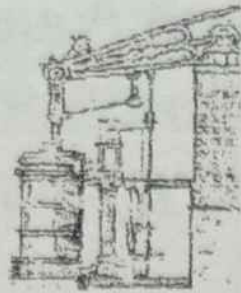
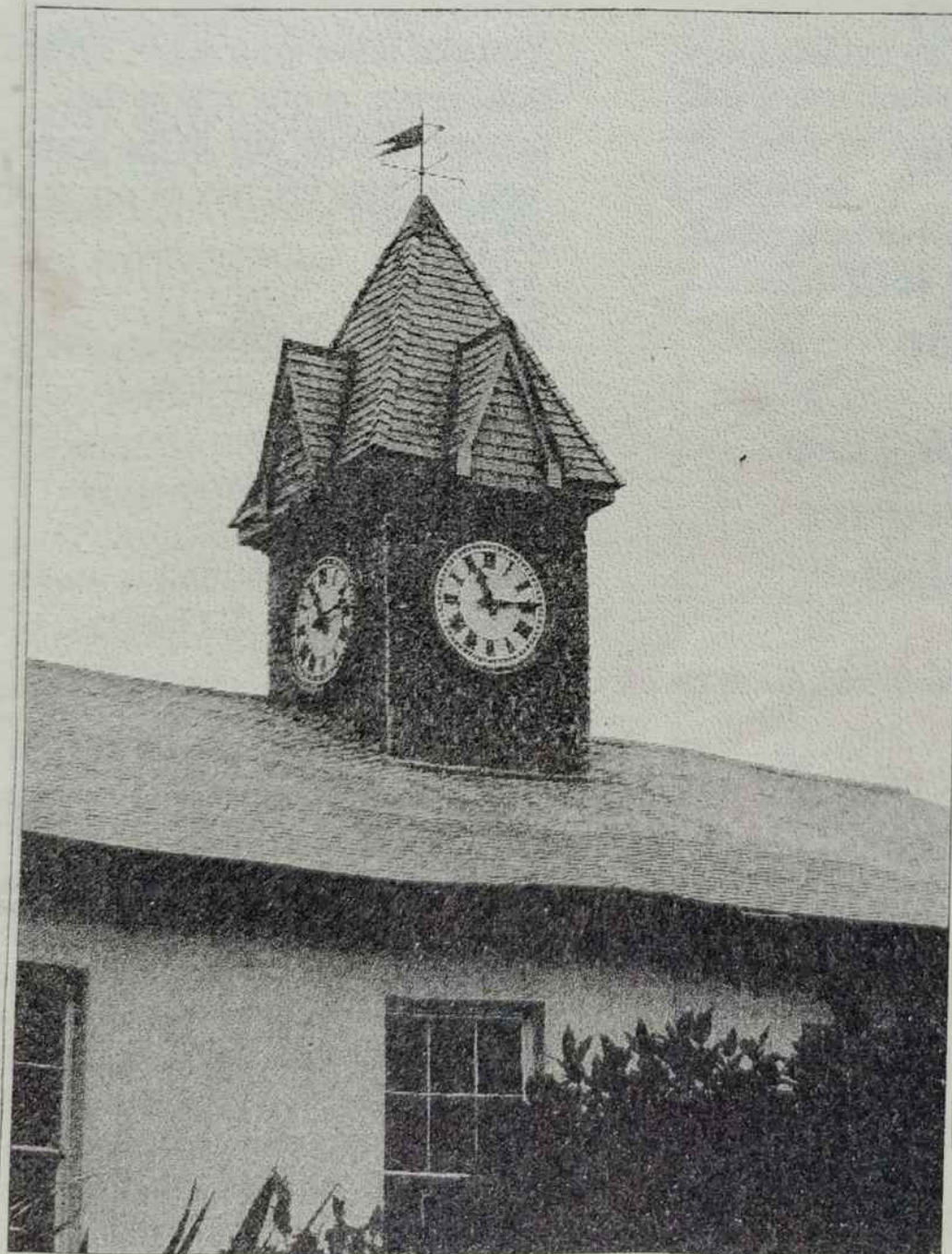

## Some Plodding Good News From the Police.

In response to popular demand, our neighbourhood beat managers are in place. These policemen will be out and about patrolling the streets, and helping to make our town a better and safer place to live.

PC 4823 Luke Cox is responsible for South Ward, which covers The Pathway Fields, Hayle School, Harvey's Way, Queensway and Trevithick

Crescent.

PC5080 Darren Burdaky's beat is the North Ward, which is Copperhouse, Penpol Road, Commercial Road and Phillack.

PC5576 Marc Blyth has the West Ward which is St. Erth, St. Hilary and Goldsithney.

PC5582 Phil Rowland patrols the East Ward, consisting of Conner Downs, Reawla, Wall, Gwithian and Angarrack.

The idea is that the public is reassured by the sight of familiar faces, they have a point of contact and the police can build up trust and confidence. They will be predominately foot patrols, with a high visibility impact.

There are plans to have Community Police Surgeries and Drop-in Advice Centres, possible venues being Carew House, Passmore Edwards Institute and maybe Connor Downs W.I. Hall, other venues are being arranged.

## KIND OF CORNISH

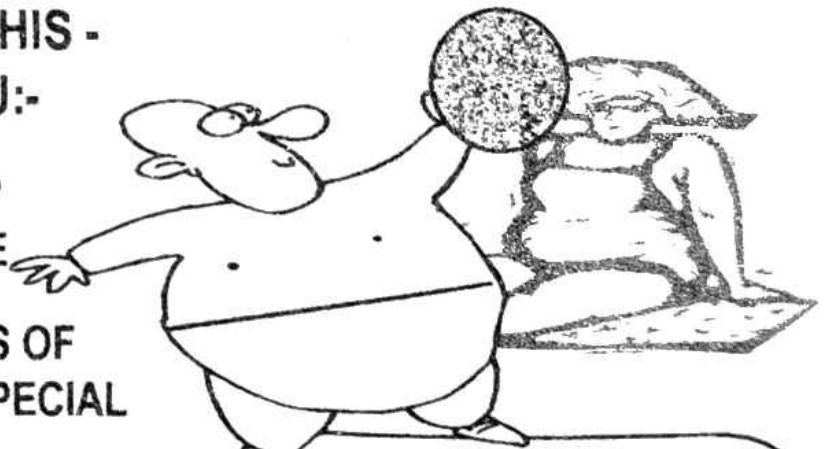


A few months ago I reviewed a couple of recent CDs featuring Benjamin Luxon as a narrator, an alternative career he has pursued since illness unfortunately caused him to give up singing some years ago. A recent reissue on Decca's British Music made in the 70s and featuring Benjamin's baritone at the height of his singing powers gives a timely reminder of what we have been miss-

ing. "Victorian and Edwardian Ballads" is an enchanting 2CD set featuring mainly well-known material. The first CD features Benjamin Luxon, accompanied by David Willison on piano, and the second CD features another singer with Cornish connections, Felicity Palmer, accompanied by pianist John Constable. Highlights include Benjamin Luxon's inimitable version of 'The Floral Dance', also 'The Holy City', 'Rose of Tralee', 'Bless this House' and numerous other ballads. Felicity Palmer's beautiful soprano is featured singing, amongst others, 'Love's Old Sweet Song', 'Love, Here is my Heart' and 'I'll Walk Beside You', the latter title also appearing on the Luxon CD. ### IT'S A KINDA MAGIC, MAGIC

Greetings fellow townspeople, well as you may have noticed we're just putting the finishing touches to our latest new baby, **Take Me Home**. We're just across the road from the Co-op and hopefully you'll like what we have done to the former Newells Travel Shop at 2 Market Square.

The main inspiration for the deli and coffee shop was a visit back in March to the Cornish Food and Drink Exhibition. On that occasion my better half and I were overwhelmed by the breadth of fantastic products being produced by many artisan food makers in all parts of Cornwall and the British Isles. We spoke to many of them and they were all in agreement that because of their size they were

unable to get into the Safeway's and Tescos, and where else do you sell a single Cornish Blue Cheese in small quantities when you own a farm in Liskeard?

Our hope is to introduce you to some of these little suppliers and see what you think. The results are in the eating. We have sourced a single producer of crisps in Herefordshire, the owner told me he got so angry at the price the big multiples were willing to pay him for his potatoes that he decided to fry and bag his own. We met a man from a little island in the Hebrides, he hand-makes the most amazing shortbread and chocolate gingers. If you're sick of fizzy chemical tasting beverages a cool glass of Helston Creek Apple Juice is a real thirst quencher.

Wherever possible we are going to source our cheese, meats, breads, fruit, vegetables and fish from Cornwall. At the Foundry Bar we currently use 80% of Cornish manufactured products. Sometimes local costs more. But I'm sure you will agree that small producers have an inherent pride in the food they produce, you can taste the difference. If you don't believe me then read Mr Rick Stein's "Food Heroes".

We are opening from 9am and will carry on till at least 5, but probably stay on till later if the sun's shining. We'll open 7 days a week so if you're stuck on Sunday for some food ideas you'll find something to whip up even if it's just smoked Camel Valley turkey with a green salad, Hazelphron mixed pickle and a wedge of organic granary bread from Blue Mango in Redruth.

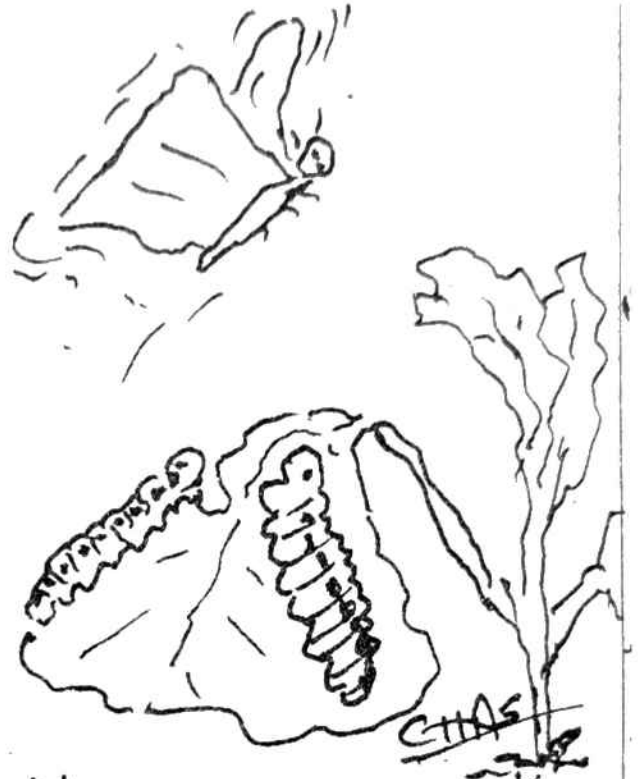
So there we have it. A little crazy, a little different but by the number of people who asked me when we're opening I think it's just what Hayle needs.

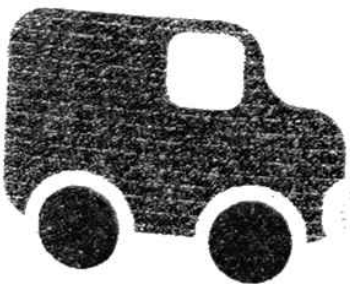

# TENTH HAYLE HERITAGE FESTIVAL – 2003



## *Saturday*

The Methodist Hall was a very good venue for the interesting opening event to this year's Hayle Heritage Festival. This was an exhibition by the Old Cornwall Society of photographs, documents and artefacts of our historical past.

arrived in mid/late June than we start to see our early autumn migrants returning – in July! Thus, although I'm pretty certain the arrival of three redshank on 6<sup>th</sup> July were the first of the autumn (last of the spring birds were back in May) I'm not so sure about the six dunlin and a curlew sandpiper in Carnsew Basin on 22<sup>nd</sup> June. Whatever, the latter species is always a good bird to see at any time, more so in June when it should have been sitting on a nest in arctic Siberia!

Only two pairs of shelduck appear to have been successful this year (with broods of 4 and 9 on Lelant Water) but if anybody sees any others perhaps they could let me know. They will soon be joined by flocks of wigeon back from Iceland for the autumn/winter and at this point I would like to remind those with boats/jet skis/canoes etc. to please keep out of the main estuary, Lelant Water, to prevent disturbing them. This is arguably the most important part of the whole site and the birds really don't appreciate being flushed – and neither do the birders who come to watch them or the residents overlooking the area from Lelant. I know most of you do not enter into this "Sanctuary Area" so thank you for your continued cooperation.

To end on a different note – have you seen the hummingbird hawk-moths this year? They really do look just like diminutive hummingbirds as they hover in front of flower-heads to take nectar. *Dave Flumm, RSPB*

As usual we have been very busy here at the bureau and this week we have had many requests for help in Hayle. Perhaps you might be able to help out with one of them.

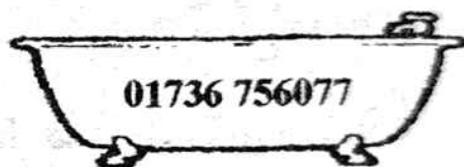

**PENWITH RECYCLING**

The following is a talk given by Mr Mike Toms, when he was a guest speaker at a recent meeting of the Hayle Area Forum.

"There is no questioning the fact that Penwith was a poor performer, but with a change of attitude and statutory government targets recycling is now a priority, and it is our ambition to be the best in the South West and in the top national quartile within 4 years. One of our actions to realise this ambition is to introduce the collection of recyclables at kerbside, and in fact this scheme, collecting papers and magazines, food and drinks cans and textiles was first trialled in Hayle:-

October 2002 – jumped from 5,000

to 26,000+ using a sack collection system.

March 2003 – introduced boxes and added the collection of glass.

The sack system was collecting 25 tonnes per week. The box system has already reached 45 tonnes per week and the system is not yet complete! We have almost completed the box delivery and soon we will be issuing the communal recycling wheeled bins to blocks of flats etc. There will be one wheeled bin for each material and this system will be easy for the elderly to deposit a few items at a time.

It is not enough to just offer a service and then sit back and allow people to make up their own minds

whether they want to participate or not, in fact the hardest work is still ahead. Andy Tanner of Smiletribe has been going around all the schools in the district preaching the gospel according to “reduce, reuse, recycle” and the Bash Street Theatre Company have been doing plays in some of our schools about the “Enviromen” who are coming to save the planet! We are also employing a Temporary Recycling Officer to conduct doorstep interviews, in the low participation areas especially, to find out why some people are not recycling.

Kerbside is not the only recycling service, and we are always looking to increase the number of recycling bring sites around the

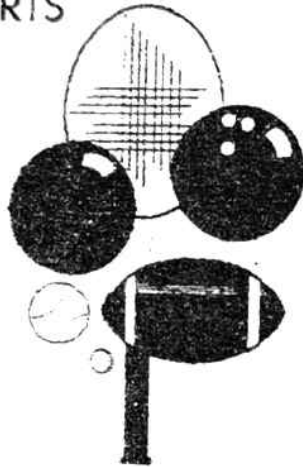

area. We now offer recycling banks on campsites and the green waste skips are a very important service during the gardening season, also the bulky waste collection service means that many household items are either reused or broken up for recycling. Many items are removed from street sweepings for recycling. Another measure we have taken is to restrict the number of wheeled bins per property to one, we do not accept side waste any more. No garden waste is allowed in the wheeled bin and I will be keeping a very close eye on trade waste being illegally disposed of, either in litter bins, domestic wheeled

bins or fly tipped.

In short what is essential is that the public need to go through a major habit change. It is no longer acceptable to just throw everything into your wheeled bin which then goes to landfill. Drink driving and now smoking is viewed as unacceptable, and even dog fouling I'm pleased to say seems to be joining that category. *Discarding valuable materials into landfill must be viewed in the same light!*

## DOES THE MOON AFFECT THE WEATHER?

**Many people argue that the phases of the Moon affect our weather, despite there being no scientific evidence to support these theories.** Tides, however, are directly affected by the gravitational pull of the Moon as well as the Sun, with spring tides occurring at New and Full Moon, when the forces are 90 degrees in phase with the Earth.

The appearance of the Moon, though, can be a guide to the present and the future weather in the short-term. A sharply outlined Moon indicates lack of cloud cover and thus the land will radiate its heat, temperatures will fall significantly and in winter, for example,

this can lead to the formation of frost and fog.

Much "weather lore" is associated with the Moon, and generally has some credence. For instance; "If the Moon rises haloed round, soon you'll tread on flooded ground". The type of cloud on the advancing edge, of a warm front which brings rain, tends to give the Moon a halo. These conditions exist about six hours, before the rain starts.

Perhaps the most reliable piece of weather folklore regarding the Moon is; "The Moon and the weather may change together, but a change in the Moon does not change the weather."

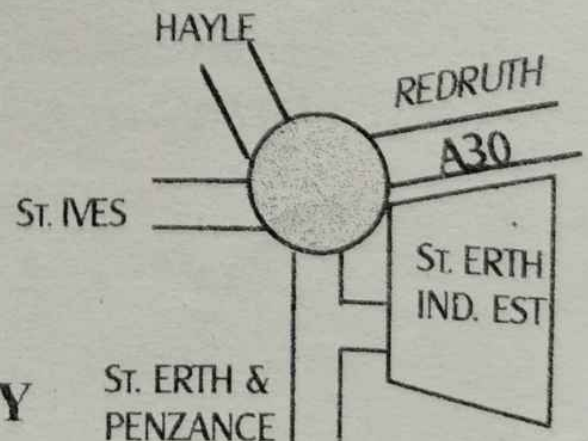
