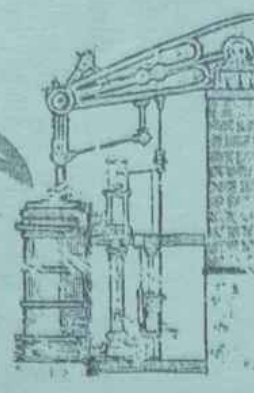

The couple originate from Lichfield in Staffordshire and had lived in Solihull, West Midlands for 10 years before moving to Hayle. "We have always loved Cornwall" says Debbie.

Chef, Rob, describes the cuisine as contemporary English with International influences. Amongst some of the mouth-watering dishes on the carefully selected menu are baked fillet of sea bass with wild mushrooms; rosemary and garlic lamb cutlets with redcurrant; and pork in cider and mushroom sauce. There is always a vegetarian option and daily specials often feature fresh local fish. Local produce is used wherever possible. For those with a sweet tooth, the tempting array of desserts includes hot black cherries with brandy and vanilla ice cream, warm plum cake with cider and honey sauce and, the most popular - a trio of miniature desserts for those who can't choose just one!

The fixed price Dinner Menu offers three courses for £17.95 and two courses for £14.95. A selection of lighter meals, including pasta and salad dishes, are also available, together with a special children's menu.

Debbie designed and carried out the redecoration of the

restaurant with a nautical theme, which is reflected in the refreshing blue and yellow decor that echoes the colours of sea and sand.

White Sails is now taking bookings for Christmas Functions and some dates are already full. The special seasonal menu will be available from the beginning of December. The restaurant, which is fully licensed and non-smoking, will be open throughout the winter - the number of weekday openings may be reduced, so please check beforehand.

The restaurant is also available

for private functions and for use during the daytime for meetings by local groups.

Below is an extract from the business plan for King George V Memorial Walk, as an illustration of where the money goes.

"The area was further improved this year by the installation of a line of Victorian style lamp posts. The installation of the above lights has resulted in a problem for the Hayle Decorative Lighting since it was envisaged that our lights could be strung between these poles but because of the specification of the poles, they could not be used. Negotiations between HDL, Hayle Town and Penwith District Councils

have resulted in an agreement that the Councils will supply 34 new poles to cover the Walk but HDL must dig the holes, supply 26 cu.metres of concrete to bed the poles in the grass verge between the road edge and Hayle Pool retaining wall. The Council will obtain the necessary planning permission for this to meet highway regulations.

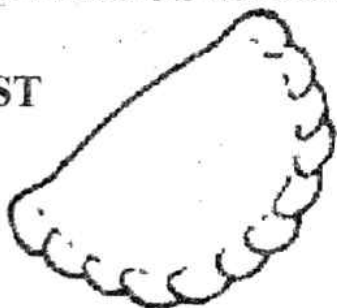

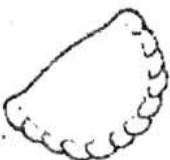

What an autumn we've had on the estuary. Usually we see one or two vagrant birds blown over from North

America during the autumn gales but this year has been quite exceptional. Any American bird is rare of course in this country – they should be heading for South America not SW England but waders and wildfowl regularly get blown off course as they travel south along the eastern seaboard during their autumn migration and so become easily displaced by the gales or even hurricanes associated with that part of the world from September onwards. This is bad news for the birds themselves but good news for us as we can expect to see birds we may never have seen before. This September/October brought us Pectoral, White-rumped and Solitary

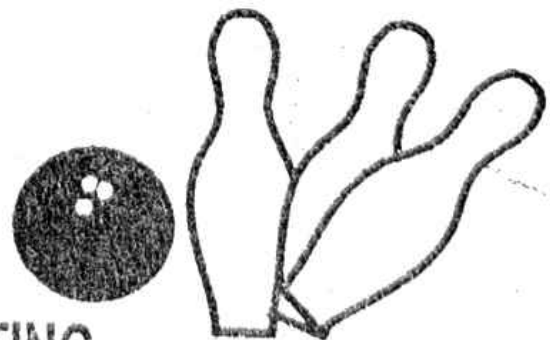

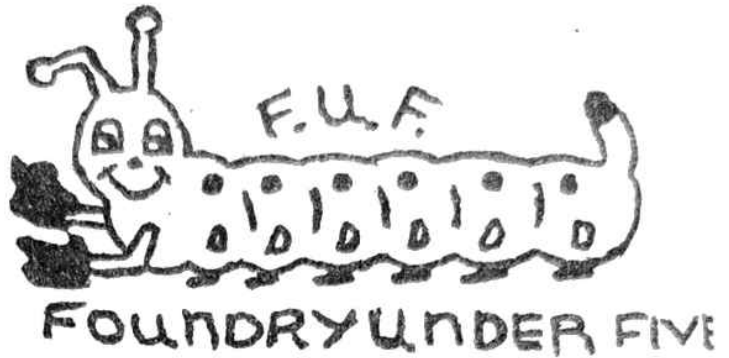

The whereabouts of the brass plaque which first triggered Peter Burke's quest for the story behind the name O'Okeip is still a mystery. It has been suggested that it might have been located on the wall of Pierce's Grocery Shop in Foundry Square (now Ray Schubert's)

## Pilot Kerbside Recycling Collection.

Penwith D.C. are very pleased with the scheme so far, and give a big thank you to the people of Hayle for their support. The bulk of the collection is newspapers and magazines, the tonnages to date are:

Week 1 (10-13 Oct) 4.980 tonnes

Week 2 (24-27 Oct) 7.940 tonnes

Week 3 (7-19 Nov) 7.440 tonnes

That's a total of 20.360 tonnes that hasn't had to go for landfill, better for the environment and also helping to keep Council Tax down.

You can also put out washed food tins, drinks cans and clothes and shoes.

Please don't put the recycling bags inside the wheelie bins, they must be left by the side.

If you have old furniture cookers, freezers, fridges etc these too can be recycled through SOFA, a part of Cornwall Community Volunteer Services, which provides items of furniture to needy individuals. All items are collected free of charge. If you feel you can help with unwanted items, or if you are on benefits and wish to obtain some furniture, contact the SOFA project on 01209 719733.

## Extract from "A Short History of Hayle" by Charles L. Crowle

The Hayle River was always a major obstacle even in the old days. There have been various ferries recorded over the river for hundreds of years, the first recognised one in 1089. The Lelant side was known as Ferrytown. It was in operation until about 1983, there were one or two feeble attempts to keep it running, but due to lack of support and enthusiasm it was closed down.

Crossing the Estuary by land was very dangerous. At low tide travellers could encounter quicksands, and unexpected deep water made by "eddy currents".

Before the Causeway was built in 1825, travellers wishing to go to Penzance or St. Ives had to cross over at low tide, or make a long detour south of St. Erth bridge.

There was a safe road crossing over the mud and sand, starting at the

Royal Standard and terminating Lelant Church. The road was marked with large granite posts. It is recorded that the Standard did a flourishing trade with travellers waiting for the tide to recede. There was no road in front of Penzance Terrace, this was built with much waste in 1820. There was another crossing commencing from Harvey (now timber yard) to Lelant Station. It was very dangerous, and many people lost their lives trying to cross before low water despite the warnings of the locals of the treacherous quicksands and dangerous currents.

John Wesley, the well-known Methodist preacher, came to go when, despite warnings and the driver's fear of crossing, he tried to cross at half tide. He was informed after a prayer, that the good Lord would ensure a safe crossing. Fortified with the knowledge that the Lord would guide them, he attempted to cross. It was said that it might have been the Lord's day because the carriage sank in a deep pool. Members of the church

congregation, where he was destined to preach, swam out to him, cut the horses free and dragged Wesley and the driver to safety. It was not on record what his sermon was about, but one of the hymns could have been "Rescue the perishing" or perhaps "From sinking sands He lifted me"!

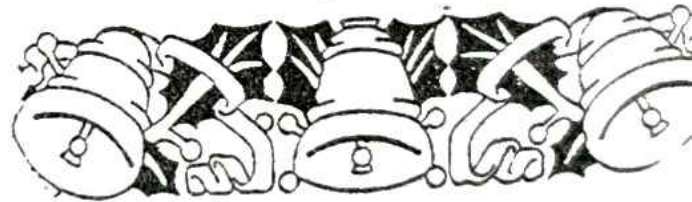

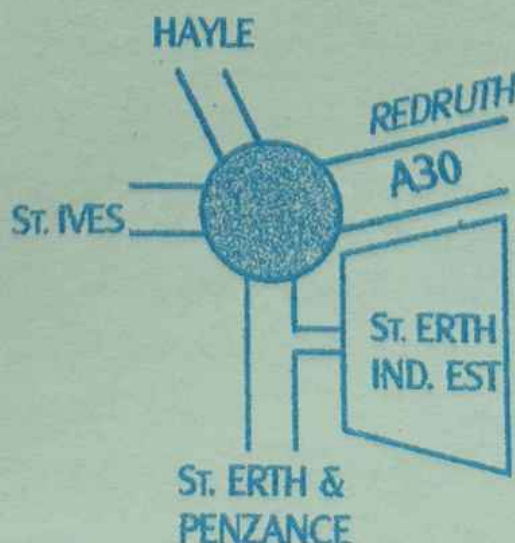

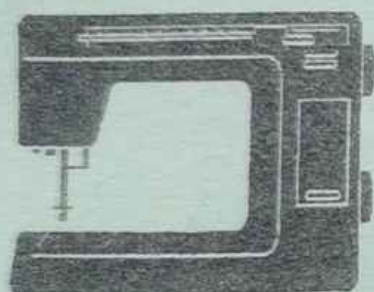
