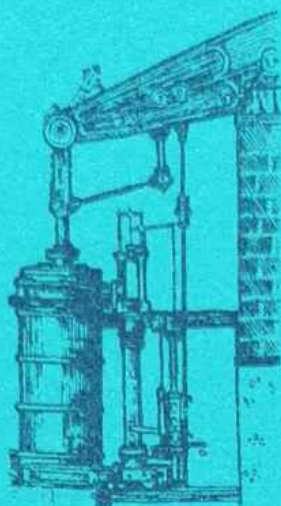

It was a cold night but there was a big turnout at the Day Care Centre where we were entertained by Hayle Town Band, Praze Hayle Male Choir and 4 talented dancers called 'Streetbeat'. Once again the lights look superb and I would like to thank all the volunteers who erect them. I would also like to thank all of those people who give generously to the lights by putting money in the collection tins and those businesses who sponsor a light display or allow the use of their electricity.

Another group who deserve a special mention for their hard work once again this year is the Britain in Bloom team. They did a brilliant job working with Brian Hosken and his gardeners in getting the town looking absolutely fantastic. In September they received a Gold Award in their category for the South West in Bloom and then went to Coventry for the national results for the first time and picked up a Silver Award. Their Chairman, Marjorie Roberts also picked up an award for her work.

This year saw the opening of Marks and Spencer and Costa Coffee who both seem to be doing very well for trade.

well-earned rest if that's possible.

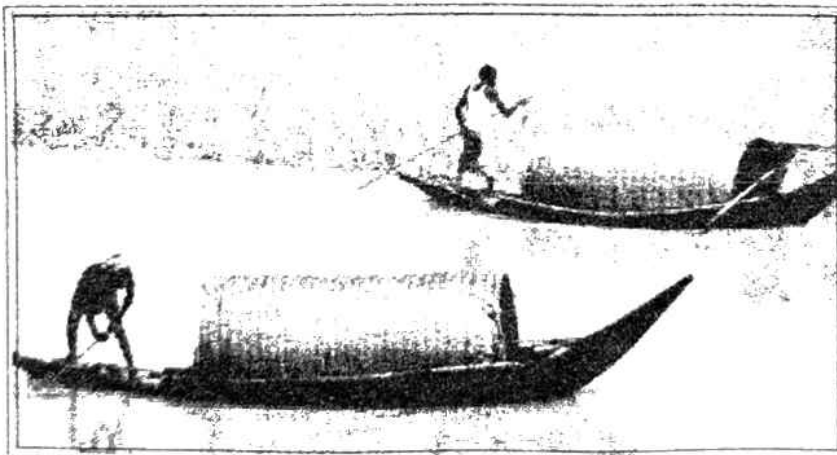

*KIND OF
CORNISH*



As I have more than a passing interest in the first CD to be reviewed this month, Martin Nunes has volunteered to act as guest reviewer:-

"Kris Gayle's last CD released in 2004 was taken from various live duo gigs with pianist Viv Rodd, and as I said in my review at the time was as good a vocal jazz record as I had heard that year.

Kris and Viv's new CD "8.00 am" is altogether far more ambitious; it was recorded at Damian Rodd's studio in Falmouth with an impressive line-up including some very talented locally based guest musicians, coupled with the latest synthesiser technology used to amazing effect. From the opening bars of the first track, Blue in Green by Bill Evans, I knew that the album was going to be something very special. The greatest compliment I can pay to Kris is that it compared favourably with the original vocal version by the great Cassandra Wilson, albeit with a completely different arrangement.

Then comes Michel Legrand's 'Watch What Happens', one of his most rhythmic themes, done superbly. The beautiful and haunting Rodgers and Hart ballad 'It Never Entered My Mind' follows and is given a rendition of feeling and emotion that very few singers can convey.

Kris's amazing versatility is shown by

a complete change of mood in the next two numbers, the catchy 'I'm All Smiles' and Cannonball Adderley's gospel-tinged 'Sermonette'. Miles Davis is represented by 'All Blues' with some great quirky soprano sax from Paul Haywood who is also featured on several other tracks. The title track '8.00am' was written by Viv Rodd with lyrics by Kris herself. A great slow number with some tricky chord changes and a fine tenor sax solo from Marc Hadley.

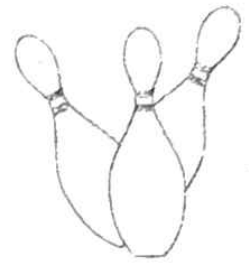
'The Song is You' and 'Gravy Waltz' are followed by 'Bird Tribute', a compilation of 3 songs including Charlie 'Bird' Parker's 'Ornithology', which Kris scats wordlessly, effectively arranged and linked together by the Hayle Pump's own Goudie Charles.

One of the most poignant love songs ever written is Leonard Bernstein's 'Some Other Time' from the musical 'On The Town'. I've never heard this sung with such emotion and had a lump in my throat when it finished. However Kris then quickly changes the mood with a great swinging arrangement of 'I'm Old Fashioned' to finish the CD.

As always the playing of Hayle-born Viv Rodd never ceases to amaze me – he is one of the most imaginative piano and keyboard players I have ever heard. Equally impressive is Viv's son Damian Rodd, who apart from recording and mixing the album also played bass and drums on many tracks, as well as doing some of the marvellous orchestrations.

I have now listened to this CD on several occasions and every time it finishes I feel like applauding. Kris was described by Humphrey Lyttelton on his BBC jazz programme as 'Cornwall's best kept secret'. The new album is a real tour de force and we should let the

strumentals, for example 'King of the Fairies' and 'The Blackbird'. Others are vocals, such as 'Johnny Lad' and 'The Parting Glass', with one number 'T'aim Cortha...' bravely and brilliantly sung unaccompanied, partly in Irish. The one non-traditional song on the album is 'Charlie's Come Home', a lovely song written by Sarah, which to me had distant echoes of Joni Mitchell in both the vocal delivery and tune. The supporting musicians, include violinist Colin McCaughey, are excellent throughout. This is melodic, plaintive music, beautifully executed and delivered by Sarah McQuaid, and I unreservedly recommend it to all lovers of folk music. (48 mins, £13.50.)

Very many thanks indeed, Martin. For this month's second release we turn from Kris Gayle, a vocalist who has long resided in Penwith, to a singer/guitarist and songwriter who has recently moved to St Buryan, and has re-released her 1997 album "When Two Loves Meet". Sarah McQuaid was born in Spain and brought up in Chicago, but prior to arriving in West Cornwall, she spent many years in Ireland, and this album, which was recorded in Dublin, has a decidedly Celtic flavour. Sarah has long been a lover of traditional Irish music, and 9 out of the 10 tracks on this CD fall into this category, with excellent arrangements by Sarah herself. Several are guitar in-

CHIROPRACTIC - POSTURE

"To live a long, active, energetic life, few things matter more than a good posture"

How often have you caught yourself in the mirror and immediately pulled in your tummy and raised your chest?

Chiropractic theories and treatment procedures have long been based on the concept that postural stress resulting from faulty alignment of body segments is a major factor in the development of muscular-skeletal pain and premature degenerative arthritis. New evidence obtained from magnetic resonancing imaging (MRI) procedures has now confirmed these clinical observations with scientific knowledge.

In the clinical environment posture is a key factor in any physical assessment.

Careful note will be taken of several key signs. These are a few:

1. Outward turning of one or both feet
2. The alignment of the knees
3. The levelling of the hips and pelvis

6. Forward tilting of the pelvis
7. Increase in spinal curvatures

To avoid or at best limit the potential damage from poor posture we need to strive to achieve a harmonious balance between the weights, forces and tensions in our bodies...

So how best to address posture?

Throwing oneself into unsupervised physical training is unlikely to realise real benefits that might address those imbalances that are now all too obvious. Any strengthening exercise will tend to favour the already dominant muscles at the cost of the weak muscle groups.

Any exercise regime must firstly isolate one specific muscle group, but to be efficient and effective must engage the core muscles at the same time. The whole body approach involves choosing exercises that require the core muscles to maintain correct posture and alignment with the legs and arms. Exercises that develop core strength include exercise on a stability ball, work with medicine balls, wobble boards, Pilates and Yoga.

Posture may have been captured as an expression of physical standing, but in the clinical context in which chiropractors work it has real significance for the patient. All of us have reason to be interested in our postures.

Millponds Autumnwatch

After a very forgettable summer the ponds are enjoying a gentle and mellow season full of vibrant colour along the Ropewalk.

All our wanderers are now home, the drakes have moulted and the rest of the feral flock arrived by the end of September. There are over a hundred birds again this year, but some do commute

between Ryan's Field and Carnsew during the day.

The Millpond Miscellaneous, Snowflake and Coffee, have been joined by Bronwen, a Welsh Harlequin Duck and Cilla, a very pretty and quite rare Silver Appleyard. Thank you to whoever puts them out on the Millponds, we really appreciate it.

The star arrival has to be Ollie, our Snow Gosling, who appeared on the ponds six weeks ago. He is about six months old and the "blue form" of Snow Goose with a grey body and white head and as anyone who has met him knows, he is an absolute sweetie! As a rarity he ranks with "hen's teeth". Twitchers, please note; Ollie did not arrive in Hayle from the Arctic. Our little gosling flies like a brick and was probably hand-reared. We would like to know who owned him and are there any more at home like him?

One incident has soured an almost perfect season and could have ended in tragedy. Our female swan, Cleopatra, appears to have been the victim of harassment by a group of mindless individuals. Having been rescued from the main road on one occasion, she seems to have suffered from extreme stress and spent two weeks recovering with the RSPCA. My sincere thanks go to Nick Reynolds who got her off the ponds for treatment. The original incident was reported to the Police and it may be worth remembering that harming a swan is a criminal offence and carries a £1,000 fine. Thankfully Cleopatra is back with us again, but her health will be monitored for a while just to make sure.

In spite of the mild weather our winter visitors have started to arrive. Regular Pond watchers may have noticed a small group of Teal on the inner ponds.

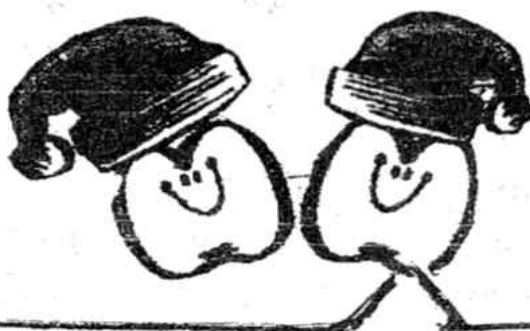

Cycling on pavements

I write following the conviction of the cyclist who caused the death of a pedestrian by colliding with him while cycling on the pavement.

We live in Hayle and I have on many occasions complained to the police regarding cyclists who ride on pavements at speed. I am not referring to young children, but to the youths and grown adults who can often be seen weaving in and out of pedestrians as if they were obstacles in a slalom course.

If the police have taken any action the results are not very apparent.

My wife narrowly escaped being hit by a speeding cyclist as she stepped out of a shop onto the pavement. In a similar incident, a friend was told to "Bloody well look where you're going" by a male cyclist who had to swerve to avoid her as he sped along the pavement.

I saw a woman being forced to quickly pull her baby's pushchair out of the path of a man riding a mountain bike on the pavement in Copperhouse.

When I drive through Hayle I see that there are invariably more cyclists using

the pavement than the road.

On a number of occasions I have spoken to cyclists, who generally respond with outrage. Pavement cycling has become the norm because the law is never enforced. One man told me he knew that what he was doing was illegal, but couldn't care less about the law. More often the answer is a two fingered gesture.

I did suggest to my local councillor, who incidentally, was well aware of the problem, that the council might consider providing signs to remind people of the law, and warn that there can be a fixed penalty fine. We have, after all, signs warning us against dog fouling, dropping litter, drinking alcohol in public places, and feeding seagulls.

No sign was forthcoming.

Elderly and very young pedestrians are particularly vulnerable, but we all have a right to feel safe on the pavement. I am writing this because it seems probable that if nothing is done there is going to be another serious incident.

growing exclusively on coastal dunes, in our case all the way from Hayle Estuary to Godrevy.

The species name ammophila comes from the Greek 'ammos', meaning sand and 'phillia' meaning lover so I suppose a lot of children could be called this!

Marram grass is an example of a xerophyte, a plant which can withstand arid conditions such as deserts or sandy beaches and adapt to being buried in sand drifts. It is responsible for stabilising the dunes by capturing the blown sand and binding it together with its mat-like fibrous root system. Now the grass has stabilised the sand like this, then at the estuary end of the dune system, sea buckthorn is spreading and making the system even more resistant to erosion.

According to one reference I found, Newborough women once used marram grass to make mats, haystack covers

and brushes for whitewashing.

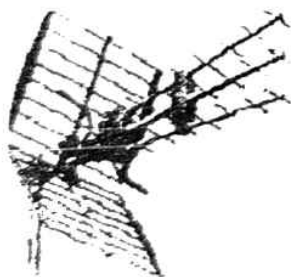

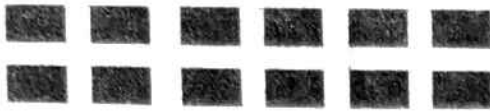

RSPB

NEWS

The RSPB is in discussion with Hayle Harbour Management Ltd., Natural England and Devon & Cornwall Police regarding how best to tackle the problem of people allowing their dogs to enter the nature reserve and in some instances chase or even injure birds. This could be the cause of up to five swan fatalities over the last few months. The RSPB has received many complaints about this. Last month Councillor Miss Irene Bailey was horrified after witnessing a large dog chasing and attacking the swans at Lelant.

On November 5 there was a fireworks display adjacent to the estuary. Letting off fireworks over the reserve disturbed

the bird roost. A local resident in Lelant called the office to express concern about the impact of a two hour long fireworks display. The Hayle Estuary is a Site of Special Scientific Interest and it is a criminal offence to disturb the migratory and wintering birds feeding and roosting on the estuary. The witness said that all of the birds were very distressed and flew off to avoid the noise and the flashes. It is irresponsible to cause this level of disturbance next to a nature reserve but next to a SSSI it is against the law.

On Thursday 15 November Sgt. Simon Dobson, Wildlife Crime Officer gave a lady a verbal warning after she allowed her dog to chase birds on Copperhouse Pool. This worrying trend cannot continue. The RSPB hope to put up more information notices to help people avoid breaking the law by disturbing the birds on the nature reserve.

Bird sightings :- A Great White Egret was seen flying over Ryan's Field on 8 October. A Spoonbill was first seen on 9 October and intermittently until the end of October. Four Pale-Bellied Brent Geese turned up on 6 November. There is currently a Dark-Bellied Brent Goose to be seen.

Thanks go to Hayle Harbour Management Ltd for allowing RSPB access to South Quay to litter-pick around the reserve.

MEMORIES OF HAYLE RUGBY CLUB - PART

2

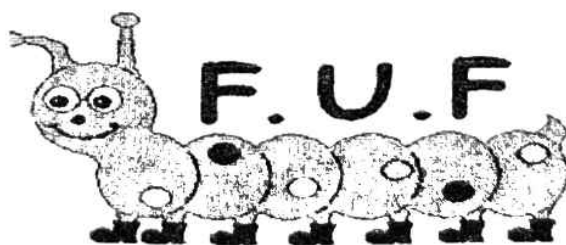
Just before he was killed in action during the second war, I received a letter from Vernon Thomas in which he said that when he returned home, between us we would re-launch the club and put Hayle Rugby back on the map.

When the war ended I was determined to carry out his wishes but I hardly knew where to start. We had no money and no field, as the Bar View field was now under cultivation, and had no accommodation whatsoever. I contacted several people who were interested in forming a committee and we put together a very good one. I was elected as the general and team secretary. Willie Murt

was elected assistant secretary and although he was still in the forces, being stationed at St. Eval, he managed to get home to help at weekends. Harry Bond, one of the old County players, was treasurer and our local barber, Ellis Polkinghorne was chairman.

We now had to look for players and a field and this was no easy task as most of the fields had been cultivated to help the war effort. At the start of the war Hayle ceased playing but Penzance, before it became Penzance and Newlyn, kept going for a couple of seasons. I played for them and made many friends which stood me in good stead when I started on the long road to re-establishing the Hayle club.

On our Feast Weekends we would arrange a Sunday concert in the cinema. We would have the Male Voice Choir with guest artists. The place

would be packed. On the Monday Bill Philips from Redruth a mountain of a player and a great friend to the club, would bring a County Fifteen to play Hayle. Bill was a great player and a County player for many years. Again

we would have large attendances. This would be followed up with a dance at the Masonic Hall. Great times.

We eventually persuaded Edwin Lello to let us have a field. He was the Uncle of Chris Lello whose son, Paul, is now one of Hayle's outstanding players. I had it in the back of my mind that he would help as before the war his father - the senior Mr. Lello - was the Hayle Club's representative on the Cornwall County General Committee. By this time Penzance had amalgamated with Newlyn to form The Pirates and the secretary, my friend, Rex Carr became a very good friend to Hayle. I was asked to play

for the Pirates but that was not to be. The last match I played I picked a side from the district to play against Redruth for the Red Cross. There were several Rugby League players stationed in Hayle and one of them was Jack Treen who had captained Halifax before the war. We became great pals. He was about six feet six and eighteen stone and I was about fifteen stone. Jack agreed to play for us.

We both went up field from the kick off. The Redruth full back, Chapman, gathered the ball. As Jack and I went in to tackle him he side stepped and Jack and I collided. I finished up with a fractured skull and a blood clot which led to spending three weeks in St. Mary's Hospital in London. I had a specialist surgeon from Harley Street who advised me not to play again as another hit to the head could prove fatal. I took his advice and that was the end of my playing career at the age of twenty two.

The first fixture Hayle played after the war was against Penzance & Newlyn. I contacted Rex Carr and he not only agreed to the fixture but also to give us

all of the gate money to help us restart the Hayle Club. The Pirates did this several times in our early days and helped us by sharing the gate money. We put together a team of pre-war players who by now were well over forty, combined with a few from St. Ives and Camborne and one or two ex Hayle players who were living in and playing for Redruth. I can't remember the score but I do remember we put up a good show. (To be continued).

ing to fight.*

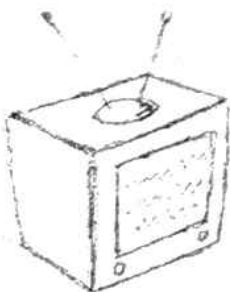
*Soon round the world the children would play

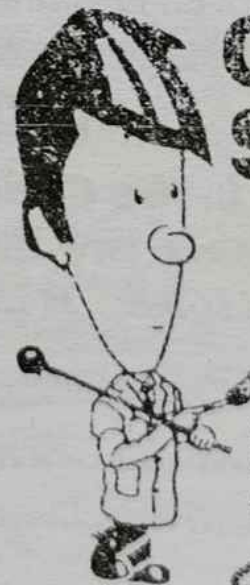

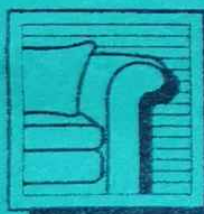

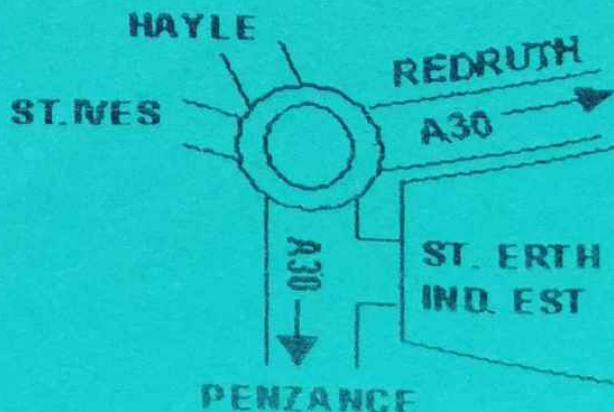
