director David Redfern have just returned from the world's largest property and re-location conference in Cannes where the project was shown on a computerised video screen and attracted a lot of interest from businesses world-wide.

If the outline plans are accepted, work should be able to start in the autumn of 2001, taking up to five years to complete.

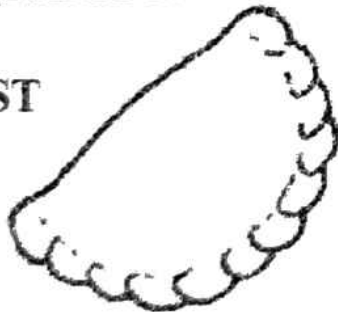

Phillack Churchyard

The Rector and Church Council have successfully petitioned the Chancellor of the Diocese of Truro for a change in the rules governing the yard, which were laid down by the Diocese in 1990. Those rules banned kerbstones around graves throughout Cornwall to make grass cutting easier.

However, in Phillack there were already pre-1990 graves with kerbs which seemed unfair to people with new graves and, more seriously, there was a problem with rabbits digging in the area around the graves. From 2nd February 2000 it will now be possible to have kerbstones once again. Mourners should consult their undertaker or stonemason, who will make arrangements for them. For those who have a headstone already in place, no

additional fee will be required if they now wish to have kerbs. The kerbs will be the following sizes:

6" high and 4" thick enclosing a total area of 6'20" x 2'10", to have a concrete foundation base with two concrete carriers 4" x 1" x 2" thick; the centre shall be filled with granite chippings.

All other 1990 regulations are still applicable.

The Church Council has also taken advice from the Countryside Officer about the rabbits and hopes to install new fencing shortly.

Dreams Come True at Foundry Barn.

The battle to save Foundry Barn really began in 1983, when the walls of the "Coliseum", the Foundry Gas Works and the Coppersmith's Shops were being torn down around it. A group of determined people led by the late

Major Tom Ellis got a stay of execution for the barn and for ten years it stood over-shadowing the rubble and weeds.

When Peter de Savary purchased the Harbour in 1989 he also acquired the old foundry site and its remaining buildings including Foundry Barn. As part of his plans to re-develop Hayle, he allocated land for Social housing and in 1993 the Foundry Barn and Foundry Farm were part of the negotiations with the Guinness Trust who wanted to buy both sites. Demolition orders were granted and once more the battle lines were drawn by those who felt that the remains of Harvey's great enterprise should be saved.

The first meeting with the Guinness Trust took place in December 1993 and after lengthy discussions it was decided to see if common ground could be achieved between all parties to the mutual benefit of both Town and developer.

A number of meetings took place during 1994 which culminated in the formation of the Foundry Barn Study Group, at the Hayle Project Office headed by Cllr. Robb Lello, then Mayor of Hayle, and John Nash. For the next six months they sifted the written evidence, photographed the site, canvassed letters of support and consulted architects and historians. The final result was not only a comprehensive document which was used as the basis for later studies, but also as the

first submission to the Heritage Commission to have Foundry Barn and Foundry Farm listed.

The Pre-Feasibility Study was also made public at a Meeting held in May 1995 when the Foundry Barn Steering Group was formed. Since its inaugural meeting on 19th June 1995 it has worked tirelessly to progress the plans to develop a Heritage Centre which would encompass the whole of the remaining buildings which make up the Foundry Complex. This would include all the wagon sheds, fitting and workshops in Foundry Lane, the pattern shop next to Foundry Barn and if possible, any available land at Foundry Yard, but all of these sites were still in the hands of the Harbour Co., and money had to be raised to purchase them.

Two Feasibility Studies later, it seemed to be an almost impossible dream. The Farm and the Barn had finally been given a Grade II listing and Guinness Trust had agreed to have the Barn made safe and re-pointed after the demolition order was lifted, prior to starting their Housing development. In 1997, fourteen years after Tekoa's demolition, the phoenix began to rise from the rubble, the Barn was shrouded in scaffolding and work began. The year also saw the adoption of the Foundry Barn Steering Group as a sub-committee of Hayle Town Trust and since then the "impossible dream" has taken

shape.

There is still a long way to go, but there is a light at the end of the tunnel - Regeneration Through Heritage, whose Patron is H.R.H. Prince Charles. With their encouragement and contacts the project began to attract interest and more importantly funding. This culminated with the visit in May 1999 of H.R.H. Prince Charles and the handing over of the Deeds to the Barn to the Trust's late President Major Tom Ellis, who saw his dream of the Barn being saved for future generations realised before his death two months later.

The Trust and the Steering Group are still hard at work, and thanks to

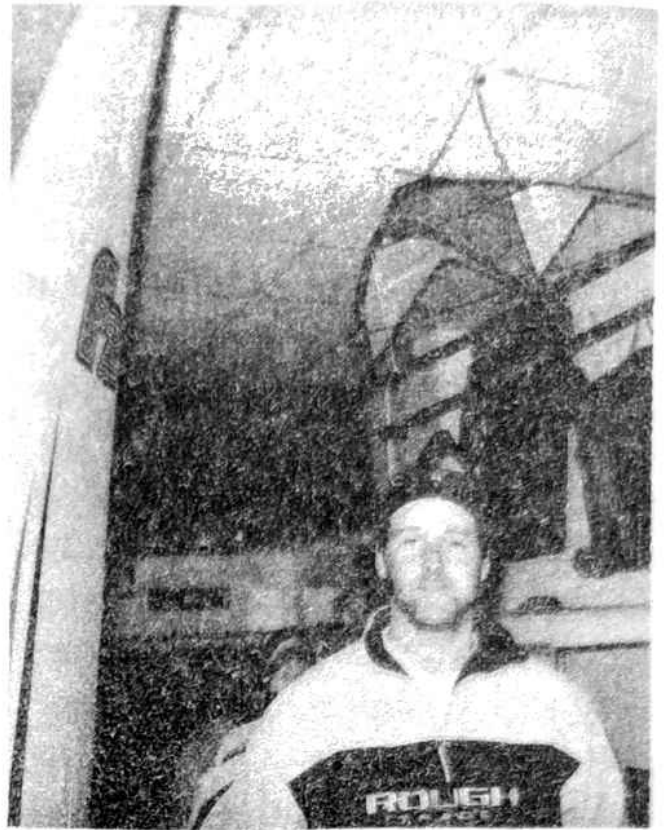

Extract from "A Short History of Hayle" by Charles Crowle.

There has been little written about the glass works in Hayle, some that I have talked to, had no knowledge of one ever being here. It was sited near the now demolished Associated Ethyl plant (I.C.I.) It was discovered that the Hayle sand was particularly suitable for glass making, as it contained a very high proportion of lime. Silica the other important ingredient, was found in a highly concentrated form in china clay tailings at St. Austell. But they also found it contained a high percentage of iron, which left a brown tint in the glass. They could

only make dark coloured bottles, which had a limited sale. Despite all the enthusiasm, this company, nor the one that succeeded it, survived long.

They were succeeded in 1920 by another ambitious company, the Pentowen Glass Bottle Co. It took only two months to get into production, including the furnace, capable of holding 10 tons of molten glass, with an output of 300 gross 12oz bottles a week and a plan to recycle glass as a raw material. The intention was to produce a pale glass, to manufacture jam jars, medicine and sauce bottles. This like the other enterprise met the same fate. All that remains now is the stack. This was going to be

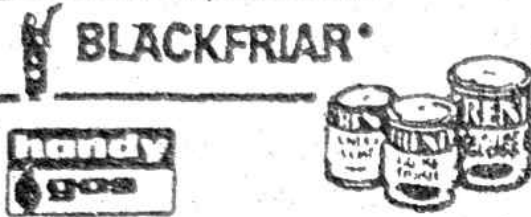

"I am an impoverished Knight going to John o' Groats with my trusty dog" he replied.

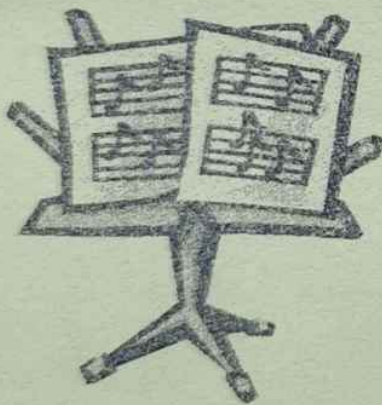
