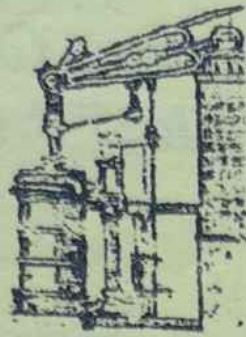

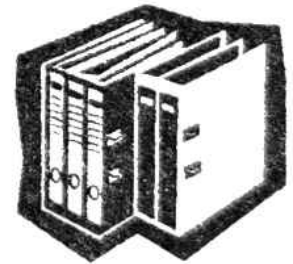

children, and apart from Benjamin Luxon features some notable artistes, including Frederica von Stade, Dawn Upshaw and Meryl Streep. Many tracks have a simple but effective accompaniment including Chris Brubeck (son of Dave) on piano and Bill Crofut on banjo. The original concept for the album was Bill Crofut's, who firmly felt that children need not be patronised, and would respond to the fresh impact of beauty. Tragically he died shortly after the project was completed, but the album is a fitting testament to his beliefs. The enchanting and varied performances of such items as "Simple Gifts" and "Dance to your Daddy" will appeal equally to children and grownups alike, and there is a wonderful version of the traditional Cornish song "Sweet Nightingale". The superb performances and arrangements add to the enjoyment of a most captivating album. (60 mins, £12.50.)

Although it also features Benjamin Luxon, the second CD is very different indeed. "Enoch Arden" is a melodrama for speaker and piano, with poetry by Alfred Lord Tennyson and music by Richard Strauss. First published in 1864, "Enoch Arden" was one of Tennyson's most popular poems, and in 1896 Strauss wrote the music for the work as it appears on this CD, in its complete version. The story is a classic and tragic one of a three-way split when a husband, with wife and children

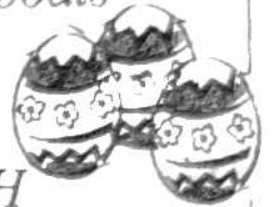

Celebrities who have fished here include newscaster Trevor McDonald and footballers from Liverpool football club. The Cornish record weight for rainbow trout is 21lbs, and is held by Tree Meadow. Our cover created a huge amount of favourable comment from everyone. We decided to award Louis a £25 voucher for art

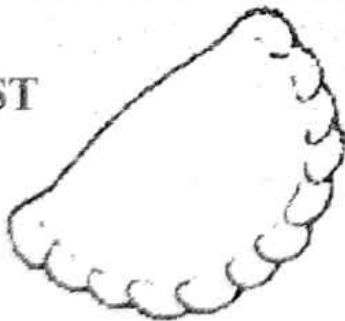

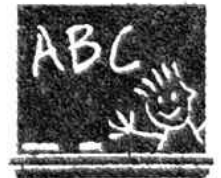

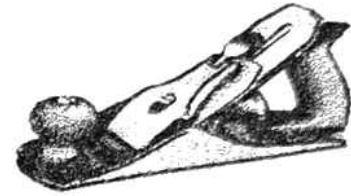

## FIT FOR WHAT?

The tell-tale signs of spring are all around us. The daffodils are blooming, the first swallows have been sighted and the bathroom scales have gone wrong again. How else to explain those unwanted pounds and inches that seem to have crept up on us in the dark days of winter? Nothing to do with all the Christmas bingeing and inactive nights slumped in front of the box of course. Anyway, whatever the causes of that sluggish overweight feeling, we have this annual urge to do something about it. I see numbers increase at the exercise classes I run in Hayle but in talking to people

around the town many say they feel too shy or embarrassed to join a class which they imagine to be full of slender young gymnasts leaping about in trendy leotards! Wrong. A pair of trainers and some comfortable track suit bottoms or leggings are just fine. And age has nothing to do with it. Fit youngsters in Hayle are more likely to be training at the rugby or football club or playing tennis or surfing than attending exercise classes. Which is the whole point about exercise; deciding why you want to be fit. If you are preparing to play eighty minutes of rugby for Hayle Lions every Saturday then your training programme needs to be a bit different from someone who just wants to keep fit enough to take a Sunday afternoon stroll on the King George V Memorial Walk. In other words we need to be fit for our life style. Any exercise is better than no exercise and no one form of exercise is better than any other.

In the three weekly classes I run at the Passmore Edwards Institute I try to tailor the sessions to suit the differing levels of fitness people are looking for to suit their particular life style. The Step Class is excellent for improving cardio vascular efficiency but because you can adjust the height of the step you work on you can tailor your programme to suit your individual fitness target. This winter, for example, some super fit members of the Gig Club have worked happily alongside those of more mature

years aiming to build up stamina to tackle summer sessions on the coastal path. If that still sounds a bit too strenuous I run a couple of classes for those of all ages, shapes and sizes which are non-impact sessions and target the dreaded "tums and bums" flab. It all helps tone and condition our saggy bits but of course exercise alone can't take off the pounds. It has to be part of a whole programme of sensible eating and drinking but the workouts do help produce that feel-good factor and working with a group is fun and even something of a social occasion.

If you can't face an exercise class there is so much opportunity in Hayle to get yourself a bit fitter

without complicated planning. We have the Towans on our doorstep and it is hard to imagine more beautiful walking. Just aim gradually to walk a bit quicker and a bit further week by week and you will have devised your own programme of "moderate sustained exercise" which we are all told all the time is good for us. If that goes well you may feel up to joining a local walking or rambling group or perhaps graduate to cycling; excellent non-impact aerobic exercise. Why not try and tackle the twelve mile or so round trip on the National Cycle Route to Penzance? Flat most of the way and stunning views of Mount's Bay when you get there.

## **HAYLE MEANDERERS**

**Sancreed – Carn Euny.** Meeting at Hayle in warm sunshine, we set off towards St Just, turning right at the sign for Drift and parking beside Sancreed Church. Unfortunately the church was locked, but we were able to visit the grave of Stanhope and Gwen Forbes, two of Cornwall's most famous artists, who painted the ordinary people of Cornwall. Crossing the road and taking the footpath to Chapel

Downs Holy Well, stopping to peer down into the clear water in which many pilgrims have dipped their hands to invoke its healing and prophetic powers. The trees overhanging the well were beribboned and a tiny ruined chapel stands nearby. Moving on to the road, we climbed steadily towards Sancreed beacon and read its history on the plaque, but decided to carry on towards Carn Euny and not risk walking on the mine pocked summit. A mile along the road we turned left onto the bridle path just past the first buildings of Grumbla. Our usual footpath was closed and we finally took a very muddy track to Carn Euny settlement and the panoramic views made the struggle worthwhile, not to mention the round and courtyard houses of this Iron Age village which was discovered by a miner in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century and was excavated in 1928. The 18 metre long fogou (meaning cave in Cornish) is unique and its circular underground chamber, which is entered by stooping low beneath the huge granite doorway certainly has a strange spiritual atmosphere. Was it used for religious ceremonies or as a refuge from raiding tribes? We wandered around and sat in the sunshine eating our picnic lunch and visiting the tiny pottery and plant stall, where a note asked us to feel free to look around and put

our money through the letterbox. Wonderful to find a bit of Cornwall from yesterday when you could trust your fellow man.

Heading back to Sancreed and our transport we found our party had enlarged. An ancient Labrador was taking a fancy to our meandering puppy Blue, and had to be returned to his cottage home by two of our members. Ending our day at Trengwainton Gardens café, where the staff were delighted to meet the Hayle Meanderers having followed our weekly progress in the local press.

S.T.E.P.S. stands for "Steps to Excellence for Personal Success", and the course attempts to channel your thoughts in a positive way and to change your attitudes and thought patterns. 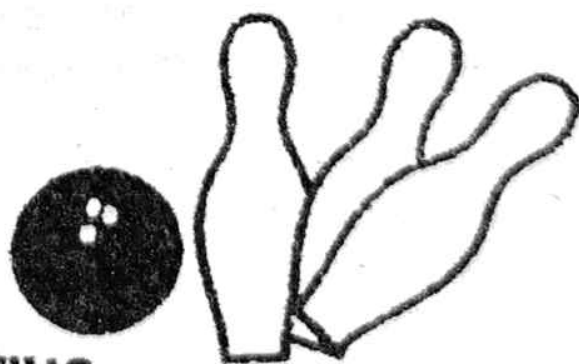

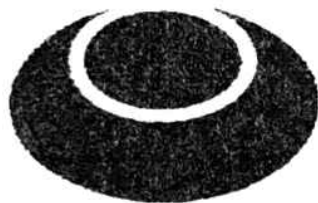
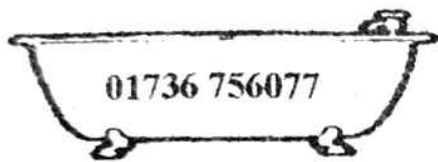

Call centre staff log the request and then source a driver for the journey. The drivers are volunteers who get paid expenses by the mile. They can choose how much of their time they are wishing to give to the scheme and, in future, have the opportunity to take part in the Community Transport Association Car Scheme Driver Training.

For a small charge per mile, those without access to their own transport or public transport can be taken to and from their appointments in a safe and friendly manner. For patients who are recommended not to travel on their own or without an escort on public transport, this type of service is vital.

Ann Lewis, Transport Manager for Age Concern Cornwall & Isles of Scilly, says "We are delighted with the success of this scheme as we are receiving calls from all over the County from patients who previously had difficulty keeping their appointments due to lack of transport. 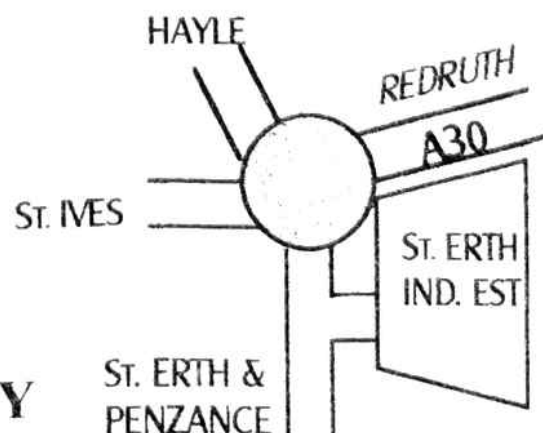

## ABIDE WITH ME

Many people know that the moving hymn "Abide with me" was written in the face of a serious illness by Henry Francis Lyte, vicar of the Devonshire village of Lower Brixham. Less known perhaps is the fact that the tune to which we always sing the hymn "Eventide" was also written during a time of great sorrow. The composer was Dr W.H. Monk, editor of the first music edition of 'Ancient and Modern'.

Dr Monk had just lost their little daughter, only three years old. Mrs Monk later described how the grieving parents gained comfort each day by watching "the glories of the setting sun". One evening, she tells us, her husband was

inspired to write some music. "As the last golden ray faded he took up some scrap paper and pencilled that tune which has gone all over the world." When both words and tune were written as a triumph over suffering, no wonder that this hymn has given strength to millions.
