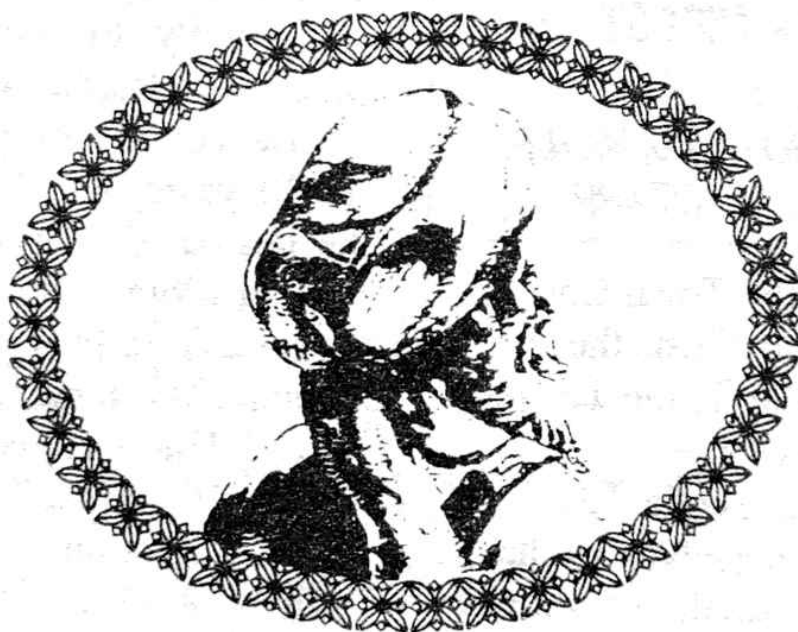

I now had something to work for, and already the quality of my life had improved. Leslie had arranged an appointment for me with Brendan, the C.A.T. representative at the caravan, and when I met



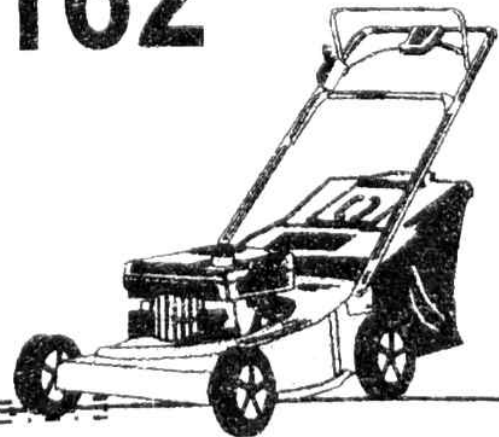

In 1932 Patrick Ryan and his sons and their families came to live at Trelissick Farm, there were several children and because of this the Roman Catholic Church decided to open a small convent school in the grounds behind St. Michael's Hospital. The school was called St. Joseph's R.C. School. The first week began with eleven pupils! The sizes of the classes varied from year to year, no more than 28 at one time, but sadly the school closed in early 1969, so over a period of 37 years there might have been approximately 300-350 pupils.

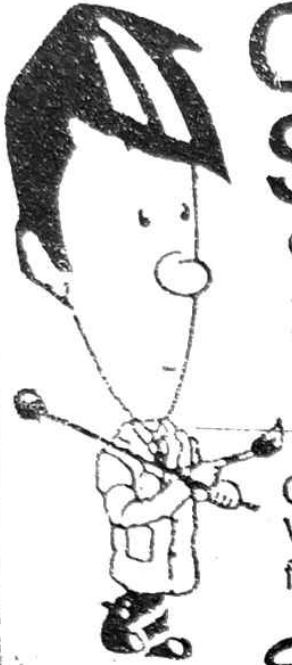

A rather quiet spring on the reserve so far: all the wintering waders and wildfowl have long since departed to their northern breeding grounds – including the 4 Whooper Swans which spent much of the winter here, departing in early April. I suspect they are currently incubating eggs somewhere in Iceland as I write this. A small passage of waders including Dunlin, Ringed Plover and Whimbrel have passed through and 3 North American Ring-billed Gulls were present 9<sup>th</sup> April with an

unseasonably late Glaucous Gull 6<sup>th</sup> May. Other goodies have been Osprey on 2<sup>nd</sup> and a pair of Garganey 17<sup>th</sup> May.

We reopened the car park and hide at Ryan's Field 12<sup>th</sup> April after talks with local farmers concerning Foot & Mouth precautions but the footpath restrictions meant we couldn't open the whole reserve until further talks with Cornwall County Council were conducted. I'm pleased to say both our Cornish reserves at Hayle and Marazion Marsh are now fully open again. We will once again be conducting organised birdwatches from our hide at Ryan's Field every Sunday from June 10am – 5pm but why not

**Are You Ready to Take  
the Plunge?**

Suddenly it seems as if Summer is really on the way. Just when we thought the wet days of Winter would never end, the few days of warm sunshine have convinced us that perhaps all this talk of a long hot Summer might just be true. In Cornwall, and especially in Hayle with our "three miles of golden sands" warm Summer days mean time on the beach. Lovely! Then suddenly we remember days on the beach mean days in our swimming costumes. Not so lovely! Winter is a time we tend to sit around indoors

eating too much and drinking more than we should and all those extra pounds might struggle to fit inside the cossie.

I always know when summer is around the corner from the sudden increase in the numbers and enthusiasm for my exercise classes. I have been running these at the Community School and the Passmore Edwards Institute for several years and the seasonal surges never vary. Classes tend to be well attended in the autumn when the nights draw in and outdoor evening activities become less attractive but when the gales and deluges of winter afflict us, only the dedicated enthusiasts keep going. When Spring first begins to rustle there is a further decline in numbers as quite understandably the attractions of the lighter evenings draw people outside, perhaps to garden or get out the bicycle or the tennis racquet. Then summer shows its hand and the "Bikini Syndrome" brings the beach lovers back.

It is always a pleasure to welcome new converts to exercise and even if there are occasional lapses in enthusiasm it is surprising how many old friends come back to the fold when their bodies seem to say to them "Now come along we really must do something about these bulges!" We all know there are no quick fixes in weight loss but there is also no doubt that a sensible diet

combined with regular moderately strenuous exercise can work wonders in making us feel and look better. The Sports Scientists tell us it only takes six weeks of inactivity for a fit person to sink back to the level of fitness they were at before they started working out. However, if you look at that in a more cheerful way it means a programme of regular exercise for just six weeks will do wonders for your general fitness level.

Ideally, the experts tell us we should aim for a routine of three sessions of moderate exercise for not less than forty minutes a week. Sounds a bit daunting doesn't it? You might well ask how you are supposed to find

the time – never mind the money to attend four exercises classes a week. But look at it another way. If you can fit in a couple of classes, be they Step Classes or General Body Toning, then you can top up the rest of the quota by a cycle ride or a brisk walk or a swim and so on.

There is no doubt that if you can set yourself that sort of target then you will tone up the flab and feel much more cheerful and positive about yourself. It is now a well established fact that the sort of exercise we are talking about not only increases your Cardio-Vascular efficiency but by releasing Endorphins into the blood gives you a real feeling of well being. It not

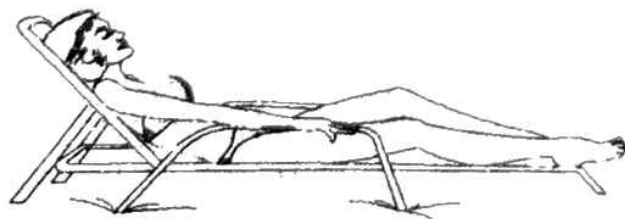

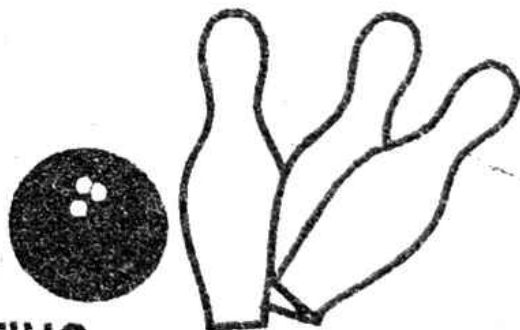

Additionally they receive financial support from Carrick District Council and local businesses. Hayle Forum will benefit from the detail given. The Chairman thanked Mr. Hewitt.

The Chairman presented her Annual Report which was adopted by the meeting. She was thanked for the report and its content, and the good work she had done during her year in office.

The Treasurer, Jim Wright, presented his report and accounts, which were accepted by the members present.

They showed that the Forum, through its Community Fund had assisted local Groups to the tune of £12,998 during the year. A full list of the recipients of grants is below.

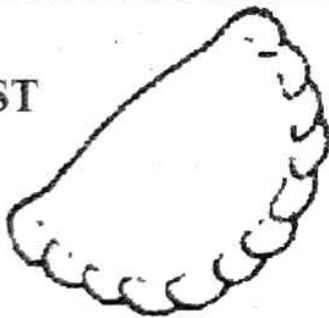

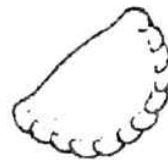

glass of house wine with our compliments.

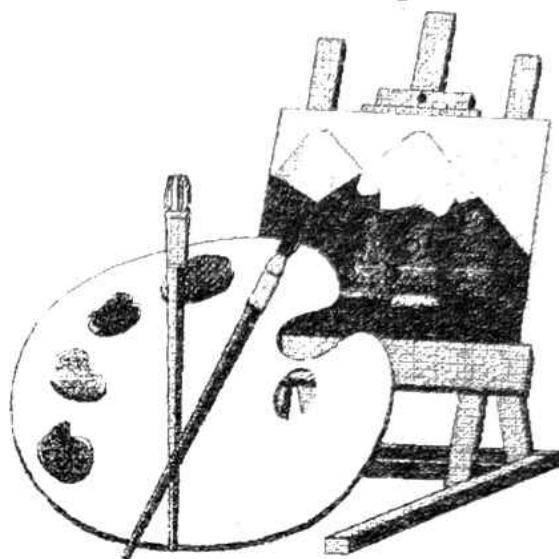

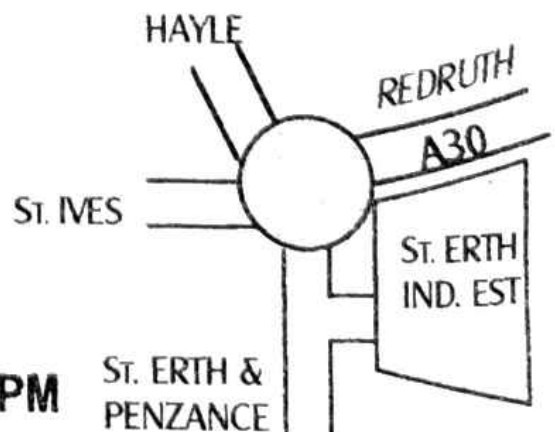

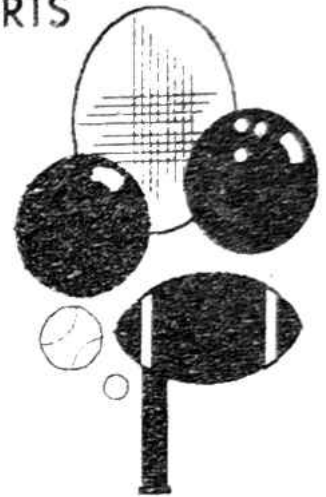

## The 1940s

War began four months ago. The boys have either volunteered or been conscripted for the Forces. They went away for six months' basic training, came home for a brief leave, and then away to War - this time for real.

The village men dug an air raid shelter in the bank on top of the hill. We are all issued with gas masks and identity cards. It was compulsory to take them with you wherever you went.

No longer friendly lights from windows or streetlights shining - we have blackouts. It is a serious offence to show a light for which you could be fined. There were air raid wardens on duty at night keeping watch. There were also firewatchers on duty on top of the hill; this work was voluntary, but everyone who was able did their bit.

The siren warned us that enemy bombers were on their way. One night a bomb dropped in Mr. Ingram's field. Fortunately no-one was hurt, but there was some structural damage. On another night bombs dropped on The Towans, aiming for the Power Station. I worked there, and was night shift at the time. We were very fortunate in comparison to the rest of the country.

We were issued with ration books; what food was not rationed was scarce. Imported produce was no longer available. Everyone grew vegetables. It was strange to see the front gardens in Caroline Row growing vegetables instead of flowers. Some of us grew fruit: strawberries, raspberries, loganberries, rhu-

barb, gooseberries, blackcurrants. We had them all as they came into season, not forgetting the wild blackberry. They were all most acceptable in those days. A bar of soap had to last a week for washing ourselves, the dishes, tables, floors and the laundry. It somehow lasted. We cleaned our teeth with soot or salt, cleaned our faces with petroleum jelly, witch hazel was a good astringent. Clothes were rationed as well. I think we had 26 coupons a year, but with 14 for a coat and 7 for a pair of shoes, little was left for anything else.

Not very happy leaving school, then starting work in a gymslip. Girls who worked in shops or in service were now on munitions and some went into the Armed Forces. Any household with a spare room was compelled to take evacuees. We made camouflage nets and also knitted string vests.

The immaculate Penmare was taken over by the Army. It was full of soldiers who drilled up and down Caroline Row every day. The recreation ground was full of soldiers as well. A

guard stood at the entrance - NO ENTRY. There were British and American soldiers billeted in Hayle Riviera House, and the Drill Hall was also occupied. Despite all these strangers, it was always safe to go out in the dark with no streetlights or white lines, or cats' eyes to guide you. I often wonder how we found our way to and from the Power Station on those dark winter nights.

Iron gates and fences were confiscated for munitions. Everyone had a part to play and we were there for each

other.

May 1945 and the War is over - it was unusually warm and sunny for that time of year. We gathered at the bottom of the hill, thankful that it was over, but I shall never forget the look that was exchanged between my mother and Mrs. Gregor - they had each lost a son, so had five other families in our little village. One of my brothers was a gunner in the regular army. He was killed in Antwerp in December 1944. Another brother served in the RAF and two other brothers were

train drivers transporting ammunition, war materials and troops. They were often signalled to stop in a tunnel to shelter from enemy bombing until the All Clear was given, not knowing what was in front of them when they came out. Two of my cousins were also killed. The men and women who went away are returning and we will never know what they have been through as they have never talked about it.

Everything is changing - Blackouts are no longer required, the streetlights are on again, our village is lit up again. There is still rationing - we have coupons now for utility furniture. It was quite good - some of it is still in use. People are buying their homes instead of renting. Alas our house was sold. I was 19 and had to leave my beloved village. We went to live in a council

house. It never did feel like home to me. Some of my friends married and went away. I don't know how others feel, but Ventonleague will always have a special place in my heart.

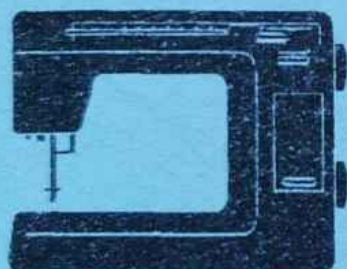

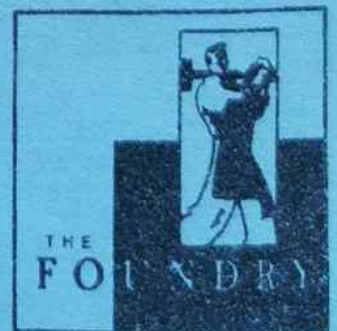
