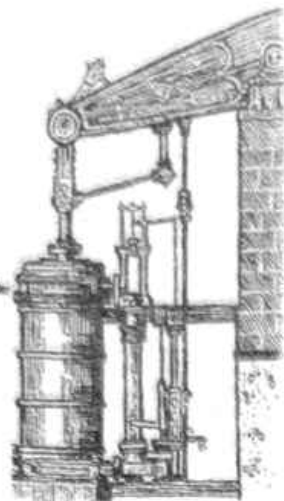

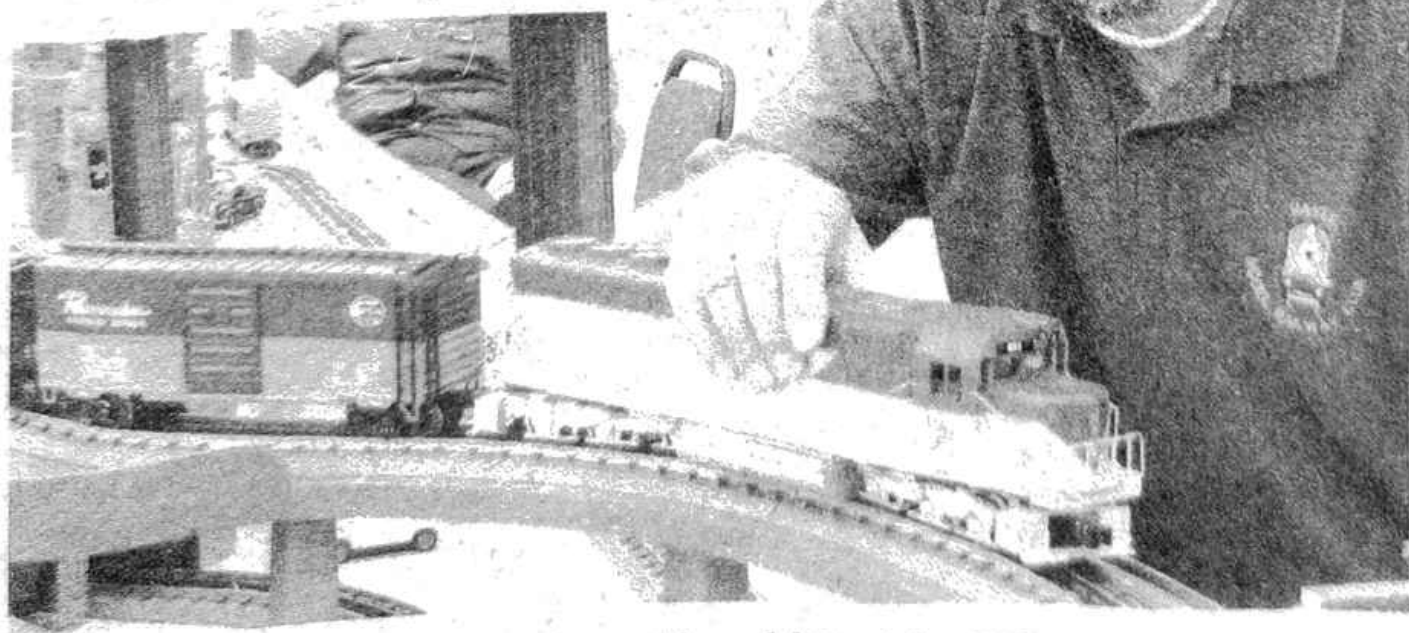

**KIND OF
CORNISH**



Bob Devereux can truly be described as a Renaissance man. Painter, art gallery proprietor, writer, poet, performer and all-round enthusiast, his contribution to the arts in Penwith, spanning more than 40 years, has been enormous. When I first came to Cornwall, I ran the Jazz and Folk Cellar in Penzance from 1969/71, and although he did not technically fit into either the jazz or folk categories, Bob's regular readings of his own works at the club proved hugely popular with our audiences. Hayle art-lovers may well remember his excellent one-man show at St Elwyn's Church a few years back, and on the occasion that I visited the exhibition, Bob, needing little encouragement, gave a memorable impromptu half hour recital of his own poetry, his stentorian tones perfectly suiting the church's acoustic.

Bob has now released an outstanding CD "The Best of Bob" featuring his own readings of 14 of his works, with excellent and tasteful musical accompaniment. One of the highlights for me is 'The Queen of all the Gypsies', with Bob's poem set to music and sung by the legendary Clive Palmer of Incredible String Band fame, who incidentally was one of the resident performers at the aforementioned Jazz and Folk Cellar. Clive also contributes banjo and Northumbrian pipes, and appears on another track, 'Suns and Moons'.

The final track, 'Morris Room', a story of unrequited love, is particularly moving, but all 14 tracks have their own interest and individuality. Apart from Clive Palmer, the other guest musicians appearing on the CD include Adrian O'Reilly on guitar, Matthew and Jaye Gryspeerdt and family on violin, piano accordion and vocals, Eddie Williams on harmonica and flute, and Steve Slim on percussion. Bob's unique way with words, his humour and his humanity are very much in evidence. His fine and resonant reading tones are superbly complemented by the accompanying musicians, all of whom contribute hugely to the enjoyment of this CD by a wonderfully talented and original man. The CD costs £10 and is available for sale in Bob's Salthouse Gallery, St Ives, tel. 01736 795003. (Running time 59 mins.)

The Salthouse Gallery is on the last 2 years of its lease, after which Bob intends to 'retire' and travel. For his final period in the gallery, as well as his own work, Bob intends to put on shows by artists featured back in the days when he originally opened the gallery, including Tony O'Malley and Roy Walker.

the Hayle Choir], Willy Rowe and Ken Burgess[twenty years] and Alan Thomas[ten years]. A certificate was also presented to Tony King for 45 years singing in Male Choirs in the County, by Hamilton Hawkins, representing the Cornish Federation of Male Voice Choirs. The concert, under Musical Director Ann Birch and accompanist Una Skellington, was a programme mainly of the choir's lighter repertoire, including show tunes and spirituals. The evening raised £469 for the Hayle Day Centre which hosted the evening and was the first concert to be held there since the addition of a conservatory.

The previous day the choir had paid its last respects to Archie Trevillion, former President and strong supporter of the Hayle choir for many years. Archie was locally well known as a baritone singer with considerable success at local music festivals –a three times cup winner. He was allowed to keep the cup and years later donated it to HMVC for use as the award for 'Choir Person of the Year'. It is still used for this award in PHMC. At his funeral service in Wall Chapel, the choir sang 'God's Choir' and 'The Rose' and provided a guard of honour at the conclusion of the service.

The choir enjoyed good weather and the atmosphere of the 25th Trevithick Day when they sang in the Square in Camborne. The programme included favourites such as 'Hail to the Homeland', 'The Jolly Roger', 'Speed your Journey' and 'The Rhythm of Life' plus an informal 'Camborne Hill' whilst waiting for the

dance to pass.

A dozen choir members went to Truro Cathedral on May 13 to take part in a massed Cornish Male Voice Choir recording for BBC Songs of Praise. This will be shown later in the year at the usual Sunday evening slot.

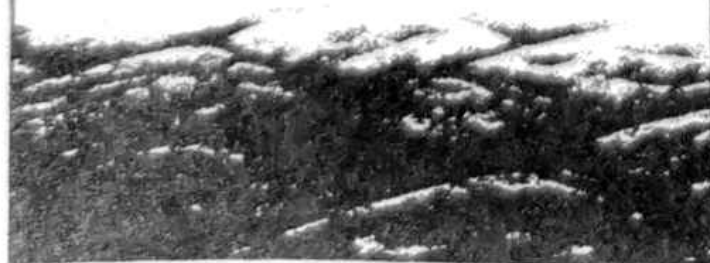

HAYLE PUMP - A BRIEF HISTORY

Readers, particularly newcomers to the town, sometimes ask how the Hayle Pump originally came into being.

The concept of a free Hayle magazine, funded by advertisements, was originally suggested by John Nash in 1994. He produced a mock-up and suggested the name 'Hayle Pump Newsletter' as a working title. (In the days before universal mains water, a small village or town's water pump was traditionally the place where local news and gossip was exchanged). A public meeting was called, and a small committee was formed. It was decided to publish every two months, and the first issue appeared in December 1994.

In the early years, the printing was contracted out, and the magazine was put together, first at Hayle Community Centre, then in the homes of committee members. The circulation continued to grow, and eventually reached its present level of 2,500, which is pretty impressive given that the population of Hayle is about 8,000. Advertisers, too, who in the early days had needed some persuasion, began to realise that an ad in the Hayle Pump provided excellent returns, and the whole operation outgrew the 'cottage industry' approach. In 2001 the Pump acquired an office in Pratt's Market, and also bought a printer, computer and other equipment, which greatly improved the efficiency of the operation and gave the team far more control over publication dates. Last year we moved to our present downstairs location at the rear of the market, alongside the video library, and the Pump continues to go from strength to strength.

Obviously there have been many changes in the Pump's team over the 13 years of its existence; the present members, in order of length of service, are as follows:-



Sarah

Sarah Turk. Sarah signed up at the original public meeting in 1994 and has been involved ever since. She is the linchpin holding the whole operation together, and is the one person on the team who knows how to do every

one of the jobs involved in getting the Pump onto the streets.

Jeff Turk. Sarah's husband, who also joined right at the start. Jeff's other main local involvement is as a hard-working member of the small team which gives the town its Christmas lights every year, which means he is usually more or less lost to the Pump team for the 3 months from October. He is the Pump's main maintenance man, being a skilled electrician and DIY man.

Tim Appleton. Tim also became involved with the Pump at its inception, and is our 'cut and paste' expert. Although he now lives in Penzance, he is sufficiently keen to commute over from Penzance every issue to put the magazine together into a printable form.

Goudie Charles. Goudie joined the team in 2001, shortly after he retired. His association with Hayle dates back to 1970, when he started a record shop and mail order business based in Pratt's Market. Ironically, in something of a Groundhog Day situation, the present Hayle Pump office is in the very unit in which he previously ran his shop! Goudie transcribes the articles which arrive by email, and also does some proof-reading, printing, collating and stapling.

Donna Anton. Donna is an American lady who moved into the town with her husband Cllr John Bennett a few years back, joined the team in 2005 and immediately volunteered to take over the very important advertising side of things.

Don Metcalf. A retired teacher who moved to Hayle from Lancashire with his wife Christine. Amongst his many interests Don is also a member of Praze Hayle Male Voice Choir, and joined the Pump team in 2005. Don does most of the proof-reading, also printing, collating, stapling and delivery.

Joy Scott-Mance. Joy also moved to the town from the Midlands, together with her husband Frank, and joined the team in 2005. Apart from her work on the Pump, she is a keen member of Hayle Samba Band. Joy is our main collator, and is a first class stapler.

The production of the Hayle Pump every two months involves six distinct processes, as follows:-

1. Collecting adverts and advertising revenues.

The most important part of the whole process – our advertisers supply our only source of revenue, and without them the Pump wouldn't exist.

2. Accumulation, transcription & proof-reading of articles for publication.

Articles for publication arrive in two main forms.

Increasingly they arrive by email at haylepump@btinternet.com, and additionally they arrive in the traditional typewritten/handwritten manner.

3. Cutting and Pasting.

Once deadline day has been reached and an edition's articles have been assembled and printed out, the issue is ready for cutting and pasting. This involves juggling in the articles with the advertisements and sticking them on to twenty A4 sheets, ready for printing.

4. Printing

This takes about 2 days and is done in the office. Printing is sometimes interrupted by some hopeful, but unlucky, soul turning up with an article or advertisement, many days after the deadline date.

5. Collating and Stapling

The most arduous part of the whole process, this boring work, involving getting 25,000 pieces of paper into the correct order and then stapling them, takes about a week. In all, we reckon there is over 100 hours work in each edition, from start to finish.

6. Delivery

Finally, miraculously, the magazine has been assembled into its final form and is ready for delivery. We have around 40 regular dropping-off points throughout the town, Spar, Biggleston's, both Post Offices, the Ark and so on have larger quantities, with lesser amounts going to smaller businesses. Foundry end supplies are taken on foot, whilst further-flung areas like Copperhouse, Connor Downs, St. Erth, the Day Care Centre, the Community Centre, Health Centre, the Library and Hospital are delivered by car. Now the Pump is out on

the streets and we can relax for 6 weeks, until the whole frantic process starts all over again.

During our time we have seen many free magazines for the area come and go, usually glossy colour productions, sometimes funded by grants. The Hayle Pump's success, efficiency and longevity, thirteen years and counting, with our day-to-day costs funded solely by advertising revenues, has led to a mistaken perception in some quarters that we receive a wage for our efforts. It's worth stressing once again, we are all unpaid volunteers, mainly retired or semi-retired, and if anything, what with phone calls from our homes and other incidental expenses, far from being paid, it costs *us* money.

To end with a moan or two, here are some of the things which would, in an ideal world, help us enormously.:-

One, we publish every two months, at the beginning of the 'even' months – February, April etc. All copy for publication *must* be in our hands by the 20th of the month preceding publication. As for adverts, space is limited so it's advisable to get them in as soon as possible, well in advance of the 20th of the month before publication.

Two, one of our pet hates is going round to shops with supplies of the latest issue and finding copies of the previous edition still on the counter; this is most irksome because we put a lot of effort into producing the Hayle Pump. Please, please, please tell us if we are delivering too many, and also make sure you put the magazine in a prominent position as soon as you receive it, rather than putting it under your counter and forgetting all about it.

Three, as previously mentioned the Pump staff are all retired or semi-retired. We are a small team and because of holidays or family commitments up-country we cannot always guarantee being here at the critical Hayle Pump production times, and of course, one of us might decide to move away or even, heaven forbid, step under a First Bus or otherwise spin off this mortal coil. We are constantly on the lookout for new team members, so if you have read this article and feel you would like to become a member of our team, please contact one of us as shown on page two of the Hayle Pump.

Dennis Hollow and his wife would wash all the players' kit and Dennis was always prepared to play for either team, help clean the changing rooms, mark out the pitch and during the holidays help dig out the ditches around the ground to drain the playing surface.

Sid Daniels had a taxi business and would transport players and committee members all over the

place and never charged the Club a cent. As Secretary, I never had a telephone in those days so we used Sid's phone as the Club's telephone. The Daniels family lived two streets from where I lived so if I was wanted on the phone, Sid's father, a man well over 80, would come in all winds and weathers to get me.

We had to work very hard all year round to keep the club going. We would arrange darts tournaments, dances, jumble sales, boxing matches and concerts to raise funds. Tony Andrews, Norman Jose and I would go around Hayle, door to door, with a barrel organ collecting money. We also had, once a year, the Rugby Club Carnival. One year only a couple of floats turned up so some of us went through the town way ahead of it with collection

boxes and headed for the hills before the baying mob caught up with us!

Another day to look forward to was our Boxing Day fixture with St. Ives which is still played. I arranged this fixture with the then St. Ives' secretary, Mr. Blackie, a retired seafaring man. We agreed that one Boxing Day we would play at Hayle and the next at St. Ives. We would take down six forty seater buses of spectators and St. Ives would do the same the following year- a truly festive occasion for players and spectators.

Easter was another lovely period. We always played three games over the Easter period. Some Easters we played four - Old Dunstonians, St. Thomas's Hospital, Guy's Hospital and then on the Tuesday evening, St. Mary's Hospital. We were lucky on

these occasions to have a lot of players home from college, one such being Rick Rescorla who lost his life in the September 11th. disaster in America.

We had a fine group of players at that time. I can recall many players from the twenty odd years I was secretary- plus a few outstanding players that followed the group of 1948 - 1960. (Perhaps Terry Mungles and Paul Hurrell can bring us up to the present day).

What a group we had to cover both our first and second fifteens! It included Ben Gardener, Ben Uren and Leonard Rowe [a Cornwall player who held the Hayle club record for the number of tries scored by a wing three-quarter], Geoffrey Williams, Aubry Jones, Reg Hosking, Sammy Hosking, Jack Baumbach, Donald Irish [a drop goal expert and very classy fly half who played for Cornwall and always averaged 200 plus points per season], Teddy Irish, Lionel Irish, Roy Thomas, Ivor Hollow, Peter Jenkin, Stanley Hosken, Peter Richards and Charlie Penrose [two outstanding prop forwards who contributed to making Fred Sampson one of the best hookers in England], Jacko Richards-Cornwall, Henry Richards, Frank Thomas, Bob Ellis, Charlie Daniel, Jack Bowden-Cornwall, Dennis Hocking, Owen Gregor, Stuart Harris, Tony Andrews, Mike Eddy, Patrick O' Mahoney, Bobby Cook, Mike Smaldon, Donald Murray, Roy Hosking, Arty Hughes, Donald Hollow, Reg Ferris, Fernley Baumbach, Claud Jenkin, Kit Gaul, Eric Sleeman, Norman Haddy, Norman Reardon, Wilson Williams, Die

Trewartha, Roger Sleep, Bill Easterbrook, Trevor Roscorlar, Nino Thomas, Mike Thomas, Telford Penrae, Bob Philp, Stan Sullivan, Albert Date, Jack Gunn [a prop forward who left us to play for Penzance and Cornwall but often returned as a guest player and trained the Hayle Colts team], Brensley Donithorne, Cyril Donithorne, Fernley Rosewarne, George Mills, Darky Williams, John Middleton, Edwin Johns, Wilson Williams, Jack Bassett, Bill Calloway, Bill Easterbrook, Bill Polkinghorne, Dennis Hollow, Raffey Hendra, and Vernon Hosking.

Fred Sampson played for Cornwall, the combined Cornwall & Devon fifteen and the Western Counties fifteen against South Africa and the All Blacks and also had two International trials and was considered one of the best hookers of his generation.

One of the biggest disappointments of that period was why the Cornish selectors did not consider Lionel Irish first choice Cornish scrum half. He was an International Schoolboy, captain of Hayle for a great number of years, would always average over 200 points a season and was always considered, by touring teams both English and Welsh, as the best scrum-half they played against in the West of England. When we played against teams from Devon, Somerset and Gloucester they were amazed they did not find him in the team when they played against Cornwall.

In those days we played against such teams as Abertillery from Wales, Newbridge and the Public Schools Wanderers- whose fifteen was made up of Internationals from Scotland,

Wales and England- St. Mary's Hospital, St Thomas' Hospital, Guy's Hospital, St. Luke's College, Plymouth Albion, Cross Keys, Old Paulines. Woodpeckers, Bridgewater And Albion and Devonport Services. These were all top class teams and were made up of internationals from Wales, England and Scotland.

When most of the above players retired, Hayle went through a lean period. Bill Smith, as Secretary, with players such as Frank Johns, Tony Andrews, Vernon Hosking, Tony Hosking, Gordon Hollow, Les Bray, Brian Bray, John Bray, Roger Peek, Mike Eddy, Tom Williams, Russel Williams, Glen Horwell, Des Jeffery, Monty Davey, Les Trathen, Bill Glanville, Kingsley Williams, Brian Bawden, John Lockett, Alfie Holland and Mike Bawden, kept the Hayle Club going in that period until another group of players came through the Hayle Youth policy and formed an-

other good team producing some outstanding players who went on to represent Cornwall.

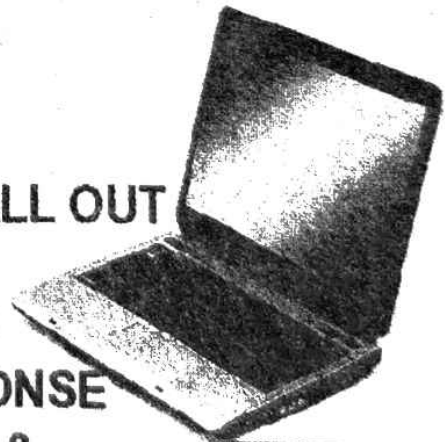
