After a couple of early showers on Judging Day (13th July), for this year's SOUTH WEST IN BLOOM (SWIB) competition, the two judges were professionally shown around the town by Nigel Powell (chair) and Nick Reynolds (Paradise Park) who was the driver on this occasion. Nigel was extremely informative, and Nick kept everything moving along promptly. This meant that, probably for the first time in a few years, the judging party arrived at the reception in Paradise Park on time!

The specific judgements (IYNs) for the following areas: - Isis Gardens,

Save Our Sands and Friends of the Towans, aroused considerable interest from the judging duo, and other IYNs were keenly noted, including the Bodriggy Academy Gardens, the Penpol Community Plots, both main Hayle allotments and the KGV Memorial Walk as a whole.

The IYNs (In Your Neighbourhood groups) are marked as separate entities by the judges, although they obviously contribute to the overall mark as well. The judges also, en route, make assessments of the general appearance and 'feel' of the town, to include raised beds, troughs, towers and baskets. The general appearance and presentation of private gardens, businesses and public spaces all contribute to their assessments.

Both judges then made short speeches, one of them saying, "The town is looking lovely, as it always does", and the other saying that although this was his first visit to Hayle, he fully intends to return on holiday with his family in the future. Responding, Chair, Nigel Powell, gave an interesting and considered speech specifically thanking the judges, our generous sponsors, and all of the many HIB volunteers.

Sadly, in the period leading up to Judging Day, there were incidents of theft and vandalism. Flowers, plants

and even young trees were uprooted and, in some instances, removed. Damage was done to the Bodriggy Academy installations near the Bug Mansion on KGV Walk, and flowers were trampled. This was hugely disheartening to the children and the volunteers, who give their own time and labour to make our environment attractive and interesting. 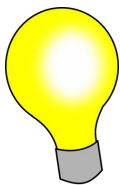

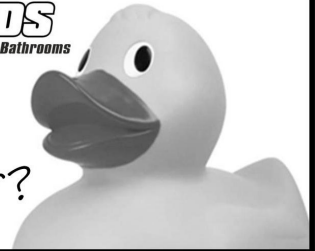

Towans being one of Cornwall's top wildlife sites, having 25% of Cornwall's species on only 1% of its land area.

I was pleased in my final week to be able to expose bare sand up on Mexico Towans using an excellent digging contractor. He dug out areas of scrub, dug deep holes and buried the roots and soil, covering with sand. I hope that whoever follows me will carry on some of that work across the Towans. Many of the rare invertebrates live in the more open parts of the dunes, which will be created by this activity.

Well, it's time to hand over to fresh people with their own ideas, passions and strengths. By the time you read this a partial replacement will probably have started and I'm

sure they will benefit from the support of the fabulous volunteers. Keep an eye in local media etc for updates, as the website is currently being revamped.

Wishing you all the best for the future, and thank you for your help and support.

The Bells of Phillack

The bells of Phillack Church Tower ring out over Hayle and Phillack at least twice each week. A band of ringers (campanologists) are dedicated to keeping the bells ringing. Alas, many Towers are now silent for lack of ringers, or lack of maintenance on their bells.

The eight bells in Phillack Tower have been in place since 1928. Prior to that, three Bells had called people to worship each Sunday since 1751. Those three bells were recast, and five new ones added.

The largest bell, with the deepest tone, is the Tenor. This bell weighs just over 14cwt. The bell with the

highest note is the Treble, and weighs a little more than 4cwt. The bells between are usually known by their number, 2, 3, 4 etc, and weigh between 4 and 9 cwt.

Every bell in our Tower has an inscription on it. The tenor bell records:

William Glover Rector

John Curnow, Merchant Church
Warden AR 1751.

1928

The Three Largest Bells in this peal were recast and

texts engraved upon them, and the

The 1928 work on the new bells was
done by John Taylor & Co,
Bellfounders of Loughborough, a
Company still in business today, and
still maintaining the Bells of Phillack.
In recent months, our bells have been
checked, new ropes purchased, and
new muffles bought – these are used
to muffle the sound of the bells, such
as at funerals.

The weights might make it sound like
hard work to ring the bells, but a
clever and complex arrangement of
wheels, bells, ropes, and beams (or
stays) mean that impetus keeps the
bell moving after the initial pull. It is

then a matter of controlling the bell to
do as the ringer wishes. It can take a
while to learn this!

Perhaps reading this article has
inspired you to have a go at ringing
the bells at Phillack, or just having a
look to see what happens. The late
Michael Smaldon, who was Tower
Captain until his death last year (after
76 years of ringing!) always
proclaimed that Phillack's bells were
the best in Cornwall! Come and

Blue Plaque Story

The Ellis Brewery

The Ellis Brewery was situated on Sea Lane, then a part of Bodriggy Farm. The Brewery buildings have now been converted into flats. The Brewery Office opposite was the Hayle Archive, now moved to the Heritage Centre in Foundry Square. The buildings were listed with the National Heritage List for England in January 1988

The original owner of the brewery, John Richards, sold the business to Christopher Ellis in the early 1800s. He founded Ellis Brewery, circa 1815, and imported fine wines and spirits, developing the brewery as the demand for beer grew. He acquired a steam engine from

Harvey & Co to increase efficiency at the brewery. When he died in 1857, he left the business to his son, also Christopher, who began to build up a chain of 30 licenced houses including The Cornubia, Old Quay House, Cornish Arms and Royal Standard. Malt for brewing was grown on Bodriggy Farm, and a Malthouse built on the corner St John St, (now also converted into flats.) Horses used in the business were stabled at the farm, and the Head Horseman was the best paid man in Hayle at the time – 18 shillings per week and a gallon of beer!

It is suggested that Ellis's main customers were the workers from the mines, foundries, and shipyards of West Cornwall. When the local economy declined, so too did the

demand for beer. (West Country Ales by Adrian Tierney-Jones). The business floundered during the depression in the 1920/30s and went into voluntary liquidation, the assets being taken over by Walter Hicks & Co in 1935. Walter Hicks & Co went on to become the St Austell Brewery, Cornwall's oldest and largest commercial brewery, producing a range of Cornish beers and lager.

West Cornwall is now blessed with several small breweries, reportedly making fine ales. Please note that the writer is not a beer connoisseur, and makes no recommendations!

used to work with at the Hayle Heritage Centre also came along and was complimentary about my creativity. Very generous of her to say this, particularly as she is someone with abundant technical potting skills. More recently I cycled over to Reawla to view the work of Emma Spence and Craig Underhill at Reawla Ceramics Gallery and Studio. Beautiful pieces of work and an enviable amount of room to work in, compared to my humble 7' x 5' Potting Shed.

The 50/50 local clay blend which I mentioned last time resulted in some very nice vases made using the coiling method. Slab-built vases textured with ferns, a corn cob and a large leek also came out well and resulted in a nice soup for me after making the pots, (minus the ferns!) Switching back to figurative work I dug out a four-part plaster mould I made in 2004 and created three little ferret figurines. Warming to the subject of figures made using a plaster mould I created plasticine positives of three birds, then made two-part plaster moulds of each one. Once the plaster had dried sufficiently I pressed clay into them, de-moulded, tidied and dried them, then fired and glazed each one. They can be used indoors as ornaments, and look particularly good in the corner of a garden. Not so successful was a small slab-built pyramidal obelisk into which I had pressed honeysuckle cuttings for texture. One side was pressed too deeply and split right up the side during firing. Now it looks like a tent with the door open. Oh well.

An ego boost in June occurred for me when a bowl I had made at a Leach Pottery course in January sold in a Barbara Kirk Auction at the Penzance sales room. I had submitted it in the hopes that I wouldn't be taking it home again, and got a positive result. Not a fortune by any stretch of the imagination, but very satisfying all the same.

So, if you feel like taking a look at my gallery (and the garden still full of wild flowers) you will be more than welcome. Keep a lookout for my advert in not just the Pump, but Curnow's Hayle, and the St Ives Local magazine, where it is appearing over the next few months.

This group of Lear's Macaws, illegally smuggled into the UK in the 1980s and subsequently confiscated by Customs and Excise officials, have lived in seclusion ever since. Over time, the birds' numbers have increased through breeding.

As the only Lear's Macaws in the UK, their preservation is critical. "These are important birds, an Endangered species threatened by habitat loss, hunting, and the wild bird trade," explained David Woolcock, Curator of Paradise Park. "We are proud to be the only sanctuary in the UK to house them. Our objective is to provide a safe and nurturing environment that helps each bird express their unique character."

Paradise Park, in collaboration with the World Parrot Trust (WPT), has worked tirelessly to create and maintain a new aviary suitable for the birds. The WPT, a charity founded at Paradise Park in 1989, is already actively involved in conservation work for Lear's Macaws in their native Brazil. The future plans for these magnificent birds may include reintroduction into their native habitat as part of a larger conservation project aimed at preserving the species.

Despite ongoing works to perfect the aviary surroundings in the Park, including new paths and seating for visitors, the public can still enjoy observing these extraordinary birds in their enclosures, as well as listening to their distinctive calls.

Past Coronation Celebrations in Hayle

As a nation we have recently had the coronation of King Charles III, and thus the thought crossed my (the Pump Editor's) mind as to how Hayle celebrated past Royal events such as these. I therefore delved into The British Newspaper Archive online to pull out information from some of the more comprehensive articles written in the past.

Starting with 'The West Britain and Cornwall Advertiser' on 6th July 1838 which curiously had two articles about the coronation, with mostly similar text but also some conflicting information. This celebration in 1838 was in relation to the coronation of Queen Victoria (which was on 28th June) where it was reported that the day was welcomed quite loudly with not only the ringing of bells, but the *'firing of guns, at an early hour.'* although it's not said who fired them, how many, or where exactly this event took place which surely would have trumped any modern alarm clock. Whatever time it occurred, it must have been before or around 8am as the next event written about was at that time and says numerous flags of all pictorial displays were hoisted from the ships in the harbour, including different flag-staffs too, which sounds like quite the serious effort had been put into the occasion. As well as this there were arches of flowers and laurels in numerous locations, and yet more flags at the Foundry Works (assuming Harvey & Co) and on people's houses. At midday, a procession of around 700

persons started from a meadow near the market place bearing silk banners and flags who then paraded right through the town and around the various works of Harvey & Co.

At 2pm there was a long procession of a different kind, in the form of tables, down Commercial Road (in front of the Commercial Inn) which seated around 200 elderly people whilst a band played. Come 5pm, some 600 ladies were treated to tea of some reputed quality which included locally sourced oxen and 'Taddy's best' (tobacco?) given out to everyone. At 6pm there was a dining of, what appears to be, the coronation committee at the White Hart where on the menu amongst many other items was venison and wine, with three cheers for the Queen (or 'three times three' as it is referred

to then), before 'non nobis domine' was sung (a traditional Christian hymn). Later in the evening, in what must have been quite a spectacle, there were fireworks, and a large balloon was ascended. On the front of the White Hart Hotel was a magnificent illuminated display which is succulently described as 'a beautiful transparency, by Opie, of her Majesty receiving the Crown from Britannia, supported by Liberty stood over our County arms, - V.R. in transparent letters, and the Royal Crown, on a large scale, above, were surmounted by a most brilliant star, consisting of nearly 400 lamps and the whole surrounded by laurels and flowers'.

The Coronation of King Edward VII in 1902 is detailed in The Cornishman

on the 14th and 28th August of that year where once again many houses were decorated, and a service of worship was held in the morning. The afternoon, much like in 1838, saw a parade, but this time of teachers and students from all schools going through the town before heading to the Towans where there was a tea and sports arranged. The following events were partaken: 100 yards flat race, High Jump, Quarter-mile flat race, putting the weight (shot putt?), a boys under 14 race, one mile flat race, egg and spoon race, sack race, bucket race, three-legged race, potato race, consolation race, girls under 10 race and a girls under 12 race. There was a display of fireworks and bonfire to conclude the day's celebration.

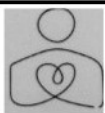

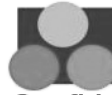
