BURGLARY AT SOUNDLEE

This is an open letter to those responsible for the break-in and burglary at Soundlee Music on Wednesday 15th May. I want to tell you a little bit about myself. After all, you feel you have the right to enter my property, so it seems only right that you get to know me a little.

I am a single parent, who has had to struggle for the whole of my adult life. I opened my shop with nothing just over 6 months ago, fulfilling a lifelong dream. Many people told me I wouldn't last 6 months, as I had no money behind me, and there have been times when I didn't think that I would. Every obstacle that could be thrown up at me, has been thrown up at me. But I survived those 6 months, against all the odds. I've been scraping by week by week, with no wage, but managing to get through by the skin of my teeth. I have known from day one that I would never be rich, but that isn't why I wanted my own shop. I wanted it for two reasons; for my own self-respect, and because I wanted my sons to be proud of me.

When I saw what you had done, when I arrived here on Thursday morning, I collapsed. It's not just the loss, though that's bad enough, it's the fact that you violated all I have worked for for

the past year. And believe me I've worked harder than I've ever worked in my life before – 7 days a week, and often 10 hours a day. ouraged me, despite all the miles of Sellotape I must have got through. At school, thanks to a student teacher with a brain in his head I learned batik, tie-dyeing, wood carving, silk screen printing and collage. That never happened, although I did become a mural painter for a while, worked in a youth theatre and much later became a portrait artist.

From 1992-1996 I lived in St Ives, but couldn't get past the clique. I sold beads, jewellery and collages from the house I rented, then got into making the model racing cars. Now I'm back with the jewellery and love it. Working with colour is a joy and the 3D of jewellery is like doing sculpture. I'm aiming to be in Hayle

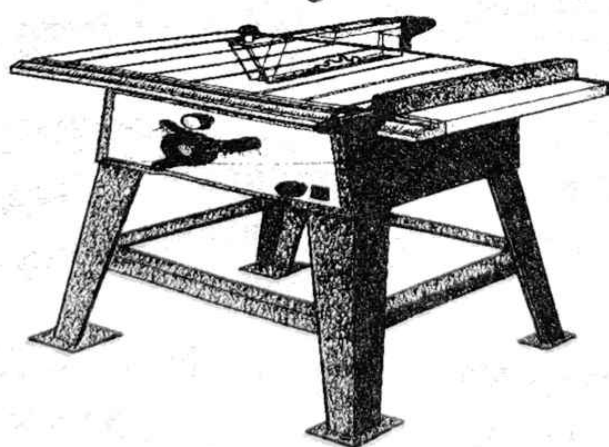

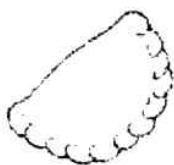

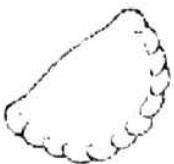

Launceston Town Band's CD "The Magic of the Movies" immediately plunges the listener into silver screen mode with the opening track, the famous '20th Century Fox Fanfare'. This is followed with as varied a selection of movie themes as you could wish to hear, with 18 tracks ranging from Ron Goodwin's 'Those Magnificent Men' to John Williams' 'Star Wars'. 'My Heart Will Go On' (from Titanic) has a superb tenor horn solo by Lauren

Oliver, and amongst other delights there are stellar treatments of 'The Magnificent Seven' and 'The James Bond Theme'. If you're a band fan you will love this; if you're a band fan *and* a movie buff you will be in seventh heaven! (54 mins, £10.99.)

The second CD for review features a very different type of Cornish musical talent. "Mammyk Ker...", on the Kesson label, features traditional Cornish folk artists. The album is mainly instrumental, with a couple of vocal tracks, and features eleven different local artists/groups. These include Bagas Degol, a clarinet/bagpipe/percussion trio from Penzance, Anao Atao, Cornwall's best known traditional folk group, the Bodmin-based traditional fiddler Graham Ellaby, and Cornish pipes expertly played by former orchestral cellist Rob Strike. The tracks were chosen by the musicians themselves, and they also wrote the well-produced and informative sleeve notes. This is an excellent showcase for traditional Cornish music, and followers of Celtic music will find much to admire and enjoy on this CD. (44 mins, £11.99.)

Finally, one of the most requested items on local radio is 'Morning in Cornwall', by James Last. Sadly, the CD 'Bluebird' on which this appears has been out of

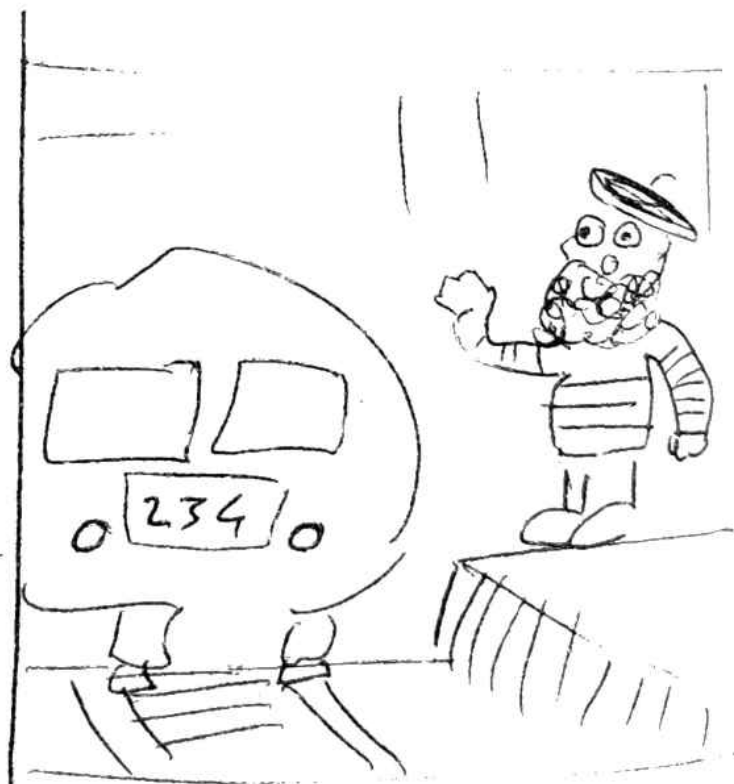

In reply to the personal attack on me printed in the Pump, I must say that Cllrs Colin & Owen Philp have set out to deliberately misinterpret my views and misinform readers.

As regards the issues over sand, I along with many others including London & Amsterdam Developers and the Chief Executive of Penwith District Council support the principles of SOS and feel that Hayle's greatest natural asset should be retained. We are surprised that it is only the Philp brothers and their supporters who think that the preservation of Hayle beach is incompatible with the Harbour regeneration.

Far from wanting to wreck any development plans my concern is that proper rigour and consideration be given to any plans at the local level taking into account the Penwith Local Plan. Then there can be no nasty surprises for anyone. We have already experienced once the consequences of passing a plan without due scrutiny at the District Council level only for it to fail higher up the line, surely not even Cllrs Philp would want a repeat of this.

never said or expected that a developer should do the job for no return, but it is up to the elected representatives and the officers of the council to ensure that any development brings as much benefit to Hayle as it does to the owner/developer.

Instead, it would appear more energy is used in coercion and bullying than actually trying to ensure the right thing is done for Hayle. Attacking anyone who dares to hold an opinion and even express it is an attempt to stifle debate over what is supposed to be the most important issue to face Hayle in generations.

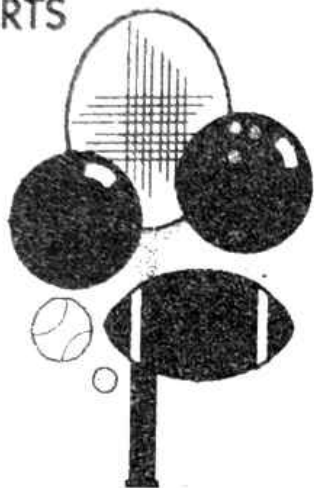

RSPB NEWS

It has been a rather uneventful spring at the nature reserve with only a scattering of waders; small flocks of Bar-tailed Godwits heading to the arctic from their wintering grounds in Africa and one or two Black-taileds which will spend the summer in more temperate climes, though sadly only a few in eastern England remain in this country. Whimbrel have been seen most days lately with up to 50 on 1st May. They should be around for some time to come although their nearest breeding grounds are in Scotland. Smaller than our resident Curlew, these summer visitors have a more striking head pattern with a dark eye-stripe and crown and white lines above and below, although it is their trilling call that gives them away. The most unusual sighting was that of a small swift flying south over Ryan's Field on 24th May which showed a white rump. It was probably the Little Swift seen in Scilly the week before but as so often happens in birding, this was yet another that got away!

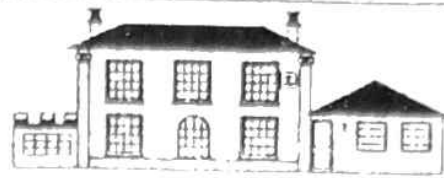

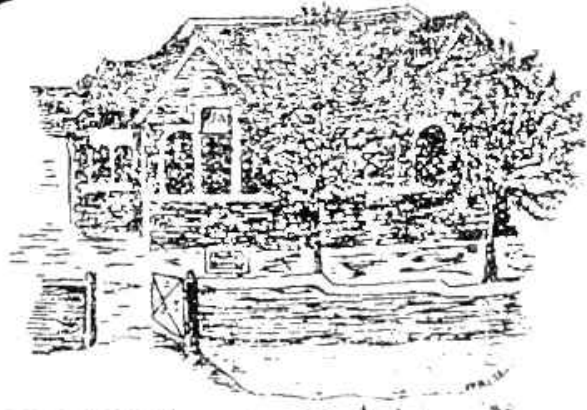

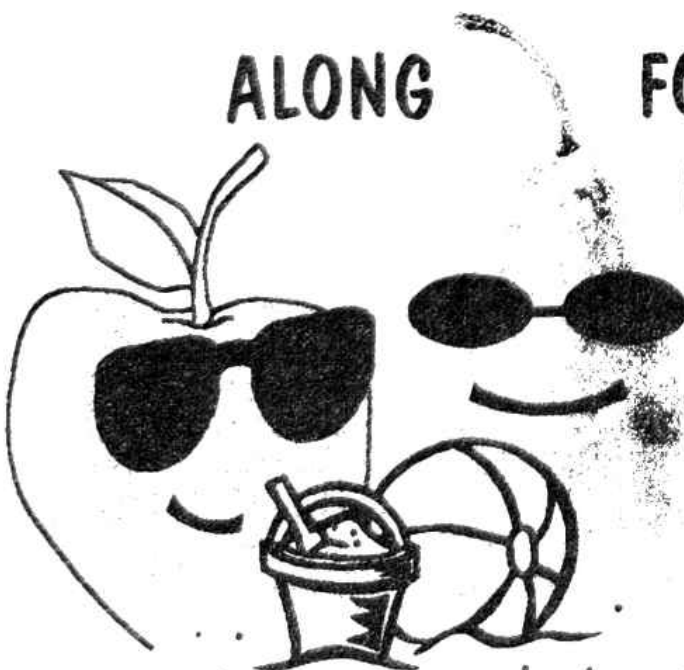

HEARING DOGS FOR DEAF PEOPLE



(Patron HRH The Princess Royal)

Hearing Dogs for Deaf People is a registered charity that selects and trains dogs to respond to specific sounds. Hearing dogs alert people by touch, using a paw to gain attention and then lead them back to the sound source. For sounds such as the smoke alarm and fire alarm the dogs will lay down to indicate danger.

Analysis of the performance of dogs taken in by the Charity from a variety of backgrounds, including dog pounds and rescue operations, shows that working cocker-type dogs are by far the most successful.

TV vet Bruce Fogle explains: Over generations, selective breeding has accentuated characteristics, now inherent within breeds, that militate against some being easy to train as hearing dogs. Labradors are too laid back, easy-going. Among collie and springer types, every little thing – a noise, a sight, a smell, a leaf – captures their vivid interest. They have difficulty giving priority to what hearing dogs must give priority to.

Hearing Dogs for Deaf People

provides a national service and no charge is made to recipients. Seventy four per cent of all hearing dogs adopted into the scheme are either rescued or unwanted and since its inception in 1982, Hearing Dogs for Deaf people has placed more than 800 hearing dogs. They are always looking for new dogs, especially for working-strain cocker, poodle or toy-types. The Charity has three centres operating in the UK – Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire and North Yorkshire.

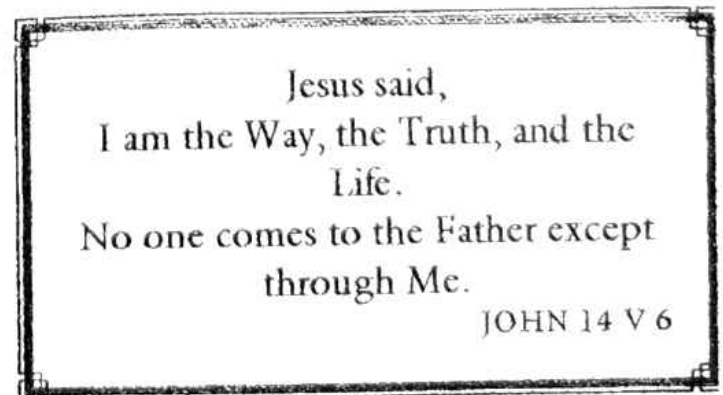

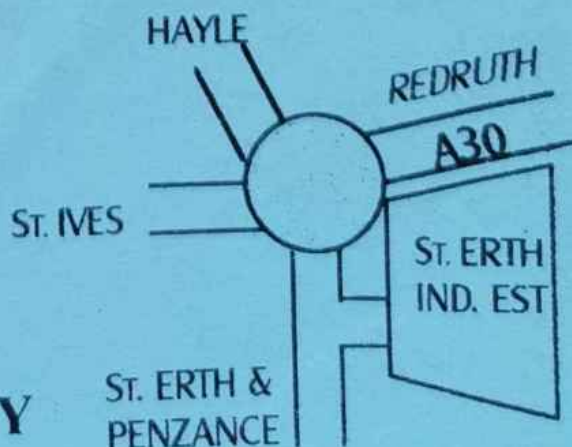
