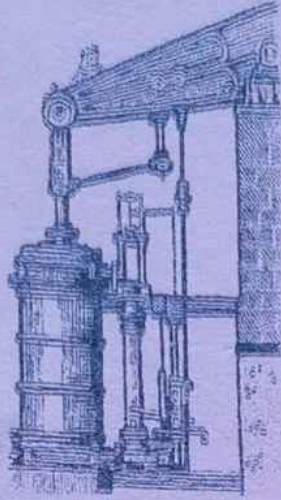

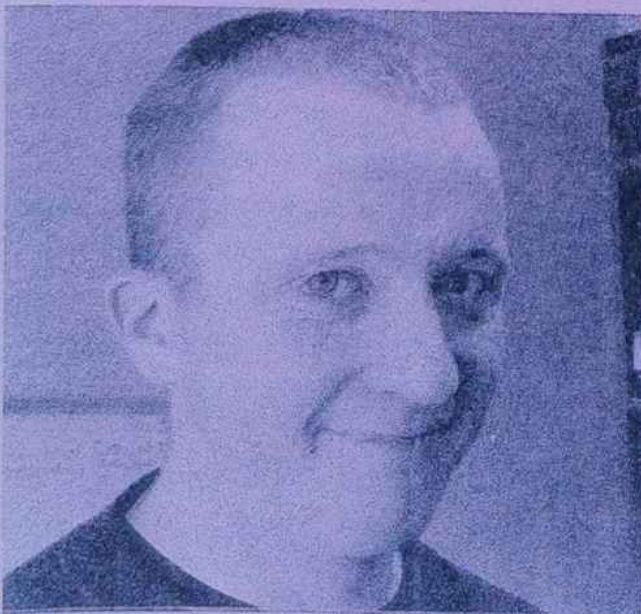

## *The Gambia Revisited...*

Ground temperature at Gatwick was minus 1c and just six hours later, as the pilot began his descent into Banjul International Airport, he announced that the temperature was 34c – a difference of 35 degrees.

So began another wonderful visit to the Gambia. We visited schools in Banjul, Brikama and Marakissa as well as clinics and outlying villages, taking with us all the items so generously donated. The difficult journeys were made by bush taxis or in the vehicle loaned to us by the Methodist Church.

We spent four days 'up river' on McCarthy Island- some 300 miles inland – a journey which takes many hours due to inhospitable roads and tracks. It was great to meet up again with our friends in Janjanbureh, and visit our newly completed Nursery School in Banni on the north bank of the river.

On the Sunday we organised a meal, at the camp where we stayed, for everyone who attended the morning service – over one hundred adults and children.

Meeting the sixty youngsters, whose education is sponsored by people in Cornwall and beyond, was an important part of our visit. The progress made by these young people, who are so eager to learn, is outstanding.

I would like to extend my thanks to all the people in Hayle who have helped the work of 'West Cornwall

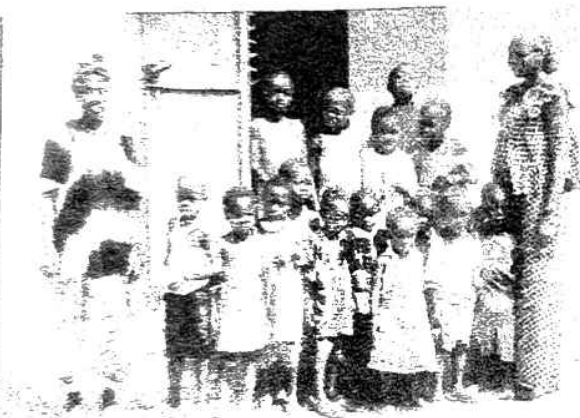
## Foreign Currency on Demand from Copperhouse Post Office.

Copperhouse Post Office has now become an On Demand Bureau De Change.

This means customers will be able to come in and buy their foreign currency and travellers' cheques there and then, completely commission free. They will be able to sell back any surplus currency when they return, also without any commission charge.

Simon and Chrissy Coles who took over the business last October say "We are really enjoying the challenges that our new business is giving us. All the customers have been incredibly welcoming and supportive during our settling-in period and now we feel a little more established we are trying to offer increased choice and facilities, both on the retail side with an ever expanding range of greetings cards, gifts and stationery and with the services the Post Office can offer.

Although customers have always been able to pre-order currency with a next day delivery, we have been increasingly receiving requests for the option to be able to buy immediately over the counter, so we have decided to take on that extra role. We will be holding a supply of Euros and US Dollars, both in notes and travellers cheques and will continue to offer the facility to pre-order most other currencies for next day collection. We hope this will be more convenient for the Hayle community and save the necessity of a journey to one of the larger towns to obtain foreign currency."

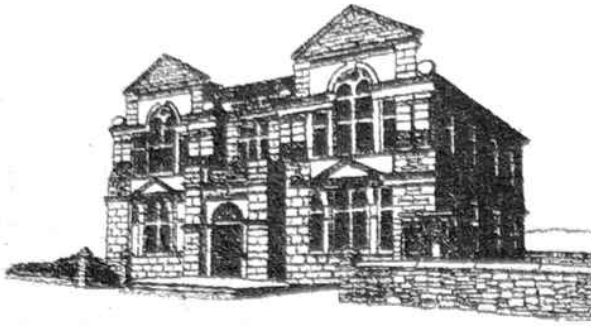

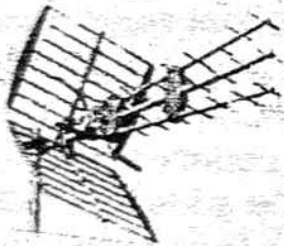

our local delicacy, the pasty. Laura, though, will not express an opinion as to her favourite. "They're all delicious – I'm just going to have to go easy on them!" she says.

Laura comes to Hayle after several years working on regeneration projects in run-down parts of Birmingham as well as in ex-mining and steel working areas of South Yorkshire – all very relevant to Hayle with its own industrial heritage. "You can't push regeneration on a community" says Laura. "People hold different views and have strong convictions about the future of their town, wherever it is. My job is to work with the people, not against them, and to encourage them to have their say. In the first instance I'm here to listen, and then to work with the people towards the best possible solution." If this sounds like politics, then perhaps it is, and Laura is no stranger to that world, having worked in Brussels - at the heart of the European Union - for some time. "It was great experience" she confirms, though she adds that she was glad to leave the Euro hothouse behind.

Laura's immediate task relates to Phase Two of the Regeneration Project, that is, to the Stables.

East Stables will have three live/work units where local artists and craftsmen/women will be able to live "above the shop" and contribute to an exciting and profitable attraction which will play an important part in the development of the Foundry area.

The West Stables which, it is hoped, will be completed this summer, will comprise ten workshops around a courtyard; the Trust is looking for a high quality mix of local busi-

nesses to complete this stage of the project.

Phase Three, the museum, is still largely at the "twinkle in the eye" stage, but an artefacts acquisition group has been at work for a while and already has items from the town's industrial past – engineering, mining, smelting – to form the basis of the proposed exhibition. Most excitingly, the Trust has a promise from the Science Museum in South Kensington to return to Hayle the Carpalla Beam Pumping Engine which weighs thirty tons and was made by Harvey's in 1863. This, it is hoped, will form a splendid centre-piece for the new museum.

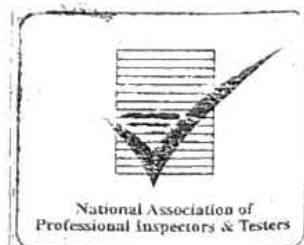

One very cold and windy day last October my mum and I headed off to Camborne to start training as **Marine Mammal Medics!**

We live on the Towans so are in a perfect spot to see dolphins and seals as they cruise around St. Ives Bay. No qualifications are needed to become a medic, just a desire to help these beautiful creatures.

The training day was split into two parts. In the morning we had talks from our local co-ordinator Dave Jarvis and a video showing all the work BDMLR do. There then followed several more presentations on Marine Mammal Biology, Physiology, first aid and rescue techniques for cetaceans and seals plus health and safety for us- the Medics- as well.

The morning was spent in some anticipation of what the afternoon was to bring – we had been promised that we would be in the water ALL afternoon. We headed off to Carbis Bay as this was thought to be the most sheltered from the huge winds – but I would have hated to see what the rest of Cornwall looked like. It was freezing with **MASSIVE WAVES.**

We arrived, wetsuits in hand, smiles on our faces, to find the BDMLR team climbing into their 'Dry

We were taught how to handle and lift an injured or stranded seal or dolphin using life-sized models and then we had to refloat a two tonne life-sized model of a Pilot Whale! As we were doing it, members of the public were coming along taking photographs and showing a lot of sympathy for the poor dolphins and the whale in particular! It made us all laugh.

After everyone was dry again, we had a final de-briefing at which time certificates, Medic ID cards and

badges were handed out, over a cup of hot chocolate for me, but I'm sure the others had something a little stronger!

So thank you BDMIR for a great day of training; we can highly recommend the course to EVERYONE with a love of the sea and the creatures that live there.

Since completing the course we have assisted with several seal rescues and recently when we found a dead porpoise on the beach in front of our house it was great to know who to call to look after it rather than just leaving it to loll about in the waves and be pecked by the seagulls. Dave constantly keeps in touch by texting us when he has a message from the St. Ives team saying the dolphins are heading our way – it is fabulous to be involved with such a wonderful charity.

It's a great life if you don't weaken!

### **Plants on the Towans No. 11 - Gorse**

The smell and colour of this plant are both wonderful, especially when there is so little colour about in winter. It seems these days that gorse is flowering in all seasons but in fact there are three varieties in this species, two of which grow on the Towans. They have different flowering periods and this is compounded

by the changes in climate to create the illusion. They are *Ulex Europaeus* also called Furze (the big one) and *Ulex Gallii*, also called Planch or Western Gorse (smaller). There is also a hybrid of the two and the variety we don't have - *Ulex Minor* (Dwarf Gorse or Roth).

A good stand of Furze can be seen below the banks around the Hayle Cricket Club – a great spot for balls to hide- and lots on the fringes of Mexico, Phillack and Upton Towans, away from the sea.

I have found no references to this plant as a medical herb but my own investigation found it to have healing properties in the earth element (the colour is a clue) the officials of which are the stomach and spleen/pancreas.

If you have the patience of Job you

can make wine with the flowers, otherwise enjoy the amazing colour and smell – have fun!

## 1900 Hayle Squadron (Air Cadets) comes of Age

In January 2004, 77 Hayle detached flight had a total cadet strength of thirteen and was probably the smallest unit in the country.

However, with the great support of our parent unit, 77 Redruth squadron, Hayle cadets started to get involved in many activities, such as the Boscastle to Looe cross-Cornwall walk, the South Wales three peaks challenge and the Brec trek. In May of 2004, Hayle had their first taste of success, with cadet Richard Cook winning the south west region Golden Putter award. Hayle also contributed some cadets to a combined team with Redruth squadron for the wing athletics championship, winning the

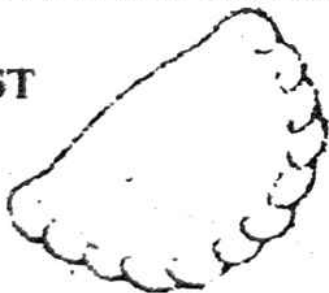
event across the board. By this time the detached flight had grown to twenty in number.

Probably the biggest turning point of the year came when Hayle Community School allowed the unit onto the campus during their activities week. Cadets from Hayle and Redruth combined forces again to provide activities for over one hundred Year 8 students over the course of two days. The following week saw nearly thirty new recruits through the door. Hayle was now big enough to have its own squadron, but before squadron status could be granted the unit had to hold on to over thirty cadets for more than 12 months to prove itself worthy.

That summer a challenge was laid down to the cadets to walk the 192 miles across the entire breadth of England. The walk crossed the Lake

District, The Yorkshire Dales, and the North York Moors, and five enterprising cadets took up the challenge, four from Redruth and one from Hayle.

The rest of the year was spent training what was then a very inexperienced group of young people in how to behave and act like air cadets. This meant a great deal of hard work which, however, paid off when cadet Will Ivey won the Cornwall Aviation Society Trophy for the best exam result in the county for 2004. All in all, 2004 was a very productive year for Hayle, and a very hard year to live up to in 2005.

Now, with thirty five cadets, Hayle was much better able to stand on its own feet; however the unit was still very inexperienced and a lot of work was needed.

The unit was entered into the 10 Tors event in 2005, but after several weekend training sessions, inexperience unfortunately took its toll on the event itself, and in terrible conditions, the team withdrew on Tor 3. This was a small blow for squadron morale, but valuable lessons were learnt and the unit had the wing athletics competition to look forward to again. This time Hayle entered a team in its own right, and managed to record a very respectable 5<sup>th</sup> place, behind the four established squadrons in the wing. Our parent unit Redruth was overall winner again. During the Easter and summer periods 3 AEF (Air Experience Flight) squadron came down to St Mawgan to provide cadets with flying experience. Hayle filled all its allocated slots and was given spare slots that other units could not fill; by the end of the summer, every cadet

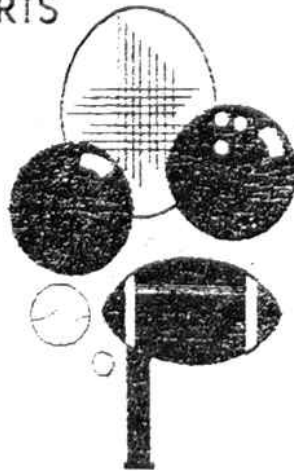

**At last, the days are getting longer!** Despite a belated beginning, spring seems to be on its way, and with it come a few small changes at the library.

Firstly, if anyone has been trying to get through to us on the phone, and been intercepted, don't worry! Cornwall Library Information Service are now answering all calls, and are there to help if they can, by answering queries and renewing books. However, if you still want to speak to one of us, it is possible for them to transfer you.

Secondly there is an alteration to the procedure when signing-in to a library computer. We're asking all PC users to bring their library cards with them; you will need this and a personalised four digit pin code that we will issue you with (always the same one), in order to log in. Time allowance and charges remain the same.

As many of you already know, the Unicard for Cornwall and Cornish Key Card (Gold Card) means free bus travel for pensioners and people with

certain disabilities throughout Cornwall from April 1<sup>st</sup>. If you don't already have either of these cards, do call to check details, or visit us to apply. You will need proof of age, likeness and address (a photographic driving licence is perfect as it has all three). A small plea from us – if it's at all possible, we'd really appreciate not processing applications on Saturday mornings, as there are fewer library staff and more people, and you may meet a very frazzled- looking Library Assistant!

Our housebound service is running well so please talk to us if you are interested. If you are in the library, please don't hesitate to ask if you can't find what you're looking for. Remember you can make a reservation for 50p or 70p if we don't have the item in stock.

Under the new NHS sponsored scheme, selected Health titles from the *Books on Prescription* list are currently available to reserve free of charge if prescribed by your GP. Ask us for more details.

There will be no Story Circle over the Easter holidays, (they will resume as usual on 24<sup>th</sup> April) but the popular lute player Ben Falfield will be joining us for an evening of entertainment on Thursday May 18<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm. Please enquire about tickets.

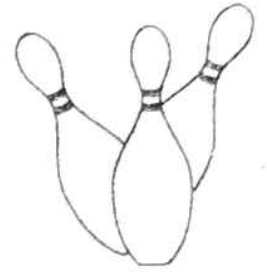

## WRVS MEALS ON WHEELS HAYLE DISTRICT

The WRVS Meals on Wheels scheme in the Hayle area is now one of our largest schemes in Cornwall. It operates over 5 days each week and provides a hot lunch-time meal each day at minimal cost.

WRVS purchase meals from our local supplier, who provides the meal for collection at 11.45am each day. The meals are cooked each morning using fresh produce, locally produced where possible, to the WRVS specification which defines the content, weight, calorific and nutritional values.

The main meal is provided in a 3 compartment foil container heated to 80°C to ensure the meal is delivered

at not less than 65°C. In general terms the meal is divided equally between protein, (meat or fish), vegetables, (two or three different sorts) and potato. This main meal is followed by a pudding, which may be hot or cold.

Delivery is undertaken by a dedicated team of WRVS volunteers led by Jess Benney our local organiser. Each volunteer is a registered member of WRVS and as such has undergone a stringent CRB check helping to ensure that the meal is delivered by a responsible and caring person.

Often the meal delivery is to elderly and/or infirm recipients, and during the course of the delivery the volunteers make simple discreet checks to ensure that the recipient is safe and well. In the event of there being a problem of any sort, the Area office is

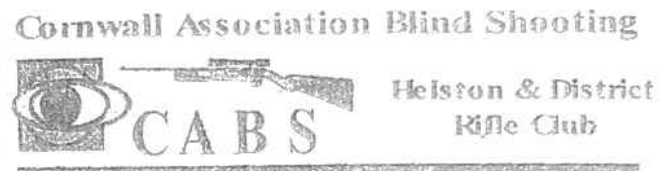

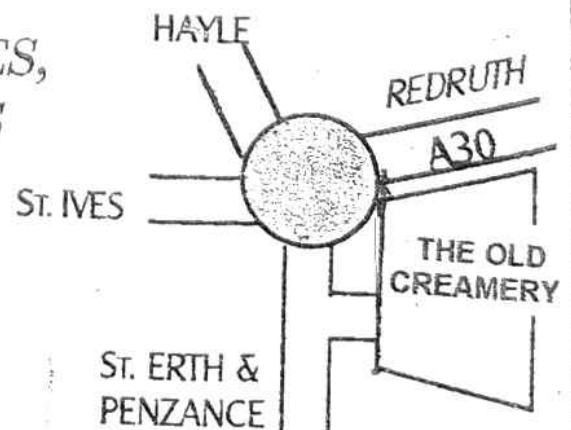

## Them Out There!

Having spent four years in the rather rarefied atmosphere of my health shop, where many people who came in were extremely well informed about natural options and others interested to learn more, I had a bit of an awakening about how, apparently, uninformed the vast majority are when a kind friend invited me to watch a recording of a natural health programme which had gone out on television. So depending what you want to achieve, you can safely use a variety of remedies together. It was a very interesting programme and I am delighted to see natural health getting a bit more of a positive hearing in the mass media.

More good news; my homeopath Dave Masters will be working in the Back Pain Clinic in Hayle from 4<sup>th</sup> April. Long before I started my shop homeopathy was an interest of mine as I believe it is an amazingly subtle means of triggering the body to help itself, the finest healing there is. Dave is one of the most versatile exponents of the art (science?) and draws on a vast range of substances for his remedies. Whereas remedies you choose yourself tend to address specific symptoms, Dave takes your whole history into account and looks for a remedy that will address the underlying causes of your symptoms so conditions which may have existed for years can be turned around.

Fairtrade goods have also been getting a bit of an airing recently, and of course many of you have been buying these for years from your healthfoods supplier. I have now typed up a specific list of Fairtrade products to make it easier to identify them; this is available to anyone who would like it, also a big list of goods available from my wholesalers in Cornwall.
