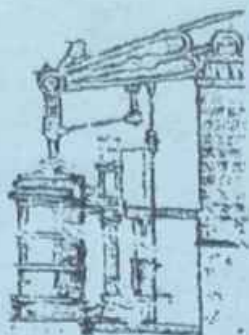
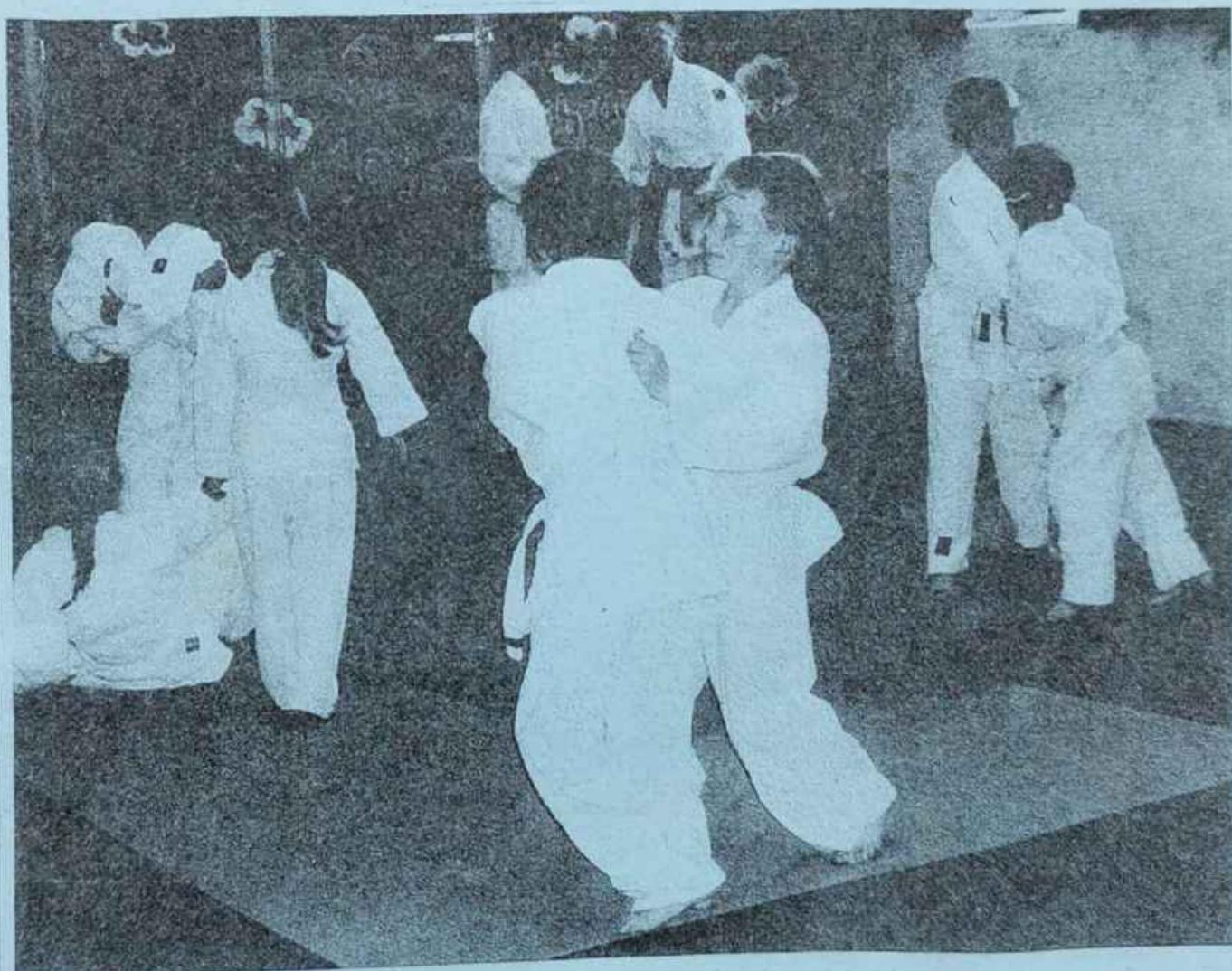

cessful St Ives Jazz Club. London-based alto saxophonist Chris Francis has made frequent public appearances in Penwith for over 30 years, and double bassist Marcus Vergette often appears at St Ives Jazz Club. The CD features 9 original compositions, 6 by Ralph and 3 by the group's fourth member, drummer Rod Coombes. Personally I have always preferred to hear Ralph playing his own quirky, idiosyncratic compositions rather than the jazz standards, and his playing here on what are mainly medium tempo vehicles is as effective as ever. The other main soloist, Chris Francis, displays characteristic verve and excitement, and it is a pleasure in these 'retro jazz' days to hear a CD entirely devoid of the usual token, and overplayed, jazz standards. One quibble though – to my ears the gorgeous sax sound of Chris Francis has a markedly distant quality in the mix. Recording balance is, however, notoriously subjective, so other listeners may well disagree. (41 mins £11.50.)

For those who like their jazz live, St Ives Jazz Club sessions are held every Tuesday at the Iso-bar, featuring various groups, including well-known London stars. Further details available on (01736) 798061 or 796082.

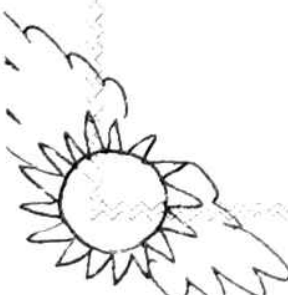

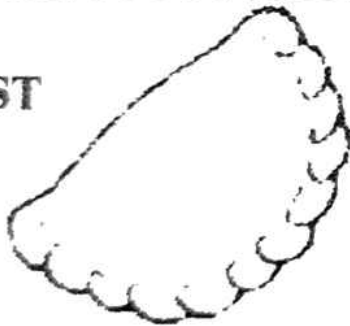

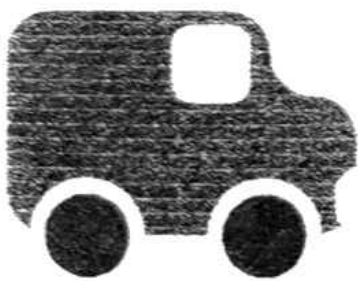
## THERE'S NOWT SO STRANGE AS FOLK

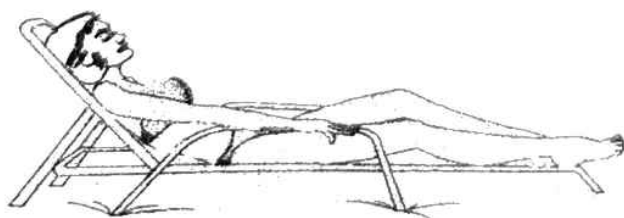

## **BROADBAND FOR HAYLE**

"Broadband for Hayle" is a campaign run by the residents of Hayle to apply pressure on BT to bring broadband to the town. Firstly we would like to stress that we are not attempting to sell anything, we would simply like to see broadband brought here.

You may have seen a lot of advertising in the press, both in the newspapers and on television recently promoting broadband and its benefits. What you may not be aware of is that Hayle at present has no access to broadband as our exchange (situated in Foundry Square) has not been upgraded to

deliver ADSL. BT have decided that in order for Hayle's telephone exchange to be upgraded to do this, we need to register 400 sign-ups on their website in order to start the process of upgrading the exchange. (BT have stated that unless this figure is reached Hayle is due to be upgraded in around 7 years time.)

ADSL is a form of broadband internet access that delivers a high speed internet connection via your existing telephone cable, it has the added bonus of allowing you to access the internet and make/receive telephone calls at the same time. So no more engaged tones for hours on end, or checking no-one in your house is on-line before picking up the phone to make a call. More benefits of ADSL and the benefits for business users are explained on our campaign website.

Penzance, St Ives and Camborne already have access to this technology and we feel that Hayle should not be left back in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century and should be given access to the same technology as our neighbouring towns. This is especially true if we are to attract new businesses to the town, as without broadband available they are more likely to be set up elsewhere. To let you know what the Mayor & Councillors do on behalf of the town, here is a precis of the Mayor's Report to the annual electors meeting held on Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> April 2003.

David Barratt said: " Firstly, I can report that in response to the ever increasing demands on both your officers and Councillors, a change has been made to the format of our meetings in order to give time for proper deliberation of specific matters, especially planning matters. Whilst we continue with two meetings per month (on the first and third Thursday each month) we take planning matters only on the second of these two meetings, along with guest speakers. We are totally committed to listening to the electorate and, to that end, we now have public participation sessions before the start of both meetings each month, rather than one as previously. We welcome your views. Important new Standing Orders have been adopted which encourage your Councillors to be as succinct and clear as possible in debate (for example, a time limit on a speech has been imposed). The extensive reorganisation of the administration and staffing of the office which took place last year has enabled us to offer an improved service to the visitor enquiries we receive.

I have structured this report under a number headings, as follows:-

#### Footpaths and Rights of Way

The "Walks in and Around Hayle" pack which we produced in conjunction with the Countryside Agency and Cornwall County Council is still available and is highly regarded.

In March I chaired a Hayle Parish Review meeting, looking at our public rights of way – Hayle being one of five pilot towns chosen for this important review of the Definitive Map of Cornwall.

We continue to strive to keep our footpaths clear of vegetation in conjunction with the County Council's local maintenance partnership.

#### Policing

We continue to maintain close liaison with our local community police officer who makes a report to the first Council meeting each month. As I am the Council's Police Liaison member I also attend the regular Devon and Cornwall Police Authority meetings which are held for the public in the Penwith area. We recently welcomed PC Burdaky as our new officer, replacing PC Sue Harrison. It is pleasing to report that our very strong requests for a higher level of policing have been heeded, and we will soon have four new "beat managers" covering our town.

Following very strong lobbying from your Council, a Traffic Warden was appointed last year, and she continues in post giving a very valuable service to the town.

#### Planning Issues

During the course of the year we have considered 180 planning applications and recommended the approval of 128 (71%), whilst recommending that 51 be not approved. On only 26 occasions (14%) were our recommendations not followed by the local planning authority – Penwith District Council.

We have considered several contentious applications, most notably there has been a proposal for residential development of the Hawkin's Garage Site, (withdrawn) a proposed Supermarket on the J & F Pool site (not approved by Penwith), a Metal Recycling Centre at Wheal Alfred (approved by County Council), the building of 24 houses on the old Slaughterhouse site at Guildford Road and, most recently, we considered the building of a Surestart facility on Commercial Road Car Park (deferred).

### Swimming Pool

Admissions to the Hayle Town Council Swimming Pool were up on last year to 4,235 providing an income of £4,131. A grant of £12,000 from Penwith District Council provided direct financial support. A number of community groups continue to use the facility and charity events, such as the annual Supasplash, are held here.

The newly established "Friends of Hayle Swimming Pool" has ambitious plans to enhance the facility, and I would like to thank them for their efforts to-date.

### Community Centre

Your Town Council owns and runs the Community Centre on Queensway. This valuable community resource is available for organisations within the town to hold meetings and continues to support its existing leaseholders. A Phase III development remains an aim of your Council which may provide a much needed Community Hall. The District Council intends to work jointly with us in order to provide an E-Government facility at this location. We continue to support the principle of bringing local government closer to the people that it serves.

### Grants and Donations

Hayle Town Council continues to support local organisations through grants via our Resource Committee.

During the last year we have awarded grants to the value of £4,164 and we are pleased to have supported the following organisations:- Blind at Sea, Friends of Medilinc, Association of Cornish Competition Paddlers, Hayle Heritage Group, Penwith District Council Foundry Phase I, Hayle Area Forum, Penwith Community Development Trust, DIVA Counselling Project, Marie Curie Cancer Care, Hayle Twinning Association, Friends of Hayle Swimming Pool, Hayle Youth Project.

Additionally, we are holding a special grant fund from which we hope to provide larger grants to enable the actual delivery of projects which are fully worked up.

### Hayle Harbour

A moment ago I listed some contentious planning matters which we have dealt with. Sadly, I am unable to include one for the Harbour area because an application, even though long promised and eagerly awaited, did not materialise.

We again find ourselves in a hiatus whilst ownership of the harbour becomes clear. Legal matters are ongoing which should clarify the position and the way forward.

Suffice to say for the moment that Penwith District Council has stated officially that the development of Hayle Harbour is their Number One priority, and that liaison with the townspeople will be done through your Town Council. We in turn will do everything in our power to move this forward.

I would add that Compulsory Purchase remains a live option once the ownership issue becomes clear.

I would also state again, as I attempted to last year, that we are fully committed to allowing full consultation and involvement of the community in shaping the plans for this vital area of the town. Once this has been done we can then speak with one voice, reflecting the majority wish in a proper, democratic manner.

### Harvey's Foundry Development

Last year I was pleased to announce the securing of the £2 Million funding to begin Phase One of this exciting project.

This year I am equally happy to be able to report that excellent progress has been made on the works related to this first phase, No. 24 Foundry Square, the old Harvey's Drawing Office. It is nearing completion and will be used as an archive building for Hayle, and an administration centre for the ongoing works related to the further phases of the development. Also nearing completion is the complex of smaller office units being constructed on Foundry Lane.

This flagship project is the catalyst for the long-awaited regeneration of our town – the scheme will highlight the tremendous importance of Hayle in engineering history. In only a few weeks from now the clock tower will again house a working clock, indicating that time is no longer standing still for Hayle.

Very much linked to this project is the Streetscape initiative, which in the coming year will be looking to enhance the environment of the whole of the town, creating a common theme throughout both the Foundry and Copperhouse areas.

This project has been brought to fruition by an extensive partnership group including the different levels of Council, funding partners, the RDA and community involvement.

#### West Cornwall Hospital

As Mayor, I represent your Council on the Mayors Parlour Group which is the lead body in the fight to retain and enhance services at West Cornwall Hospital. As a member of this group I also take every opportunity to raise the importance of St Michael's Hospital within the health provision in West Cornwall. In turn, I represent the Penwith Mayors on the West Cornwall Hospital Stakeholders Steering Group. This group is a joint working party of health service members and community members, looking at a Pilot Study of innovative ways of providing health services to populations in remoter parts of the County. This pilot study has a national profile and is being followed at Westminster. I cannot report any conclusions as yet as the study is at an early stage. I can, however, report that we, on the community side, have a clear view of the expectations of our local population and their health needs and we know that the community strongly voiced its views when 20,000 people marched through Penzance in support of 24 hour doctor-led Accident and Emergency services at West Cornwall Hospital.

#### Provision of Fire Cover

Last year I reported to you that the Town Council was pressing hard the case for Hayle to have our own Fire Station.

I am very pleased to report that County Council has had a number of Single Issue Panel meetings at which I, along with other Town Councillors, attended and spoke, and the result is that a full County Council meeting voted unanimously that Hayle requires our own Fire Station. A proviso was added – subject to funding – but it is my feeling that County's statutory duty is so clear that they now have the will to provide this facility, and we will have our own Fire Station within two years from now.

#### Provision of Skateboard Facilities

Your Town Council continues to be represented on the Hayle Skate Committee. The Council has agreed a site on our Recreation Ground

#### Links with other Organisations in the Town

The Hayle Area Forum – both the Mayor and the Deputy Mayor attend these meetings. The Forum recently announced that it had awarded grants totalling £30,200 to local organisations over the last five years. We will continue our strong involvement in the Forum, particularly in view of their developing Coastal and Market Town Initiative, which

is a scheme aimed at producing a cohesive overall strategy for the future developments of the town. We also continue to hold liaison meetings between the Council and the Chamber of Commerce. These meetings are very useful in promoting understanding between our business people and their elected representatives.

Another highly pleasing partnership has been the successful development of the Britain in Bloom Committee. The Town Council instigated the formation of this Committee with a specific intention to have it develop as a community group rather than yet another Council Committee. This aim has succeeded more than we ever could have hoped.

The Britain in Bloom group and the Council were together involved in marking the Queen's Golden Jubilee by the creation of the Jubilee Isis Garden. I must specifically thank the Hayle Town Gardeners from Penwith District Council, and Mr Richard Selby-Boothroyd, Chairman of Britain in Bloom for the wonderful efforts of all involved.

Her Majesty the Queen's Golden Jubilee was marked by the Council in a number of other ways. I held a painting competition for local school children and residents, the winning entries being printed as congratulation cards and, after being displayed in the Library, were sent to Her Majesty. The overall winner, painted by a young man named Louis Stevens, was used as the Town Council's Christmas Card. The famous artist John Miller was kind enough to assist me in judging the competition, and he provided the first prize, one of his own original works. A reception for the winners and an exhibition of the other entries was held at Passmore Edwards institute, and Mr Miller attended to present the prizes. Sadly, Mr. Miller died in July last year. I feel privileged to have known him.

A Lady in Waiting of the Queen sent a gracious letter relaying Her Majesty's thanks to the people of Hayle, This letter now resides on the Town Clerk's office wall.

In continuing a Royal theme, I was pleased to receive His Royal Highness Prince Andrew on his visit to boring tool manufacturer Rigibore, in September. The company, based at Guildford Road Industrial Estate, won a prestigious award from the Institution of Mechanical Engineers for engineering excellence.

The Town Council was pleased to host a Joint Reception for our twinning friends from Pordic and for the Dewhellans Homecoming. This Annual Report to Electors details just some of the main activities carried out by your Council in the last twelve months. There are many other day-to-day duties which are dealt with by your Town Clerk, Vivien Parsons, and her staff.

In compiling this report I am reminded of what a tremendously active civic year we have just experienced. This year will be historically significant as the time of the War in Iraq, and as that of the Queen's Golden Jubilee. I hope and believe that it will be historic for our town as the start of the resurgence of Hayle. As I often say, I feel that Hayle has the greatest potential of any town in Cornwall, and with the Foundry Development nearing completion of Phase One, the agreement and acknowledgement of our need for a Fire Station, and even our Britain in Bloom success, we are actually making real strides towards a more successful future. Hayle is not just about the Harbour. Yes, we must have a vibrant harbour area, and will continue to push for this, however we need to recognise other successes and relay these to people from other towns so that Hayle is seen in the positive light it deserves."

We now offer concessionary tickets if you are on one of the benefits below:-

- Housing Benefit
- Jobseekers Allowance
- Working Families Tax Credit
- Disabled Person's Tax credit
- Income Support

You must come in and show the evidence and we will change your library ticket. Concessionary users are entitled to one hour free and can extend free use by two further half hour sessions if no other customers are waiting. You will also be entitled to reduced fines.

All customers must pay for printing, black and white 10p a sheet and colour 50p.

### E-Daily

Hayle Library was the first place in Great Britain to have an e-daily touch screen computer installed and by the end of 2004 there should be 15,000 across the country. Backed by Penwith District Council, Jim McKenna said "I see it as a significant step forward to

providing vital information free of charge to our most rural communities."

At the touch of a screen you will be able to locate local businesses and services such as plumbers, builders, late night chemists and hotels, and find out about Penwith Support Organisations such as hospices and counselling services. You will also be able to investigate a diverse range of topics such as medical conditions, dealing with school bullies or even search for a new job without leaving your local community. At a later date it is also hoped there will be tourist information available for visitors to our area. E-daily will also connect you to your local community and national government. ## The Forum Story

Each of the nine SRB2 towns in Cornwall set up a Forum as a local consultation body for projects in their town. These bodies were drawn from a wide cross section of the local community, including local businesses and the voluntary sector as well as elected members from local authorities. Each Forum received Community Development funding to support their administration, and was also given a small delegated fund called the Community Fund, initially £2,000pa, increasing as capacity grew. Forums could use this funding to support local community projects that were felt to contribute directly or indirectly to the town's

economic vitality. Over the past five years Hayle Forum gave grants totalling £30,225, but sadly the funding has now come to an end. This 'capacity building' experience has led to Hayle being amongst the first wave of the SRB2 towns to enter the RDA's 'Market & Coastal Towns' programme, which is intended to spread these benefits still further within the town and surrounding communities.

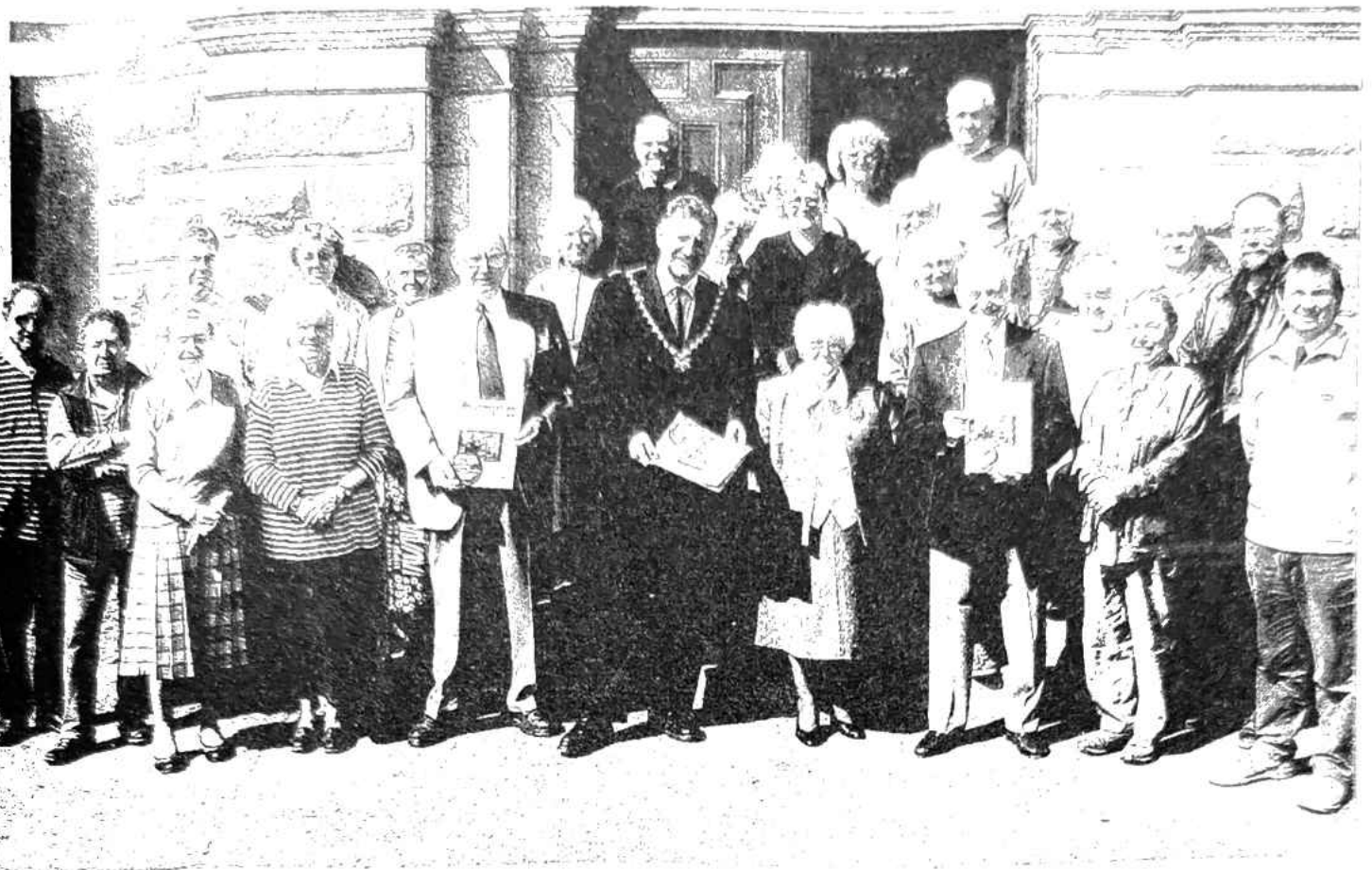

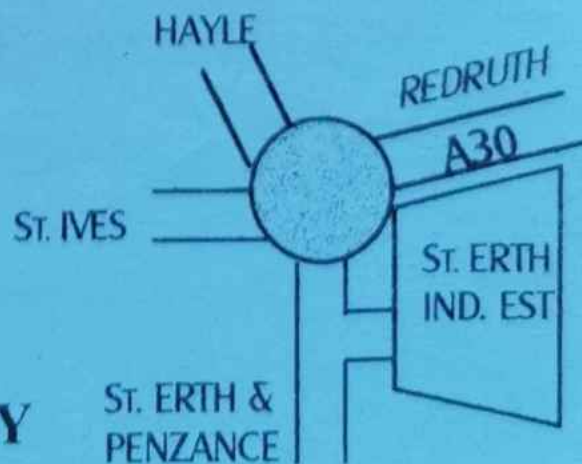
